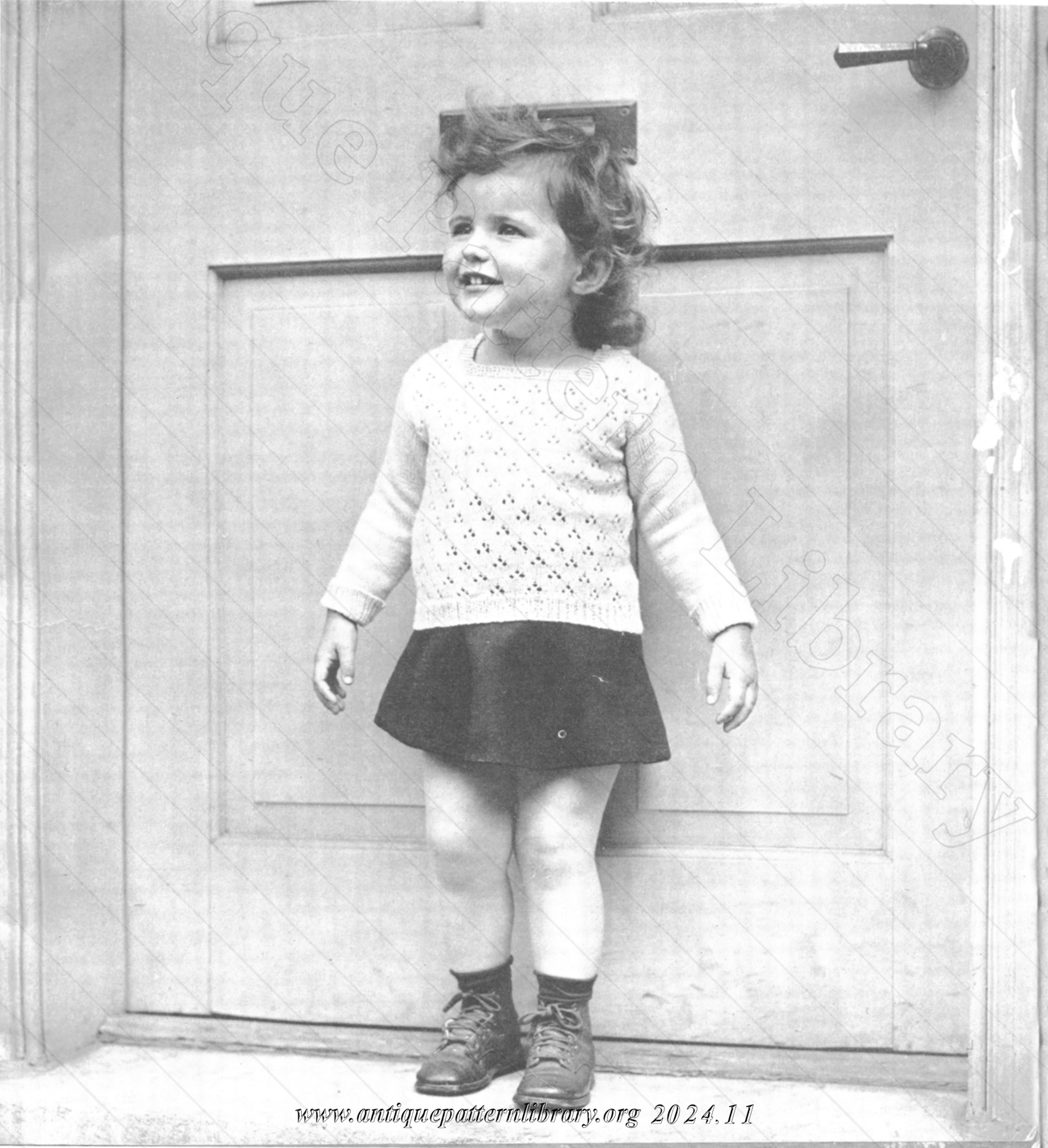

BEEHIVE NON-SHRINK MOORLAND, 3 Ply (1 oz. skeins).

Size 4—5 skeins. Size 6—6 skeins.

ROYAL SOCIETY KNITTING PINS, 1 pair No. 1 and 1 pair No. 2.

5 buttons.

Sizes	4	6
Measurements for Blocking Garment:		
Chest (after buttoning)	25"	27"
Length from shoulder to lower edge	14"	15½"
Side seam	9"	10"
Across back at underarm	12½"	13¼"
Across each front at underarm	7"	7½"
Sleeve seam	13"	14½"
Across sleeve at upperarm	9½"	10"
GAUGE: (STOCKINETTE STITCH) 8 sts make 1 inch; 10 rows make 1 inch. (PATTERN STITCH) 8 sts make 1 inch; 11 rows make 1 inch.		
Sizes	4	6
BACK . . . With No. 1 needles cast on 98 sts 106 sts		
1st row: K 2, * p 2, k 2. Repeat from * across. 2nd row: P 2, * k 2, p 2. Repeat from * across. Repeat these 2 rows alternately for 1½ inches.		
Change to No. 2 needles and work in stockinette st (knit 1 row, purl 1 row) until piece measures in all 9" 10"		
To Shape Armholes: Bind off at beginning of next 2 rows 3 sts 4 sts Decrease 1 st at end of each row until there remain 82 sts 88 sts		
Work straight until piece measures from 1st row of armhole shaping 5" 5½"		
Bind off for shoulder 25 sts 27 sts		
Insert a marker in work, for back of neck bind off loosely the next 32 sts 34 sts		
Insert another marker, bind off for other shoulder the remaining 25 sts 27 sts		

POCKET LINING (Make 2) . . . With No. 2 needles cast on 18 sts. Work in stockinette st for 2 inches, ending with a knit row. Slip sts onto a stitch holder.

RIGHT FRONT . . . With No. 1 needles cast on
54 sts 62 sts

1st row: (K 1, p 1) 4 times (front band); p 2, * k 2, p 2. Repeat from * across. 2nd row: K 2, * p 2, k 2. Repeat from * across to within last 8 sts (k 1, p 1) 4 times (front band). Repeat these 2 rows alternately for 1½ inches, ending at front edge.

Change to No. 2 needles and work pattern as follows: 1st row: (K 1, p 1) 4 times; knit remainder of row. 2nd row: K 6, * p 2, k 6. Repeat from * across to last 8 sts, (k 1, p 1) 4 times. 3rd row: (K 1, p 1) 4 times; p 6, * k 2, p 6. Repeat from * across. 4th row: Same as 2nd row. 5th row: Same as 1st row. 6th row: K 2, * p 2, k 6. Repeat from *
4 more times 5 more times
then p 2, k 2, (k 1, p 1) 4 times. 7th row: (K 1, p 1) 4 times; p 2, * k 2, p 6. Repeat from * across, ending with p 6, k 2, p 2. 8th row: Same as 6th row.

Repeat these 8 rows for pattern 2 more times. Next row: (K 1, p 1) 4 times;
knit
14 sts 18 sts
Bind off the next 18 sts for pocket and finish row.

Following row: Work in pattern across
14 sts 18 sts
then work in pattern across one pocket lining. Finish row.

Work straight in pattern until piece measures in all
8" 9"

To shape neck, decrease 1 st inside front band on next row and every 4th row thereafter

GAUGE: 7½ sts make 1 inch; 10 rows make 1 inch.

BACK . . . With medium color and No. 1 needles cast on	80 sts	88 sts	96 sts

Work in ribbing of k 2, p 2, for 1" 1½" 1½"

Drop medium color.

Change to No. 3 needles and with dark color work in stockinette st (knit 1 row, purl 1 row) for 2 rows. Drop dark color and with light color work 2 rows. Repeat the last 2 rows 3 more times. Bind off in ribbing, decreasing before and after the marker as before.

4 buttons for each size.

Chest (garment buttoned)	23½"	25½"	27½"

To Shape Armholes: Bind off 4 sts at beginning of next 2 rows. Decrease 1 st at end of each row until there remain

Work straight until piece measures from 1st row of armhole shaping

Bind off 4 sts at beginning of each row until there remain for back of neck

RIGHT FRONT . . . Starting at lower edge cast on

Work in pattern as for Back until piece measures

If the jacket is for a girl, follow instructions as written. If jacket is for a boy, do not work buttonholes on Right Front but work them on Left Front instead. On next row make a buttonhole 4 sts in from front edge—to make a buttonhole, on one row bind off 4 sts and on next row cast on 4 sts to replace those bound off. Continue in pattern, making buttonholes 3 inches apart (measuring from 1st buttonhole) until 3 in all are made—however,

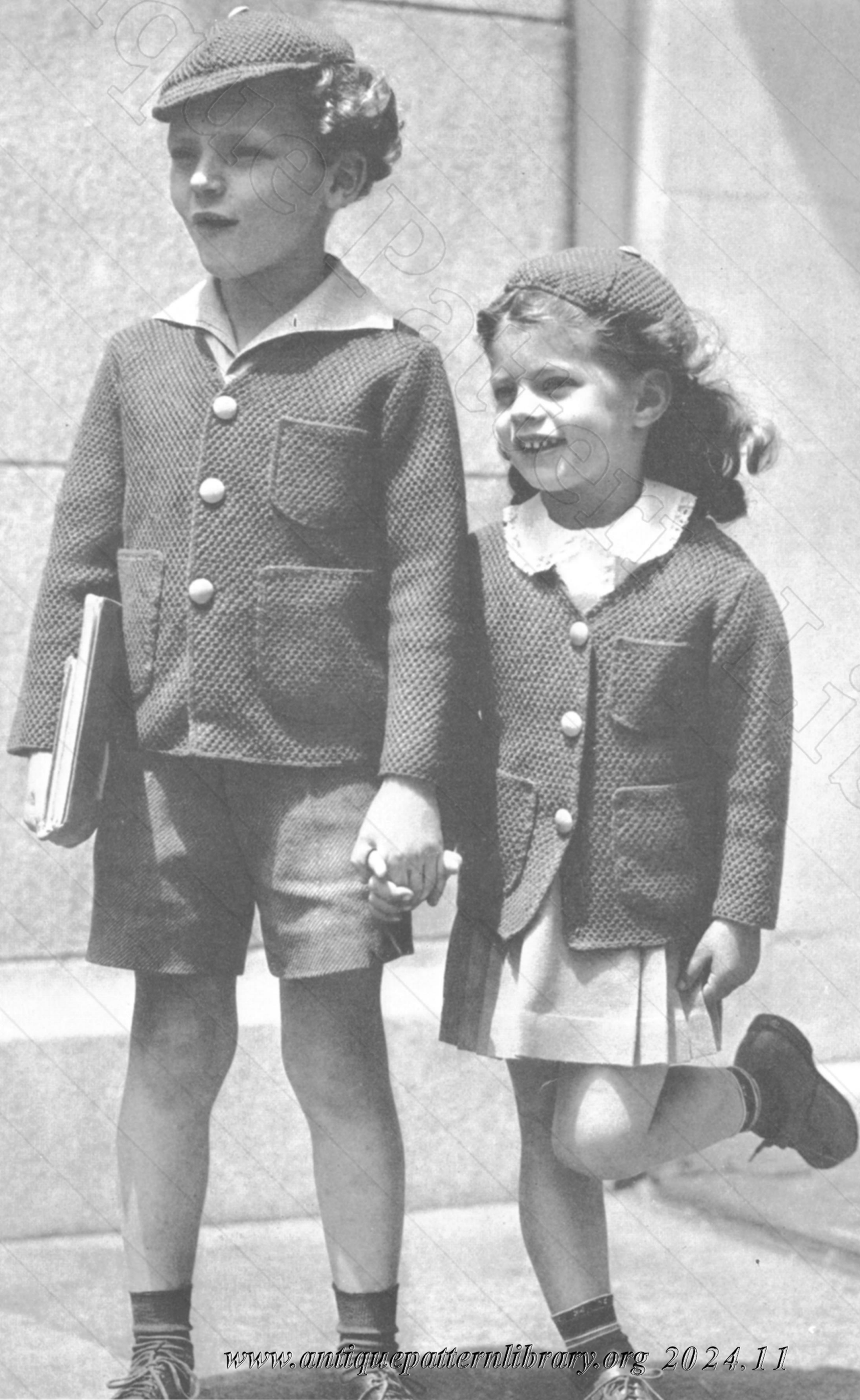

Steel Crochet Hook No. 6.

GAUGE: 7 sts make 1 inch; 9 rnds make 1 inch.

HAT

With main color, cast on 132 sts, dividing onto 3 needles. Join, being careful not to twist sts. Work in ribbing of k 2, p 2, for 3 rnds. Now work in stockinette st (knit each rnd) until piece measures 2½ inches. **1st decrease rnd:** * K 31, k 2 together, place a marker on needle. Repeat from * around. **2nd decrease rnd:** * K 30, k 2 together, slip marker. Repeat from * around. **3rd decrease rnd:** * K 29, k 2 together, slip marker. Repeat from * around. Continue in this manner, decreasing 4 sts on each rnd until 20 sts remain. Break off, leaving an 8-inch length. Thread a needle with this length and draw yarn through remaining sts; draw tightly together. Fasten securely on wrong side.

Press hat through damp cloth on wrong side, rounding top to fit head while damp. Allow to dry. Daisies are crocheted and sewed on.

DAISIES . . . With White, ch 4. Join with sl st to form ring. * Work an sc tightly in ring, draw out loop on hook to measure ¾ inch. Keep this loop on hook. Repeat from *, making 13 loops in all (petals)—it is wise to carry only about 3 or 4 loops on the hook at once. Do not fasten last loop. Break off yarn, leaving a 6-inch length. Thread this through a needle and sew the joining of first and last loops. Then with this length sew center circle to Hat a little above the ribbing. Make 15 more Daisies. Sew 7 more Daisies around lower edge of Hat—centers about 2¼ inches apart. Sew a second row of Daisies alternating between and about 1 inch above 1st row.

For top-knot, wrap 1 strand of main color 15 times over a cardboard, cut to measure 2¼ inches. Break off and slip from cardboard. Wrap these 30 strands round and round with another single strand of main color. Pull (with crochet hook) the two ends of this piece through to wrong side of Hat. Sew the two ends to underside of Hat, allowing the center to form a loop on right side of Hat. If desired a band of ribbon can be sewn inside lower edge of Hat to prevent stretching.

GAUGE: 17 sts make 2 inches; 12 rows make 1 inch.

PATTERN STITCH (a multiple of 4 sts) . . . 1st and 2nd rows: K 2, p 2 alternately across. 3rd and 4th rows: P 2, k 2 alternately across. Repeat these 4 rows for pattern.

GLOVES

Sizes	3	4	5
Using double-pointed needles, cast on loosely	40 sts	44 sts	48 sts

Divide sts on 3 needles. Join, being careful not to twist sts, and work around in ribbing of k 2, p 2, for 2 inches. Knit 1 rnd, then work the 4 rnds of **Pattern Stitch** twice. Start increasing for thumb gore as follows: **1st rnd:** Purl and knit in the first st, knit in the front and in the back of the next st, then p 2, k 2 alternately for remainder of rnd. **2nd, 3rd and 4th rnds:** P 1, k 2, p 1 (4 sts in thumb gore), work in pattern for remainder of rnd. **5th rnd:** Purl and knit in the first st, k 1, knit in the front and in the back of the next st, p 1, then p 2, k 2 alternately for remainder of rnd. **6th, 7th and 8th rnds:** P 1, k 4, p 1, work in pattern for remainder of rnd. **9th rnd:** Increase in purl st, k 3, increase in next st, p 1, then p 2, k 2 alternately for remainder of rnd. Work 3 rnds straight (8 sts in thumb gore). Continue in this manner, increasing in the first purl st of thumb gore and in the st before the second purl st on every

4th rnd (working sts between the 2 purl sts in stockinette st) until there are in thumb gore

14 sts 14 sts 16 sts

Work 3 rnds straight after last increase rnd.

Next rnd: Take the sts for thumb gore off on a safety pin to be worked later, cast on 2 sts for inner side of thumb. Join and work in pattern to end of rnd. There are on needles 40 sts 44 sts 48 sts

Work around in **Pattern Stitch** until glove measures from end of ribbing $2\frac{3}{4}$ " 3" $3\frac{1}{2}$ " or until glove reaches base of forefinger when tried on.

Put glove on and mark fingers by putting safety pin on palm and back of hand between each finger.

Mark off for forefinger	12 sts	13 sts	14 sts

When odd number of sts is required for a finger, always have the larger number of sts on the back of the hand with 1 st less on the palm. Knit around to where the sts are marked off for little finger, knit the sts for little finger, take the remaining sts off on a strand of yarn to be worked later.

LITTLE FINGER . . . Divide the sts for little finger on 3 needles, cast on 2 sts for inner side of finger and work around in stockinette st (knit each rnd) until finger, when tried on, reaches $\frac{1}{4}$ inch

from fingertip, or measures 1½" 1¾" 1¾"

Next rnd: * K 1, k 2 together. Repeat from * around. Work 1 rnd straight. **Following rnd:** K 2 together around. Break yarn, leaving a 6-inch end. Thread this end into a sewing needle and run through the remaining sts. Draw tight and darn in end on wrong side to reinforce tip.

RING FINGER . . . Pick up sts for ring finger from strand of yarn and 2 sts on the 2 sts cast on for little finger. Cast on 2 sts between palm and back of hand as before. Divide the sts on 3 needles and work around in stockinette st until ¼ inch from tip of finger, or for 2" 2¼" 2¼"
Finish as for little finger.

MIDDLE FINGER . . . Pick up sts for middle finger and 2 sts on the 2 sts cast on for ring finger, then cast on 2 sts between palm and back of hand. Work around until ¼ inch from tip of finger, or for 2¼" 2½" 2½"

FOREFINGER . . . Pick up sts for forefinger and 2 sts on the 2 sts cast on for middle finger. Work as for ring finger.

Work around in **Pattern Stitch** until Mitten measures from end of ribbing 4" 4½" 5"
ending directly above thumb stitches with either k 1 or p 1.

Divide sts so that there are on 1st needle 20 sts 22 sts 24 sts

Divide remaining sts between 2nd and 3rd needles.

Shape tip as follows: **1st rnd:** *On 1st needle*, k 2 together, work across in pattern to last 2 sts on 1st needle, then k 2 together. *On 2nd needle*, k 2 together, work in pattern to end. *On 3rd needle*, work in pattern to last 2 sts, then k 2 together. **2nd rnd:** Keeping continuity of pattern (knit the 4 sts directly above decreases), work in pattern around. Repeat these 2 rnds 3 more times, then decrease 4 sts on each rnd in same manner until there remain 12 sts 16 sts 16 sts

Weave sts together, or bind off, fold and sew.

THUMB . . . Work same as thumb on Gloves.

SCARF

With pair of needles cast on 68 sts. Work in **Pattern Stitch** until piece measures 31 inches. Bind off loosely in pattern. Pin Scarf out to measure 8 x 32 inches and steam lightly with hot iron through damp cloth.

FRINGE . . . Cut 2 strands of yarn each 6 inches long. Double these strands, forming a loop. With a crochet hook draw this loop through a stitch at one end of scarf, then draw the 6 ends through the loop. Make fringe in every 2nd stitch along both short ends of scarf. Trim ends evenly.

BONNET

Starting at bottom of back piece, with pair of needles cast on 32 sts. Work in **Pattern Stitch** for 5½ inches. Cast on 44 sts at end of next 2 rows for front and continue to work in **Pattern Stitch** as before for 5 inches. Bind off. Sew cast-on edges of front to sides of back piece. With back piece toward you, make a ridge on right side by working a row of sc over the two seams and along the top edge of back piece, working through double thickness of fabric.

RUFF . . . With right side facing, pick up 102 sts along bottom edge of Bonnet. Purl 1 row. **Next row:** Knit, increasing in each st across. Work in **Pattern Stitch** for 3¼ inches. Bind off loosely.

POMPON (Make 2) . . . Cut 2 cardboard circles each 2¼ inches in diameter. Cut a hole about ½ inch in diameter in center of each cardboard circle. Cut two 3-yard strands of yarn. Thread these 2 strands into a large-eyed sewing needle and double the yarn. Place cardboard circles together and wind yarn around the double circles, drawing yarn through center opening and over edge, then through center opening again. Repeat until center hole is all filled up and cardboard circle is completely covered (using new strands of yarn as necessary). With a razor or very sharp scissors, cut yarn all around along outer edge between the 2 cardboard circles. Double a ½-yard length of yarn, slip it between the 2 cardboards and tie it securely around all the strands of Pompon. Remove cardboard and trim Pompon evenly.

CORD . . . Cut twelve 3-yard strands of yarn. Twist these strands together tightly, then double the twisted strands and give them another twist in the opposite direction. Make a knot about 1½ inches from each end of cord and trim ends evenly.

Steam bonnet with hot iron through damp cloth. Sew cord along top of ruff, having center of cord at center back of bonnet. Sew Pompons on as in illustration.

Nifty Beanie and Mittens

No. 460... As illustrated on page 24

What You Need:

BEEHIVE NON-SHRINK MOORLAND, 4 Ply (1 oz. skeins).

2 skeins of White and 1 skein of Red for the set.

ROYAL SOCIETY DOUBLE-POINTED SOCK NEEDLES No. 3.

A button $\frac{3}{4}$ inch in diameter.

GAUGE: (STOCKINETTE STITCH) 7 sts make 1 inch; 9 rnds make 1 inch.

BEANIE

Starting at head band, with Red cast on 126 sts. Divide the sts on 3 needles and join, being careful not to twist sts. Purl 7 rnds (this is right side of work). Break off Red, attach White and knit around, increasing 1 st in every 9th st (140 sts). Place a marker at beginning of next rnd, then * k 13, p 1. Repeat from * around. Repeat last rnd until White measures 1 inch. **1st decrease rnd:** * K 6, k 2 together, k 5, p 1. Repeat from * around (130 sts). Work in pattern of k 12, p 1, until White measures $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches. **2nd decrease rnd:** * K 5, k 2 together, k 5, p 1. Repeat from * around (120 sts). Work in pattern of k 11, p 1, for 2 rnds. **3rd decrease rnd:** * K 5, k 2 together, k 4, p 1. Repeat from * around (110 sts). Work in pattern of k 10, p 1, for 2 rnds. **4th decrease rnd:** * K 4, k 2 together, k 4, p 1. Repeat from * around (100 sts). Work in pattern of k 9, p 1, for 2 rnds. Continue in this manner, decreasing 10 sts on every 3rd rnd until 30 sts remain. Break yarn, leaving an 8-inch end; draw this end through remaining sts and draw together tightly. Fasten securely on wrong side.

Press very lightly through damp cloth. Allow Red purling at head band to roll, and on wrong side, using Red yarn, sew edge of Red roll to edge of White, being careful to allow for head room. With single strand of Red yarn, embroider chain stitch along each purl rib, starting at Red roll and working toward top for 1 inch.

BUTTON . . . With Red ch 2. **1st rnd:** 8 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Do not join rnds. **2nd rnd:** 2 sc in each st around. **3rd and 4th rnds:** Sc in each st around. Slip button into this piece. **5th rnd:** * Sc in next st, work off next 2 sts as 1 st. Repeat from * around until opening is closed. Fasten off, leaving an end long enough to sew Button to top of Beanie.

MITTENS

LEFT MITTEN . . . Starting at wrist with Red, cast on 48 sts. Divide the sts on 3 needles and join, being careful not to twist sts. Purl 7 rnds (this is right side). Break off Red, attach White, knit 1 rnd. Place a marker at beginning of rnd. **Next rnd:** K 14, p 1 (k 4, p 1) 3 times; k 18. Repeat last rnd 11 more times. To begin thumb shaping, starting at marker k 6, increase 1 st in next st. Finish rnd. Work 2

rnds straight. **2nd increase rnd:** K 6, increase 1 st in each of the next 2 sts. Finish rnd. Work 2 rnds straight. **3rd increase rnd:** K 6, increase in next st, k 2, increase in next st. Finish rnd. Work 2 rnds straight. **4th increase rnd:** K 6, increase in next st, k 4, increase in next st. Finish rnd. Work 2 rnds straight. **5th increase rnd:** K 6, increase in next st, k 6, increase in next st. Finish rnd. Work 2 rnds straight. Continue thus, increasing 2 sts on every 3rd rnd until there are 61 sts on needles. Work 1 rnd straight. On following rnd, starting at marker k 7, transfer the next 13 sts onto a safety pin (to be worked later for thumb), cast on 3 sts and complete the rnd. Now work in pattern around on these 51 sts for 3 inches. Decrease 10 sts evenly on next rnd. Work 2 rnds straight. Decrease 8 sts evenly on next rnd. Work 2 rnds straight. **Next rnd:** K 2 together around. Work 1 rnd straight. K 2 together around. Break yarn, leaving an 8-inch length; draw this length through remaining sts and draw together tightly. Fasten securely on wrong side.

THUMB . . . Transfer the 13 sts of thumb onto 2 needles; with 3rd needle pick up 3 sts on cast-on sts at opening of thumb, attach yarn and work in stockinette st over these 16 sts for $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Decrease 5 sts evenly on next rnd, then decrease 3 sts evenly on next rnd. Break yarn and draw through the remaining 8 sts; draw tightly and fasten securely on wrong side. Whip edge of Red to edge of White, forming a Red roll at cuff.

RIGHT MITTEN . . . With Red, cast on and work as for Left Mitten until roll is complete. Break Red, attach White and knit 1 rnd. Place a marker at beginning of rnd. **Next rnd:** K 18, p 1, (k 4, p 1) 3 times; k 14. Repeat this rnd 11 more times. To begin thumb shaping, k 18, p 1, (k 4, p 1) 3 times; k 6, increase 1 st in next st, k 7. Work 2 rnds straight. **2nd increase rnd:** K 18, p 1, (k 4, p 1) 3 times; k 6, increase 1 st in each of the next 2 sts, k 7. Work 2 rnds straight. **3rd increase rnd:** K 18, p 1, (k 4, p 1) 3 times; k 6, increase 1 st in next st, k 2, increase 1 st in next st, k 7. Work 2 rnds straight. Continue to increase in this manner until there are 61 sts on needles. Continue and finish as for Left Mitten.

Press Mittens lightly through damp cloth and allow them to dry. With single strand of Red yarn, embroider chain stitch, starting $1\frac{1}{4}$ inches from tip of Mitten; work down the 2 center purl ribs for 3 inches. Starting at roll at wrist, embroider in the 4 ribs for $\frac{3}{4}$ inch.

Turn and purl across this set of sts only. **Following row:** K 2 together, knit across to last 2 sts, sl 1, knit 1, pass slipped st over knit st. Purl 1 row. Repeat the last 2 rows once more, then the 1st row once again. **Next row:** P 2 together, purl across to last 2 sts, slip 1, purl 1, pass slipped st over purl st. Continue decreasing as before at both ends of each row until 5 sts remain. Bind off. Attach yarn

where sts were divided. Bind off 1 st and work remaining sts to correspond with other side.

Block pieces to measurements given. Sew shoulder and side seams of bodice. With right side facing work 1 row of sc along left back opening, along neck edge and along right back opening. Fasten off. Work 1 row of sc around each pocket and 2 rows around bottom of skirt. Sew bottom of bodice to waist band, being sure to have buttonhole in waist band in line with buttonholes in right back. Sew bottom of waist band onto top of skirt, gathering skirt in to fit. Allow ¼ inch of waist band to extend beyond skirt opening at each end. Sew on buttons. With contrasting color work blanket stitch around neck edge, armhole edge and around each pocket. Sew on pockets.

Hereafter work the center 27 sts in stockinette st (knit 1 row, purl 1 row) and continue to keep the border sts in k 2, p 2, until Scarf measures 30 inches in all. Next row: With right side facing, k 2, p 2; k 4, * increase in next st, k 5. Repeat from * to within last 8 sts; k 4; p 2, k 2 (39 sts). Following row: P 2, k 2; p 1, * increase in next st, p 1. Repeat from *, ending with k 2, p 2 (54 sts). Work over these sts for 4½ inches. Change to ribbing of k 2, p 2, and work 4 rows. Bind off loosely in ribbing.

Press through damp cloth flaring the two ends slightly. Make 12 daisies. Sew two groups of 3 daisies each on the two ends, to match hat.



Hints to Help You

GAUGE . . . Before starting your article, knit a small swatch to be sure you obtain the gauge given in the directions. The needles specified are based on the average knitter's work. If you do not obtain the correct gauge with the needle size specified, change to a larger or smaller size, as necessary. The change in needle size will in no way change the garment as long as you follow the directions and maintain the specified gauge.

BLOCKING . . . With rust-proof pins, pin pieces wrong-side-up on Turkish towels, following *Measurements For Blocking Garment* given at beginning of directions. Ribbing must not be stretched. Press with a moderately hot iron through a damp cloth, taking care not to rest weight of iron on pieces. Remove pins when pieces are dry; then sew them together as directed. To block socks, draw sock over metal or wooden sock drier and press through a wet cloth. Let dry thoroughly.

SEWING A GARMENT . . . After pieces are blocked, place right sides of pieces together and pin edges. Sew with small back stitches about $\frac{1}{4}$ inch in from edge, making sure the length of seam corresponds with that given in directions. Press seams open. Match stripes wherever possible, casing in any fullness. Sew a narrow tape across shoulder seams to avoid stretching.

LAUNDERING . . . Before laundering, notate carefully—on paper—all important measurements. Using a neutral soap or soap flakes, dissolved in lukewarm water, squeeze the suds through the article; do not rub or wring. Rinse several times in clear water, always keeping garment well supported in hands. Roll garment in Turkish towels to absorb

excess moisture. Then remove garment and pin to required measurements on a flat surface. Allow to dry. Press gently, if necessary, using a damp cloth.

BUY SUFFICIENT YARN . . . It is impossible to avoid slight variations in color in different dye lots. Therefore, make sure to buy, at one time, sufficient material of the same dye lot number to complete the article you are making.

WINDING YARN FROM A SKEIN . . . To preserve the natural elasticity of wool while winding, care should be taken to avoid stretching. We therefore suggest the following method: Wind yarn several times around four fingers. Remove strands and, placing them in the opposite direction, continue winding over these strands and fingers several times. Repeat this operation until entire skein is wound.

ABBREVIATIONS . . . k—knit; p—purl; st—stitch; ch—chain; sc—single crochet; sl st—slip stitch.

* (asterisk) . . . When this symbol occurs, continue working until directions refer you back to this symbol.

Directions in parentheses should be repeated as many times as directed. For instance: "(P 3, k 6) 3 times" means to repeat the directions in parentheses 3 times.

Increasing: To increase a stitch, knit one stitch in regular way, but without slipping the stitch off the left needle; then knit another stitch through the back of the same stitch and slip off.

Decreasing: To decrease a stitch, knit two together.
