Crochet Lace

Crochet Lace, after having been put aside for a certain time, has taken recently an important place for all kinds of fancy work.

Perhaps because it is easy to make, but also because with a plain crochet-needle and thread so many disserent kinds of lace can be made.

In this new album, we do not give the common and well known patterns and we only reproduce designs of laces, insertions, and sprigs of different styles.

There are various pretty imitations or reproductions of stitches, which will be easily copied by following the explanations which we have made as clear and with as many details as possible; the illustrations which are exact reproductions of the original, will make the work easier.

Venitian Lace, which is very much appreciated at present is worked as lace (fig. 41), in squares (fig. 38 and 39), in lozenges (fig. 36) etc...

All the patterns for filet lace can be copied with crochet (fig. 45, 46, 47 and 50).

Cluny Lace (fig. 17 and 20), and Guipure Lace (fig. 61, 63 and 65) are also very well imitated.

What is Required for the Making of Crochet Lace

Crochet-needle. — Use a steel crochet-needle, carefully choosing the size according to the cotton used.

Cotton. — Use Cordonnet 6 fils à la Croix, Cartier-Bresson (art. 20), (balls of 25 grammes, blue label) which has an established reputation for this kind of work.

This crochet cotton having a special twist, is soft and agreable to work with. It stands washing perfectly and the works made with it last indefinately.

It can be had:

In white, nos. 1, 3, 5, 10, 15, 20. 25, 30, 40, 50, 60, 70, 80, 90, 100, 120;

In ecru, from n° 1 to n° 80; In black, from n° 25 to n° 60; In red and cream (shade 421), from n° 5 to n° 60; In other colours, n° 25.

When a brilliant crochet cotton is desired, use Cordonnet 6 fils Brillanté à la Croix (art. 221), (balls of 20 grammes, dark red label) which can be had in white in the same size numbers.

ABBREVIATIONS

The following abbreviations are used in this album:

OBSERVATION

In order to make the directions clearer, some patterns in the illustrations are worked with coarser cotton than the one which should be used.

The lace illustrations are given in the proper size with the no of the cotton which has been used to work them.

SMALL SHAMROCK LEAVES

Worked with Cordonnet 6 fils à la Croix C·B, nº 50

17 ch. — join to the 8th ch. from the needle. In the hole thus formed: 1 loose tr., 2 tr., 1 d. tr., 2 tr., 2 loose tr., 2 tr., 1 d. tr., 2 tr., 2 loose tr., 2 tr., 1 d. tr., 2 tr., 1 loose tr. — This makes a leaf.

For the 2nd leaf and the following ones, join the 1st d. tr. of the group to the last d. tr. of the previous leaf.

For the edge: work 10 d. st. on the ch. remaining free between the 2 leaves.

2nd row. — 1 tr., 1 ch. 1 tr. every other st.

3rd row. — 2 d. st. in each hole.

SMALL PANSIES



On a chain of required length, work:

* 1 tr., 2 ch., 1 tr. in the 3rd nearest st., 2 ch., 1 tr. in the 3rd st. — then 12 ch., join with a d. st. to the 6th st.

- T. 6 ch. 1 d. st. in the ring which has been formed, repeat twice, 6 ch., 1 d. st.: one has 3 small rings.
- T. In the 1st. hole: 1 d. st., 8 tr., 1 d. st. after the 4th tr. join to the 1st st. of the stem of the previous flower in the 2nd hole work in the same way, 1 d. st., 8 tr., 1 d. st. and join the 4th tr. to the middle one of the last leaf of the nearest flower in the 3rd hole, 1 d. st., 8 tr. 1 d. st. Then on the ch. forming the stem, 7 d. st.; after 1 ch., repeat always from *.

LACE WITH SMALL STARS

The small stars are worked separately. For each of them:

8 ch. joined into a ring with 1 d. st. — 4 times alt. 5 tr. then 5 ch. — work 3 ch. instead of the 1st tr. Finish by working 1 tight st. on the 3rd ch.

In the following rings always join the 1st curve of ch. to the 3rd curve of the previous ring.

For the lower edge:

1st row. — * 3 tr. finished together on the 3 middle tr. of the 5 nearest tr. — 6 ch., — 2 d. st. with 5 ch. between them on the curve of ch. — 6 ch. — 3 tr. finished together as before. — Always repeat from *.

2nd row. — 1 d. st. on the 5 ch. — 5 ch. — 1 tr. between the 2 groups of tr.. — 5 ch. — always repeat.

3rd row. — 1 tr. — 1 ch. — 1 tr. every other st.

For the upper edge: — * 3 tr. finished together as on the other side on the 5 tr. — 5 ch. — 3 tr. with 1 p. in between on the 5 nearest ch. — (for 1 p. 4 ch. — and 1 tr. on the previous tr.) — then 4 ch. — 3 tr. finished together, repeat from *.

SCALLOP WITH LOOPS



On a ch. of desired length, work:

1st row. — 1 tr., 1 ch., 1 tr. every other st.

2nd row. — * 2 d. st. 3 times in each hole, then in the next hole 1 d. st. — then 8 ch., join on the right side with 1 d. st. to the 4th st. On the ch., 3 d. st. 1 p. of 4 ch., 2 d. st.

For the large arch: 8 ch., join with 1 d. st. to the middle of the small arch previously worked, then 4 d, st., 1 p., 1 d. st., 1 p., 2 d. st. — The large arch is finished, continue filling the small arch with 2 d. st., 1 p., 3 d. st. In the hole in which you have already worked, 1 d. st. — repeat always from *.

SCALLOP LACE



Worked with Cordonnet 6 fils à la Croix C:B, nº 60

For the edge, work always on the 2 ch. previously made:—4 tr. with 1 p. of 4 ch. between the 1st and 2nd tr., — 2 ch. between the 2nd and 3rd tr. — and 1 p. between the 3rd and 4th tr. To turn on the edge side, 5 ch.

On the scallop side, after the tr. made alt. with p. — * 9 ch., join with 1 d. st. to the previous ch., which form a loop. Work

back over the ch. with, 3 d. st., 1 p. 2 d. st., 1 p., 2 d. st., 1 p., 3 d. st. — then 3 ch. continue forwards and backwards.

Then 9 ch. join with 1 d. st. on the ch. following the nearest arch — 3 d. st., 1 p., 1 d. st. Then, for the large arch: 9 ch. joined on the d. st. following the 1st p. of the small arch — 3 d. st.; twice 1 p. 2 d. st. and 1 p., 3 d. st. Finish filling the smallarch with 1 d. st. 1 p. 2 d. st. 1 p., 3 d. st., — then 3 ch.

Repeat from *.

PALM LEAF LACE



Worked with Cordonnet 6 fils à la Croix C·B, nº 60

Begin by the middle of a scallop: 16 ch. - 1 d. st. in the 3^{rd} st., from the needle, 1 tr. - 3 d. tr. - 1 tr. - 2 continue on the ch. with 8 d. st. 1 ch. - 1 T.

2nd row. —8 d. st. taking the whole of the st. of the previous row; then twice 2 ch. — 1 tr. in the 2nd nearest st., 2 ch., 1 tr. on the ch. forming the point, 4 ch., 1 tr. also on the point. Work downwards as you have done upwards: tr. with ch. in between, then 8 d. st. — 1 ch. — T.

3rd row. — 8 d. st. — On the 2 ch., 4 d. st. with 3 ch. forming a p. in between. At the point, on the 4 ch., 3 times 2 d. st., 1 p. and 2 d. st.

The 1st and 2nd p. are joined to the last and one before last p. of the previous leaf.

After the 8 d. st., work 22 ch., the 6 first ones being used for the edge of the lace, then work on the 16 others.

For the lower edge, work: 1 tr., 1 ch., 1 tr. in every other st., sticking the needle in the 1st st. of the ch. and in the 1st st. of the 3rd row at the same time so that the corner will lie flat.

Narrow Insertion for Underwear



On a ch. of desired length work:

10 d. st. on the ch. — 10 ch. — join to the 6th st. from the needle — 15 d. st. on the loop of ch. — Always repeat.

On the 2nd side, work in the same way.

For the edge: 1 d. st. on the middle st. of the nearest circle—9 ch.—1 d. st. on the following circle.

2nd row. — 1 tr. — 1 ch. — 1 tr. in every other st.

LOZENGES FORMING A BORDER

or edging for insertion



Worked with Cordonnet 6 fils à la Croix C·B, nº 60

Begin with * 20 ch. — 1 d. st. in the 8^{th} from the needle; — 4 ch. — 1 d. st. 3 times on the 4^{th} ch.

To t.:6 ch.; then always 1 d. st. on the ch. of the previous row with 4 ch. in between. Work 6 rows and always repeat for a lozange from *.

One lozange is worked in one direction and the st. of the following lozange are worked in another direction.

Around, on a coarse cotton which forms the cord, work 3 d. st. in each hole, and 7 d. st. in the corners; — on the cross sides 1 d. st., then 3 d. st.

EYELET INSERTION



Worked with Cordonnet 6 fils à la Croix C·B, nº 50

- * 15 ch., join last to first with 1 d. st.
- On the ring thus formed, work 30 d. st. and join with one tight st. to the last st. of the previous ring. T. 7 d. st. on the d. st. of the previous row working in the back loop. 3 d. st. in the following st. and 7 d. st. Repeat from *

On the side which is not yet filled, work in the same way, 7 d. st., 3 d. st., 7 d. st.

The 2nd evelet row is joined to the eyelets already made after the 8th d. st.



Lace with Small and Large Rings



Worked with Cordonnet 6 fils à la Croix C·B, nº 50

Begin with 12 ch. joined into a ring, cover half with 12 tr.; then * 5 ch., join with 1 d. st. to the 2nd st. to form a p. — 13 ch. — 1 d. st. in the 2nd st., in the circle thus formed: 6 tr. then 8 ch., join with 1 d. st. to the middle of the last ring and on the ch. — work — 4 d. st., 1 p. of 4 ch., 3 d. st., 1 p., 3 d. st., 1 p., 4 d. st.; — again on the ring 6 tr. — repeat always from *.

Work in the same way on the 2nd side; but after the 6 last tr. join with 1 tight st. to the 1st tr. on the ring, after the p. join the ch. st. ro the nearest tr.

For the edge:

1 d. st. in the middle p. on the arch — 8 ch.

2nd row. — 1 tr. 1 ch., — 1 tr. in every other st.

By repeating the 2 rows of the edge on the 2nd side it makes an insertion.

Lace with Flowers the edge forming braid



Worked with Cordonnet 6 fils à la Croix C·B, nº 60

For the edge, work always 6 d. st., to t., 1 ch. and work in the back loop of the st. of the previous row to form the rib.

After the 5th row: 8 ch., — join with 1 d. st. to the 1st row of the edge — On the ch., 12 d. st.

Work the 6 d. st., of the edge, then again 5 rows — 8 ch. on which work only 6 d. st. — then 10 ch., join with 1 d. st. to the 4th ch. — 5 ch., 1 triple tr. and 5 times 4 ch., 1 triple tr. — join with 1 d. st. to the middle of the nearest arch — T. — in each hole, 1 d. st., — 4 tr., 1 d. st., — but, in the 2nd group, after the 2nd tr., join to the last scallop of the nearest flower.

3 ch., — 4 d. st. on the ch., which form a stem, then, finish with 6 d. st. which complete the arch.

Lengthwise, work 1 row of holes with 1 tr., — 1 ch., — 1 tr. in each 2nd row.



Screen Lace



For the edge, work always: 2 d. tr. with 2 ch. in between, --- 1 ch., -2 d. tr. with 2 ch. in between. To t.: 8 ch.

After the 3rd row, continue with 5 ch. and on the 4th of the 8 previous ch.: — 3 triple tr. with 6 ch. in between — T. — 12 d. st. in each hole between the triple tr. — T. — 1 d. st. in each d. st. working in the front loop. Join with 1 tr. to the 2nd p. of the previous scallop — T. — 2 d. st., 1 p. of 5 ch., then 5 times, 4 d. st., 1 p., — to finish 2 d. st. Continue with 3 ch., 1 d. st. on the ch. before the triple tr. Work forwards and backwards 1 row of the edge, then 5 ch., — 1 triple tr. on the nearest d. st. — 6 times: 5 ch., — 1 triple tr. on the 2nd d. st. after 1 p. Join with 1 tr. after the 2 following p. — T. — Always: 3 d. st., — 1 p., — 2 d. st., — 1 p., — 3 d. st., — then 3 ch., 1 d. st., 3 ch.

On the desired length: work 1 d. st. in the ch. loop formed when turning — 7 ch. Then 1 tr., 2 ch., 1 tr. in every 3 st.



Insertion with small Lozenges



This regular design can be worked in wide or narrow inscrtion or in any size or shape.

On a ch. of desired length, work:

 I^{st} row. — 3 d. st. — *5 ch., 1 d. tr. on the 5th st. of the ch., 5 ch., miss 4 st., then 5 d. st., repeat from * and finish with 3 d. st. — T.

* 9 d. st. on the 5 ch., 1 d. st. on the d. st. of the previous row --on the d. st. — Repeat from * and finish with 3 d. st. — T.

3rd row. — 10 ch. — * 5 d. st. one of which above the d. tr. 2 on the right and 2 on the left; 5 ch., 1 d. tr. in the middle of the 5 d. st., 5 ch. — Repeat from * and finish with 1 d. tr. — T.

 4^{th} row. — 10 ch. — * 5 d. st. on the d. st. — 5 ch. — 1 d. tr. above the d. tr. — 5 ch. — Repeat from * and finish with 1 d. tr. on the 6^{th} ch.

5th row. — Begin with 9 d. st. on the ch. — 5 d. st. on the d. st. — and continue like the 2nd row.

Imitation old Cluny Insertion



On a ch. of 36 st., work:

Ist row. — 1 tr. in the 8th st. from the needle — 7 ch. — 1 tr. in the 4th st. 2 ch. — 2 d. st. in the 3rd and 4th st. — 2 ch. — 1 tr. in the 3rd st. — 7 ch. — 1 tr. in the 4th st. — 2 ch., 2 tr., 2 ch., 1 tr., 7 ch. — 1 tr. in the 4th st. 2 ch., 1 tr. in the 3^{rd} st. — 7 ch. — 1 tr. in the 4^{th} st. 2 ch., 1 tr. in the 3^{rd} st. — 7.

2nd row. — 5 ch., 1 d. st. on the tr., 4 d. st. on the ch., 2 d. tr. finished together on the nearest tr., — 3 ch., 2 d. tr. on the tr., — 3 ch., 2 d. tr. finished together on the following tr. — 4 d. st. on the ch., 1. d. st. on the nearest tr., 2 ch., 2 tr. on the 2 d. st., 2 ch., 1 d. st. on the tr., 4 d. st. on the ch., 2 d. tr. finished together on the tr., — 3 ch., 1 tr. in the 3rd of the 5 ch. — T.

 3^{rd} row. — 5 ch., — 4 d. st. on the ch., 1 d. st. on the group of tr., 4 ch., 2 d. tr. finished together in the st. in which the last d. st. is made, — then 2 ch., — 2 d. tr. on the 2 tr., 2 ch., 2 d. tr. finished together on the group of tr., — 4 ch., — 1 d. st. on the same st., — 4 d. st. on the ch., — 2 ch., — 2 tr. on the d. tr. — 2 ch., — 4 d. st. on the ch., — 1 d. st. on the group of tr., 4 ch., — 2 d. tr. finished together in the same st., — 2 ch., — 1 tr., in the 3^{rd} of the 5 ch., — T.

 4^{th} row. -5 ch., -1 tr. on the group of tr. -5 ch., -1 tr. on the 4^{th} d. st., 2 ch., -2 d. st. on the 2 tr., -2 ch., -1 tr. on the 2^{nd} d. st., -5 ch., -1 tr. on the group of tr., -2 ch., -2 tr. on the 2 d. tr., -2 ch., -1 tr. on the group of tr., -5 ch., -1 tr. on the 4^{th} d. st., -2 ch., -1 tr. in the 3^{rd} of the 5 ch., -1

 5^{th} row. — 1 ch., — 1 d. st. on the nearest tr., — 2 d. st. on the ch., — on d. st. on the tr., — 5 d. st. on the ch., — 1 d. st. on the tr. and continue 1 d. st. in each st. of the previous row, these st. being worked across the ch. — T.

 6^{th} row. — 5 ch., 1 tr. in the 4^{th} st., 7 ch., —1 tr. in the 6^{th} st., —2 ch., 2 d. st. in the 3^{rd} and 4^{th} st., —2 ch., 1 tr. in the 3^{rd} st., 7 ch., 1 tr. in the 6^{th} st., 2 ch., 2 tr., 2 ch., 1 tr., —7 ch., 1 tr. in the 6^{th} st., 2 ch., 1 tr. in the 3^{rd} of the 5 ch.

Repeat always from the 2nd to the 6th row. To have a wider insertion repeat the design.



Imitation Guipure Insertion made of squares



Each square is made separately.

For each of them, begin with a ch. of 20 st.,—1 tr. in the 8th st. from the needle. — 2 ch., — 1 tr. in the 3th nearest st., work 3 times again 2 ch., 1 tr., — T.

Always 5 ch., 1 tr. on the nearest tr., 2 ch., 1 tr., 4 times. — T. — Work 5 rows of small squares, then around:

1st row. — 3 d. st. in each hole, 7 d. st. in the corner.

2nd row. — Work in the back loop of the st. of the previous row. — * 10 d. st., then 10 ch., t. to join to the 5th d. st. — T. — Cover the curve of ch. with 5 d. st., 1 p. of 4 ch. — 2 d. st., 1 p. 4 times, — that is to say 5 p., then 5 d. st. — Continue on the square: 5 d. st., 3 d. st. in the 4th of the 7 st. of the previous row, repeat 3 times from*.

3rd row.— 1 d.st. in the corner *8 ch.—1 d. st. in the 2nd p. of the arch—8 ch.—1 d. st. in the 4th p. of the same arch—8 ch.—1 d. st. in the corner of the square—repeat 3 times from*.

4th row.— * On the nearest curve of ch., 5 d. st. 1 p., 2 d. st., 1 p., 5 d. st. — On the middle curve: 5 d. st., 1 p., 3 d. st., 1 p. 5 d. st. — On the following curve: 5 d. st., 1 p., 2 d. st., 1 p., 5 d. st. — Repeat 5 times from*.

The squares are joined to each other by the p. when working the last row.

Besides insertions this design can be worked in any shape or size.



Imitation Cluny Insertion



The stars are work separately.

For a star with round leaves, work 4 ch. joined into a ring with 1 tight st., and on the ch. 6 d. st., — join with a tigh st. — *6 ch., —2 triple tr. in the 1st st. of the ring — 6 ch. and 1 d. st. in the st. in which the triple tr. are — repeat 5 times from*.

For a star with pointed leaves, work: 9 ch. — 1 d. st. in the 2nd st. from the needle, — then 1 loose tr., 1 tr., 2 d. tr., 1 tr., 1 loose tr., and 1 d. st. — Repeat 5 times. — There are 6 leaves — join into a ring, then work inside on the st. holding each other, 1 row of d. st. to tighten the star.

The pattern shows the 2 kinds of stars worked alt. in the design. You can also make all of one kind or the other.

For the ribbon which forms a braid, work:

Begin with 9 ch., — 1 tr. in the 6^{th} st. from the needle, then 3 tr. on the 3 following st. — T. — 5 ch., — 4 tr. on the 4 tr. — T. — 5 ch. — 4 tr. on the 4 tr. The ribbon is continued always in the same way.

To join to the stars after the 3rd row of the ribbon, work: 2 ch. — T. — 1 tr. on the d. st. forming the point of the leaf or between the 2 triple tr. of a star. -2 ch., 4 tr. on the 4 tr. - T. -5 ch. -4 tr., 2 ch. - T. -1 d. st. on the 2nd point of the star; 2 ch., 4 tr. - T. -5 ch. -4 tr. -5 ch. -4 tr. - T. 1 d. st. on the 3^{rd} point of the star -2 ch., 4 tr.

Continue as it is shown in the illustration. Between the 2 first and the 2 last leaves work 2 rows of ribbon, between the others work 4 rows of ribbon, which form the curve. In the 6th leaf as in the 1st one, work 1 tr. after the 2 ch., in the others d. st.

Work 3 rows of ribbon after having completely joined a star; the following one is placed on the other side of the ribbon.





For the filling, inside, work: Join with 1 d. st. to the nearest loop of the ribbon, on the left of the star, — 5 ch., 1 triple tr. in the middle of the leaf of the star, — 3 ch., 1 quadruple tr. in the middle of the star — 3 ch., 1 triple tr. in the middle of the leaf, 5 ch. — Join with 1 d. st. to the loop of ribbon opposite. — T. — Work backwards with d. st. one in each st. — 1 d. st. in the loop in which the row was begun.

3 ch., 1 d. st. on the following loop of ribbon -- 6 ch., 1 triple tr. on the tr. of the previous row — 4 ch.. 1 triple tr. on the corresponding tr. — 4 ch., 1 triple tr. — 6 ch. — Join with 1 d. st. to

the loop opposite — T. — Work backwards with d. st. — 4 ch., 1 d. st. on the following loop of ribbon — 4 ch., 1 triple tr. on the tr. of the previous row — 8 ch., 1 triple tr. on the corresponding tr. — 8 ch., 1 triple tr.; then 1 d. tr. on the nearest loop of ribbon. — T.

1 d. st. on triple tr. — work backwards on the ch. making 2 leaves.

For 1 leaf: — 1 d. st., 1 loose tr., 1 tr., 2 d. tr., 1 tr., 1 loose tr., 1 d. st. — Then 1 d. st. on the triple tr. of the middle; after the 2nd leaf break off the cotton.

On the lower edge work on both sides of the insertion: *1 d. st. in the loop of ribbon, 6 ch., 1 d. tr. in the following loop, 1 quadruple tr. on the point of the leaf, 10 ch., 1 d. st. between the 2 leaves — 10 ch., 1 quadruple tr. on the point of the left leaf — 1 d. tr. in the nearest loop of ribbon, 6 ch. — 1 d. st. in the following loop, 3 ch. — Repeat from*.



Narrow Insertion Imitation Venitian Lace



Worked with Cordonnet 6 fils à la Croix C:B, nº 50

Begin with 10 ch. on which you work 10 d. st., then * 10 ch. — T. — 2 quadruple tr. (cast the cotton 4 times on the needle) finished together on the 2nd and one before last d. st., — 4 ch., 1 quadruple tr. on the last d. st. — 9 ch., 1 d. st. on the 6th of the 10 ch. — 2 ch., 8 d. st. on the nearest ch. — the d. st. are worked across th. st., except the 8th for which you stick in the ch. before the last. — T. — Miss the 1st st. and 1 d. st. worked in the whole st. of the 7 others. T. — Miss the 1st one, then 6 d. st. and continue this way. 5 d. st. — 4 d. st. — 3 d. st. — 2 d. st. and 1 d. st.

Then 4 ch., I quadruple tr. on the ch. before the base of the triangle — T. 4 ch., I d. st. on the st. at the point of the triangle — 4 ch., I quadruple tr. on the Ist of the 9 ch. — T., then 10 d. st. on the ch.: 5 at the right and 5 at the left of the design; those at the left are worked on 2 ch. — Repeat from *.

When you have worked the desired length, on both sides work:

In each hole 8 d. st.

2nd row. — 1 tr. - 3 ch. — 1 tr. in every 4th st.





3rd row. — * 22 tr. on the tr. and across the ch. of the previous row — 8 ch.; miss: 2 ch. — 2 d. tr. and 2 ch. — and repeat from *.

For each pattern use 6 groups of 2 d. tr. and miss 1, that is to say 7 groups.

4th row. — * 16 tr. on the 22 tr. of the previous row, and leave 3 on each side — 8 ch. — 1 square (for 1 square work 1 tr. on the 3rd nearest ch., 2 ch., 1 tr., on the 3rd following ch.) then 8 ch. — Repeat from *.

5th row. — 10 tr. on the 16 tr. of the previous row, and leave 3 on each side. — Then 2 squares with 8 ch. in the beginning, in the middle, and at the end.

 6^{th} row. — 2 tr. — in the middle of the 10 tr. of the previous row -8 ch. — 3 squares.

7th row. - 10 tr. — 2 of which on the 2 tr. of the previous row, 4 on the ch. before and after 2 squares.

8th row. — 16 tr. 10 of which on those of the previous row, 3 before and after 1 square.

9th row. — 22 tr. 16 of which on those of the previous row, 3 before and after, — 9 ch.

10th row. — 16 tr. on the 22, leave 3 on each side — 6 ch. — 2 d. tr. with 3 ch. in between in the 5th of the 9 ch. — 6 ch.

11th row. — 10 tr. on the 16 tr., leave 3 on each side. — 4 ch. 2 tr. with 2 ch. in between on the ch. — 2 ch., 2 d. tr. with 3 ch. between the d. tr. of the previous row — 2 ch. and 2 tr. with 2 ch. in between, — then 4 ch.

12th row. — 2 tr. in the middle of the 10 tr. of the previous row — 4 ch., 2 tr. with 2 ch. in between on the 2 tr. — then 2 tr. with 2 ch. in between on the ch. — again 2 ch., then 2 d. tr. with 3 ch. between the d. tr. — Repeat on the 2nd side of the scallop reversing the tr. and the ch.

13th row. — 1 d. st. between the 2 tr. of the pattern, 4 ch. — 4 tr. with 2 ch. between them each time, on the 4 tr. — 2 tr. with 2 ch. in between on the ch. — 2 ch., then 2 d. tr. with 3 ch. between the d. tr. — Repeat working downwards.

14th row. — 6 tr. with 2 ch. in between on the 6 tr. — 2 tr. with 2 ch. in between on the ch. — 2 ch., then 2 d. tr. with 3 ch. between the d. tr. — Repeat working downwards.

15th row. — Finish with 1 d. st. in each hole, then 3 ch., 1 d. st. in the following hole. — At the point stick twice in the same hole. — In the hollow miss the middle hole and do not work a ch. between the 2 d. st.



Round sprig of imitation frivolity lace



The row with bullion knots being finished, turn the work. It is the wrong side of the rows worked afterwards which forms the right side of the sprig.

2nd row. — 1 d. st. on the st. with a bullion knot — 7 ch. — repeat 10 times; - - then 4 slip st. to work upwards to the middle of the ch.

 3^{rd} row. Over the cord -8 d. st. and 1 d. st. on the 4^{th} of the 7 ch. of the previous row.

4th row. — (Also over the cord) — 7 d. st., 1 p. (for 1 p., 4 ch.) — * 2 d. st., 1 p. 6 times, that is to say 7 p. — then 3 d. st., 1 d. st. over the cord and on that of the curve opposite — 4 d. st., 1 d. st. on the stitch before and after the st. on the ch. forming a star, then — 7 d. st. 1 p joined to the last p. of the previous ring. Repeat from *.



Over the cord wound several times round a small pencil, cover it with very tight d. st. (about 30 st.). The wrong side of the work is the right side of the sprig.

The rings are joined 2 by 2 with a kind of chain: — over the cord work a row of d. st., then fold the desired length to have a kind of loop in which, the edges of the st. touch each other; join 2 rings with this chain and sew the ends.

The 8 rings being joined together, form a round pattern on which you work as follows:

On each ring 7 times 1 d. st. with 2 ch. in between.

2nd and 3rd rows. — 1 d. st. in each hole of the previous row—2 ch.

#th row. — Over the cord — in each hole 3 d. st., with at the round curve corresponding to each ring, 3 times, 1. p. of 4 ch. joined with 1 d. st. — In the hollows, 2 d. st. instead of 3 for a hole.

Sprig of Imitation Venitian lace

Begin each star by the centre:

10 ch. — 1 tr. in the 1st ch. — * Then 6 ch. 1 tr. in the st. in which you have already worked — repeat twice from * so as to have 4 tr. (the 1st one being made of 4 ch.) then 1 d. st. in the 3rd ch.

On the ch. of the ring always 1 d. st. T.

5 ch. — 7 d. st. on the 6 nearest st. working 2 d. st. in the 2nd st. Work in the whole st. T.

5 ch. — 8 d. st. on the 7 previous st. working 2 st. in the 1st st. T.

5 ch. -8 d. st. on the 8 st.

Continue turning when you have worked 8 st. — At the ends always 5 ch. which form a p.

In the 7th row work 5 ch. after the 2nd and 6th st. to form a p. Finish and break off thread.







(the thread wound 6 times on the needle) between 2 triangles — 4 ch., 1 d. tr. in the 4th thread of the sextuple tr. — 4 ch., 1 d. tr. in the st. in which you have worked the previous d. tr. — 3 ch., 1 d. st. on the point of the nearest triangle. — 4 ch., 1 quadruple tr. in the hollow between the triangle. — 4 ch. Repeat 3 times from* — To finish instead of working the quadruple tr. join with 1 d. st. to the 6th of the 9 ch. — Break off the thread. The square is finished.

This square just as it is can be used very well for all kinds of purposes.

For the lozenge: — Continue as follows:

On one of the 4 sides:

st. in the nearest hole, 4 d. st. in the following hole and continuing, 5 d. st. — 5 d. st., 4 d. st. — 5 d. st. — join with 1 d. st. to the long tr. of the opposite corner. — T.







6 ch. - 6 d. st. on the 5 ch. 8 d. st. - 8 d. st. - 6 d. st. - 8 d. st. d. st. - in the corner 10 d. st. on the 8 ch.

Work lengthwise: 1st row. — 1 tr. in each st.







For the openworked squares, for each square, work 1 tr. and 2 ch. — for the full ones 3 tr. — there are always 1 or 2 rows of openworked squares around to have a better imitation of real net which always has plain edges.

The square "the Cat" is worked from the base upwards, there are 26 squares — For each small square, 3 ch. and 5 more; that is to say 83 ch. for the pattern. — The full squares which are on the edge of the design have 4 tr. as the last tr. of the openworked square is added to the 3 tr. of the full square. Turn at the end of each row.

After 2 rows of openworked squares:

I tr., 2 ch., I tr. on the nearest tr., begin the design following indications of the illustration.

Work in the whole st. of the tr. of the previous row.



For 1 full square, count 4 tr., for 2 squares together 7 tr., for 3 squares together 10 tr., for 4 squares together 13 tr., that is to say 3 tr. for each full square and one more tr.

To turn always 5 ch., and to finish the row, 1 tr. in the 3rd of the 5 ch. with which you have begun the previous row.

To have a better imitation of net darning, it is a good thing when the square is finished to put it in a net frame or to pin it so as to open the stitches.



gth row. — 2 openworked squares. — 7 full squares, that is 22 tr. — 5 openworked squares. — T.









2nd row. — * On the 8 ch. 5 d. st., 1 p. 5 d. st. — Then for 1 leaf: 9 ch., miss the last st., then 8 d. st. — T. — 1 tight st. on the nearest st. filling the arch and as for the large middle leaf work d. st. on both sides with p. in between, that is: 4 d. st.. 1 p. — 4 d. st., 1 p. — 4 d. st., 1 p., and 4 d. st. — Then 1 d. st. in the arch. — 1 d. st. in the following arch and a leaf — to finish 5 d. st., 1 p., 5 d. st. in the 2nd small arch.

Following, on the large arch: 6 d. st., 1 p. — 5 d. st., 1 p. — 5 d. st., 1 p., 6 d. st. Repeat 3 times from *. Finish off and break the thread.

3rd row. — * 1 d. st. on the p. of the point of a leaf — 12 ch. — 3 triple tr. finished together on the middle p. of the nearest large arch — 5 ch., and 3 triple tr. finished together in the same p. — then 12 ch., 1 d. st. on the p. of the point of the following leaf — 8 ch. and for the crossed tr.: 1 sextuple tr. (the cotton wound 6 times round the needle) in the 2nd p. of the leaf of which the p. at the point has been worked in, finish by casting the cotton 3 times on the needle, then again 3 times for 1 d. tr. in the 2nd p. of the following leaf; finish drawing the cotton remaining on the needle through, then 10 ch. — 1 triple tr. at the junction of the tr. — 8 ch. repeat 3 times from *.

4th row. — 15 d. st. on the 12 ch. — 6 d. st. on 5 ch. — 15 d. st. on the 12 ch. — 9 d. st. on the 8 ch. In the corner: 5 d. st., 3 d. st. in the middle st. and 5 d. st. Then 9 d. st. on the 8 st. Always repeat.





5th row. -- Alt. 1 d. st. then 2 d. st. in the following st. You have 36 st.

6th row. — Working on a coarse foundation cord and in the whole st. of the previous row — alt. 3 times 1 d. st. — then 2 d. st. You have 45 st.

7th row. - Without the cord and in the whole st.: alt. 4 times

1 d. st., then 2 d. st. — After the 13th st., t. — * 4 ch., 1 d. st. in the 3rd st., and twice 3 ch., 1 d. st. in the 3rd st., — t. — 1 ch., 3 d. st. in each hole — t. — repeat twice from *, after the 6th row finish with 4 d. st. in the corner hole and work downwards along the small rectangle 2 d. st. in each hole, and 1 d. st. on the side of the st. Then 1 d. st. in the st. of the circle in which you worked the last st. — Repeat the 7th row to work 4 rectangles which form the cross.

8th row. — I quadruple tr. on the 3rd st. between 2 rectangles — 7 ch. — 9 d. st. on the top d. st. of the nearest pattern of the cross — 7 ch. — Work 7 d. ch. instead of the 1st quadruple tr. 9th row. — With the cord. — 1 d. st. on each of the 9 d. st. — 10 d. st. on the ch. and the cord.

noth row. — * 10 d. st. — T. — 1 ch. — work back with 1 d. st. in the first 8 st. and work 3 more rows going and back, — then downwards on the side of the small square 4 slip st., 1 d. st. in the st. of the circle in which you have worked the last st. Repeat 11 times from *.

11th row. — With the cord. — Always 1 d. st. on the d. st. of a small square, 2 d. st. on the 8th st.; — then 5 d. st. on the cord alone — finish off the thread and break it.

The round pattern made thus can be used as it is.

By adding small patterns in 2 of the corners you will have the shape of the illustration; with patterns in the 4 corners it will make a square.

For a small pattern. — On the cotton wound 3 times round the crochet handle, work: — 20 d. st. join with 1 d. st. round the ring — T. — Then 3 ch., 1 tr. on the small circle, 5 times 3 ch., 1 tr. on the 3rd st. — You have 6 tr. — After 3 ch. join to the large circle — T. — 4 d. st., 1 p., 6 d. st., 1 p., 8 d. st., 1 p., 6 d. st., 1 p. — 4 d. st., join to the ring and 3 slip st. — T. — 4 ch. — 1 tr. on the previous tr. — You have 6 tr. — After 4 ch., join to the ring — T. — 5 d. st. in each hole and 1 p.

All round: * 1 d. st. on the 2^{nd} p. of the small pattern, 5 ch., 1 tr. on the nearest p., — 5 ch., 1 triple tr. on the 3^{rd} of the 5 middle st. — 5 ch., 1 tr. on the nearest p., — 5 ch., 1 d. st. on the p. — 9 ch., 4 triple tr. with 3 ch. in between on the large ring — 9 ch. — Repeat once from * then 1 d. tr. on the 6^{th} st. 18 times at the beginning and at the end 1 triple tr. instead of the d. tr.

Finish with a row of d. st. - Always 7 d. st. on the 6 ch. - 12 d. st. on the 9 ch. - 6 d. st. on the 5 ch. - 3 d. st. on the triple tr. of the corner.



2nd row. — * 4 d. st. on the ch.; — then for 1 ring: 11 ch. which are joined to the d. st. before the last, — and on the curve of ch.: 2 d. st., 1 p. (for 1 p. 4 ch., the cotton once on the needle on the last d. st., once on the curve of ch. and finish drawing the 3 threads in 1 st.) always 2 d. st., 1 p., to have 12 d. st. with 5 p. in between — to finish 1 tight st. on the last st. of the centre — then 4 d. st. — For 1 leaf: — 10 ch., miss 2 st. and following 1 d. st., 1 loose tr., 1 tr., 2 d. tr., 1 tr., 1 loose tr., 1 d. st. Repeat 3 times from *. To finish 1 tight st. on the 1st d. st. Break the thread.

When you have worked the desired number of stars, work:

star—10 ch., 1 d. st. on the middle p. of the nearest ring of a star—10 ch., 1 d. st. on the ch. left at the point of the following leaf—3 times alt.: 10 ch., 1 d. st. on the p. of the ring and the point of a leaf—then 2 ch. Continue on another star.

On the 2nd side of the stars work in the same way; but in the

hollows the d. st. is worked on the p. used previously, and 2 d. st. on 2 ch.

On each side of the stars work:

2nd row. — Always 1 d. st. on each st., but in the hollows do not work in the d. st. worked on the p.

 3^{rd} row. — 1 tr., 2 ch., 1 tr. on the 2^{nd} nearest st. — then 2 ch. and 4 tr. finished together on the 6^{th} and 4^{th} last previous d. st., and on the 4^{th} and 6^{th} nearest st. following the 2 d. st. of the hollow between 2 rings.

4th row. — Always 3 d. st. on the 2 ch.

For the scalloped edge:

5th row. — 1 d. st. on the 3rd d. st. following a hollow; — then for 1 ring with p.:* 16 ch. which are joined to the 5th st. — and on the curve of ch. forming a ring: 12 d. st. with p. as for the 2nd row of the star, — then 5 d. st. on the 4 first of 16 ch. left free — then 1 d. st. on the ring and twice 5 ch., 1 d. st. on the 5th following st. - Repeat from *, but for each new ring the 1st p. is joined to the last p. of the previous ring.

In the hollow of the scallops, after the 2 arches of ch. miss the 3 last st. and work 1 d. st. on the 3rd st. For the ring of the hollow join the 2nd p. to the last p. of the previous ring and it is the p. before the last which is joined to the following ring.





The wheels which are placed on the 4 sides of the ring are worked separately.

For a wheel. - On 8 ch. joined into a circle work:

1st row. — 16 d. st.

2nd row. — 10 d. tr. with 6 ch. in between round the circle, 4 ch. instead of the 1st d. tr. — 1 d. st. to finish.

3rd row. — In each hole 4 d. st., 5 ch. forming a p. — 4 d. st. - Repeat 9 times.

To join the wheels to form the middle design, join the 1st and the 2nd p. of a wheel to the 2 nearest p. of the centre ring, — for the 3rd p. work 12 ch. and join with 1 d. st. to the following p. of the centre, work back on the first half of the ch. with 8 d. st. — then 6 ch., join with 1 d. st. to the last p. of the nearest wheel and work back on the st. left free with 8 d. st. in each hole.

When the 4 wheels are joined to the middle ring work around:

1st row. — Beginning by a corner, *2 d. tr. with 6 ch. in between on the middle st. between 2 p., 5 ch. — 1 tr. between the 2 following p., 5 ch. — 1 d. tr. between the 2 other p.; then 7 ch. — 2 triple tr. with 5 ch. in between on the middle of the 1st and 2nd arches of d. st. — then reverse 7 ch., 1 d. tr. — 5 ch., 1 tr., 5 ch. — repeat 3 times from*.

2nd row. — With the cord. Working at the same time on the ch. and on the cord: 8 d. st. on the 6 ch. — 6 d. st. on the 5⁷ch. — 8 d. st. on the 7 ch.



3rd row. — For the insertion. With the cord: From the corner, 4 d. st. worked in the back loop of the st. of the previous row. Then for the pattern with a wide base (leaving the cord) 9 d.

st. — T. — Miss the 1st st., 1 d. st. on each of the 8 following st., — 1 ch. — T. — 8 d. st. always in the back loop — T. — 7 d. st. Continue forwards and back wards decreasing 1 st. at the beginning of each row to have 6 st. — 5 st. — 4 st. and 3 d. st. — you have 8 rows, then work d. st. downwards on the side to reach the right and take the cord again with which you work upwards always 1 d. st., and 2 d. st. in the middle st. of the top — then 7 d. st. on the edge.

On each side there are 2 patterns with a large base and 3 with a narrow base. After the 3rd one: 4 d. st., then 1 loop of 20 d. st. worked on the cord.

4th row. — With the cord – 2 d. st. on the point of the nearest pattern — 10 d. st. — 8 d. st. on the top of the following pattern. After 8 d. st. work 1 d. st. on the corner loop which has been turned over.

5th row. — Always 1 d. st. in each st. of the previous row. after the top of the 1st pattern work on the cord alone, — 10 d. st. — then 5 d. tr. with 3 d. st. in between worked on the cord; these d. tr. are worked in the middle st. of the pattern — 10 d. st. on the cord left free; — continue to work round the square.

For each corner -- work t wheel as above and join 2 of its p. to the 2nd and 4th tr. of the group of 5 tr. — then work ch. st. which are covered with d. st. and which are joined to the 5th tr. of this same group, then join to the last one of the st. worked on the free cord — repeat the same thing on the other side.

Work all round following the indications on the illustration to form the square d. st., tr., d. tr. and quadruple tr. — then finish with 1 row of d. st. on the ch. of the previous row.



across on 2 chains of ch. st.

3rd row. — 4 d. st. in each hole.

4th row. (Working

from left to right—

12 ch. — Join to the

circle, 6 d. st. on the

last ch. — Repeat to

have 8 holes — to begin

16 ch.

5th row. —* 10d.st. — 1 d. st. on the side of the 6th d. st. of the previous row — 4 d. st. in the following hole, then 12 ch. — join to the middle d. st., then work back with 6 d. st.



-8 ch. — Join to the 5th of the 10 d. st. — and on the ch.:5 d. st., 1 p. (for 1 p., 5 ch. joined with 1 d. st.), 4 d. st., 1 d. st. on the side of the 6th st.

For the small rings closed at the top continue with: 15 ch.

Join to the 5th st., then 4 d. st. on the last st. of the loop — 7 ch., join to the st. to which you joined previously, then in this last ring: 6 d. st., 1 p., 3 d. st. — 1 d. st. on the side of the middle st.

— and in the small following ring: 3 d. st., 1 p., 6 d. st. then 6 d. st. on the ch. forming the stem and continue on the large arch which is not filled, with 4 d. st., 1 p., 5 d. st.; round the circle

— Repeat 6 d. st., 1 d. st. on the side of the 6th d. st. of the previous row 3 times from *.

For a divided round sprig, work: On 3 ch. joined into a circle:

1st and 2nd rows. — 2 d. st. in each st. You have 6 st., then 12 st.

3rd row. — (working from left to right) — 8 ch. — Join to the 3rd st. of the circle, then 3 d. st. on the last ch. — repeat 3 times; — to begin with 10 ch. and to finish the 3 d. st. are worked across the 2 chains of ch. st.

4th row. — * 8d. st. — then 8 ch., 1 d. st. in the one before the last of these st., 9 d. st. across the ch., 8 d. st. in the nearest hole of the circle — 15 ch., 1 d. st. in the st. before the last and

19 st. across as previously — repeat once from *.

5th row. — For 1 division: 1 d. st. in the 1st st. of the group of 8 round the circle and 3 times, 2 ch., 1 d. st. in the 2nd nearest st — T. - 3 ch., 1 d. st. on the 1st d. st. — and 3 times, 2 ch., 1 d. st. in each hole. — T. -3 ch., 1 d. st. on the 1st d. st. - and 4 times 2 ch., 1 d. st. in each hole. — Continue to work forwards and backwards, after having turned do not increase, there are 5 holes. — In the following row, increase one at the beginning; there are 6 holes. Slipstich downwards on the side of the division — then on the circle 2 slip st., before and after the tr. left underneath. Repeat 3 times.



6th row. — After the 4th division: * 5 ch., the 3rd being joined on the wrong side of the long tr. under the 10th st. — On the top of the holes 6 p. with 2 d. st. in each hole — 1 d. st. to begin and to finish with — 5 ch., join the 3rd to the 2rd st. of the small tr. – 6 p. with d. st. — Repeat once from *.

Join the sprigs together by following the indications on the illustration. The long trained to the round divided sprigs after the 15 ch., on the circle of the round sprig with rings, between the arches.

On the round sprigs with rings, the p. of the small rings which follow the stem are to be joined to the p. of the divisions or vice versa.

On the edge work a wide scallop p. (Irish Lace P. Fig. nº 6 of the Album How to make Baby Irish Crochet Lace.)



All the sprigs are worked separately, then joined together with chains covered over with d. st.

For a lozange shaped sprig, work:

8 ch. * miss the last st., then 7 d. st. in the following st. — T. — Miss the 1st st. and 6 d. st. — T. — 1 ch., 5 d. st. miss the st. before the last — t. — miss the 1st st. and 4 d. st. — continue working in the same way — T. — 1 ch., 3 d. st. missing the st. before the last. — T. — Miss the 1st and 2 d. st.

T. – Then increase on the side on which you have decreased: 1 ch., 3 d. st. 2 of which in the last st. — T. 1 ch. — 2 d. st.

in the 1st st.; there are 4 d. st. — T. — 1 ch., 5 d. st., 2 of which in the last st. — T. — 1 ch., — 2 d. st. in the 1st; you have 6 d. st. — T. — 1 ch., 7 d. st., 2 of which in the last st.

Then 8 ch. and repeat from *; join the end of the 2nd side to the beginning of the 1st side.

Work around a row of d. st.: 3 d. st. in the corner and 11 d. st. on each side.

Draw the thread on the wrong side, start the work again inside the lozenge to crochet 4 d. st. on each side.

These sprigs are worked in the whole st.

For a small round sprig,

On 3 ch. joined into a circle, work:

1st row. 2 d. st. in each st., that is 6 st.

2nd row. — 2 d. st. in each st., that is 12 st., working in the whole st.

3rd row. — Alt. 2 d. st. and 1 d. st. in the following st. You have 18 d. st. — Finish off and break the thread.

When you have worked the desired number of lozanges and the corresponding round sprigs, prepare the chains on which you work d. st. The chains with a row of d. st. join the insertion sprigs and pass under the small round sprigs. Chains with d. st. worked on both sides are used around the round sprigs.

It is better to prepare the chains of the desired length but it can also be cut.

On rather strong but flexible paper, baste the lozenges on the wrong side leaving the space to sew a chain between each of them. Straight lines traced on the paper show the place of the chains.

Sew tightly at all the joining points.

When all is sewed cut the basting threads to take the lace off the paper.



Coarse Thread Insertion With Daisy Appliqué Pattern

The foundation insertion is worked first.

On a ch. of desired length work:

1st row, — Always 2 tr., 1 ch. — miss 1 st., 2 tr. on the 2nd and 3rd nearest st.

2nd row. — 6 d. st. in the back loop of the st. of the previous row — 8 ch. — Miss the last st. and 7 d. st. on the following st. — leave the 2 nearest st. of the previous row to continue on the 6 following st.

 3^{rd} row. -1 d. st. on the ch. left at the point of the nearest tr. of the previous row, 1 d. st. on the following st. then 6 ch. — Always repeat.

4th row. — Like the 2nd row.

5th row. Like the 3rd row.

6th row. Like the 1st row.

You have worked an insertion forming crosses; under these crosses are worked double chains, which form double crosses. It is the right side of the work which forms the wrong side of the pattern.

The double chain is a d. st. worked in the left part of the d. st. previously made, which forms a strong and round chain.

The daisies are added after each 2nd double cross.

For a daisy with 8 leaves work, for each leaf:

8 ch. — miss the last st., then 2 d. st. in the same st. — 5 tr. 1 d. st. — around 1 row of slip st. the 5 of the base joining the leaf to the previous one; the 3 st. of the point remain free.

In the middle sew a round sprig made of d. st. which forms the centre of the flower.



Insertion with Bullion Knots



The main work of this insertion is the bullion knot which must be very evenly worked. The crochet needle must be rather coarse comparatively to the cotton used.

For a bullion knot the cotton is wound 18 times on the needle, then pass the latter under the ch. to draw the cotton through; take the cotton again to draw it through all the thread wound on the needle; so as to make the work easier to draw the needle through the cotton, hold the work between the thumb and the 2nd finger of the left hand.

When the loop is drawn through at the top of the knot, the cotton stays at the bottom, then pass the needle underneath to form a loop and work 4 ch. the last of which is finished with the one remaining on the needle.

The insertion is made always of 4 tr. with bullion knot (wound 18 times) — 3 ch. between the 2 middle tr. — before each group of 2 tr. with bullion knot work 1 plain tr. T. — 3 ch., 1 d. st. in the 2nd hole — 5 ch., 1 d. st. in the 2nd following hole — T. — 6 ch. — To begin the group — 1 plain tr. on the 5 ch. Continue on these 5 ch. the tr. with bullion knots.

On the left side of the insertion: — 1 d. st. on the ch. of the large tr., 5 ch. — 1 d. st. on the ch. of the tr. of the previous row.

On both sides on the curves of ch. work: -3 d. st., 3 ch. (for 1 p.) 2 d. st., 1 p., -3 d. st.

Square with Cheeked Background THE GUITAR



7th row. T. — With the cord; — on the right side — * 12 d. st. T. — leave the cord, 12 d. st. T. — 12 d. st. — taking the back loop — twice again forwards and backwards 12 d. st. Then miss 1 st. at the beginning; you have 11 st. and 10 st. — Work on the side downwards to reach the circle again — and repeat 3 times from *.

Round the 4 divisions: — 1 row of d. st. with p. of 4 ch. in the 2 corners and in the middle of each square — Break the thread and start again.

1st row. — On the middle p. of a square 1 tr. * T. — 24 ch. — On the right join 1 d. st. in the hollow, between 2 squares, work back with 16 d. st., then 12 ch., - Join to the 9th d. st., — work back with 6 d. st., then 12 ch. — Join in the st. in which you joined previously -- 7 d. st. on the ch., 12 ch. — T. — 1 tr. on the p. of the nearest square repeat from *.

2nd row. Around work 15 d. st. on the 12 ch., then 9 d. st.

— For the corner 4 ch. then 9 d. st. and 15 d. st.

3rd row. — 1 tr., 1 ch., 1 tr. every other st. — On the 4 corner ch., 4 tr. with 1 ch. between each.


