MATERIALS:

SINGLE SIZE J. & P. COATS BEDSPREAD COTTON 16 balls of White or Ecru.


DOUBLE SIZE J. & P. COATS BEDSPREAD COTTON 21 balls of White or Ecru.

MILWARD'S STEEL CROCHET HOOK No. 7 or 8.

GAUGE:

7 bls or sps make 2 inches; 7 rows make 2 inches. Each block measures about 9 inches square. For a single size spread about 71 x 107 inches, including 4-inch fringe all around, make 7 x 11 blocks. For double size spread, about 89 x 107 inches, including 4-inch fringe, make 9 x 11 blocks.

BLOCK... Ch 12, join with sl st. 1st rnd: Ch 8, d c in same place as sl st (corner made), (ch 2, skip 2 ch, in next ch make d c, ch 5, and d c) 3 times; ch 2, skip 2 ch, sl st in 3rd st of ch-8. 2nd rnd: Ch 3, * 2 d c in corner sp, d c in 3rd ch of same corner, ch 5, d c in same ch as last d c (corner made); 2 d c in same corner sp, d c in next d c, ch 2, d c in next d c. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 2, sl st in 3rd ch of ch-3. 3rd rnd: Ch 3, d c in next 3 d c, * 2 d c in corner sp, d c in center ch of same corner (2 bls made); ch 5, d c in same place as last d c, 2 d c in same sp, d c in next 4 d c, 2 d c in next sp, d c in next 4 d c. Repeat from * around. Join to 3rd ch of ch-3. 4th rnd: Ch 3, d c in next 3 d c (bl made over bl); * ch 2, skip 2 d c, d c in next d c (sp made over bl); 2 d c in corner sp, d c in center ch of same corner,



ch 5, d c in same place, 2 d c in same corner sp, d c in next d c, ch 2, skip 2 d c, d c in next 10 d c. Repeat from * around, ending with d c in last 6 d c. Join. 5th rnd: Ch 5, skip 2 d c, d c in next d c (sp made over bl); ch 2, d c in next d c (sp made over sp); make another sp, * 2 d c in corner sp; in center ch of same corner make d c, ch 5, and d c; 2 d c in same corner, d c in next d c, 3 sps, d c in next 3 d c (1 bl made); 3 sps. Repeat from * around, ending with d c in last 3 d c. Join. Ch 5 for beginning of 6th rnd and follow chart for remainder of block, making ch-5 at corners. The 1st sp of 6th rnd is indicated by "X" on chart. Beginning of rnds is indicated on chart by heavy line.

Make necessary number of blocks, and sew together on wrong side with neat over-and-over stitches. Attach thread and work a row of sps all around spread.

FRINGE . . . Cut ten 12-inch strands of thread. Double the strands, forming a loop. Insert hook in corner sp on block and pull loop through; then pull loose ends through loop and pull tight. Make a fringe in every other sp all around. Trim fringe evenly to measure 4 inches. Block to measurements given.

17 balls of White or Ecru.

DOUBLE SIZE



MILWARD'S CASEIN KNITTING PINS, 1 pair No. 2 (23/4 mm. size).

GAUGE:


Each strip measures 7 inches wide after blocking. For a single size spread, about 72 x 108 inches, including 5-inch fringe, make 9 strips. For a double size spread, about 93 x 108 inches, including 6-inch fringe, make 12 strips.

STRIP . . . Cast on 54 sts. 1st row: Purl across. 2nd row: K 8, * k 2 tog., O, slip 1, k 2 tog., pass the slipped st over the k 2 tog., O, inc. 1 st in next st, k 12. Repeat from * across, ending with k 4. 3rd and all odd rows: K 3, p 48, k 3. 4th row: K 7, * k 2 tog., O, slip 1, k 2 tog., pass the slipped st over the k 2 tog., O, inc. 1 st in next st, k 12. Repeat from * across, ending with k 5. 6th row: K 6, * k 2 tog., O, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., O, inc. 1 st in next st, k 12. Repeat from * across, ending with k 6. 8th row: K 5, * k 2 tog., O, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., O, inc. 1 st in next st, k 12. Repeat from * across, ending with k 7. 10th row: K 4, * k 2



tog., O, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., O, inc. 1 st in next st, k 5, k 2 tog., O, k 5. Repeat from * across, ending with k 8. 12th row: K 4, * inc. 1 st in next st, O, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., O, k 2 tog., k 4, (k 2 tog., O) twice; k 4. Repeat from * across, ending with k 8. 14th row: K 5, * inc. 1 st in next st, O, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., O, k 2 tog., k 4, k 2 tog., O, k 6. Repeat from * across, ending with k 7. 16th row: K 6, * inc. 1 st in next st, O, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., O, k 2 tog., k 12. Repeat from * across, ending with k 6. 18th row: K 7, * inc. 1 st in next st, O, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., O, k 2 tog., k 12. Repeat from * across, ending with k 5. 20th row: K 8, * inc. 1 st in next st, O, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., O, k 2 tog., k 5, k 2 tog., O, k 5. Repeat from * across, ending with k 4. 22nd row: K 8, * k 2 tog., O, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., O, inc. 1 st in next st, k 4, (k 2 tog., O) twice; k 4. Repeat from * across, ending with k 4. 24th row: K 7, * k 2 tog., O, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., O, inc. 1 st in next st, k 6, k 2 tog., O, k 4. Repeat from * across, ending with k 5. 25th row: K 3, p 48, k 3. Repeat the 6th to 25th rows incl. for pattern, until piece measures 98 inches. Bind off. Block strip to measure 7 x 102 inches. Make the necessary number of strips and sew them together with neat over-andover stitches on wrong side.

these strands, forming a loop. With a crochet hook, pull loop through spread, 2 sts in from edge, and draw loose ends of fringe through this loop. Pull tight to form a knot. Make fringe ½ inch apart, around 3 edges. Then knot together 8 strands of 2 adjacent knots, 1 inch down from 1st row of knots. Continue thus along entire fringe. Make another row of knots in same manner, 1 inch down from last row of knots. Work 2 rows of single crochet along 4th edge. for top of spread. Trim fringe evenly.

GAUGE:


Each block measures about 6 inches square before blocking. For a single size spread about 72 x 105 inches, make 11 x 16 blocks. For a double size spread about 90 x 105 inches, make 14 x 16 blocks.

FIRST BLOCK . . . Starting at center, ch 8. Join with sl st. 1st rnd: Ch 3, 3 d c in ring, (ch 4, 4 d c in ring) 3 times; ch 4, sl st in top of ch-3 first made. 2nd rnd: Ch 3, * d c in next d c, d c in each d c to sp; in sp make 3 d c, ch 4 and 3 d c (corner). Repeat from * around, ending with sl st in top of ch-3. 3rd, 4th and 5th rnds: Repeat 2nd rnd. 6th rnd: Ch 3, d c in next 3 d c, ch 4, skip 4 d c, d c in next 4 d c, * ch 4, in corner sp make 3 d c, ch 4 and 3 d c; (ch 4, skip 4 d c, d c in next 4 d c) 3 times. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 4, sl st in top of ch-3. 7th rnd: Sl st in next 3 d c, sl st in sp, ch 3, 3 d c in same sp, ch 4, skip 4 d c, 4 d c in next sp, * ch 4, in corner sp make 3 d c, ch 4 and 3 d c; (ch 4, 4 d c in next sp) 4 times. Repeat from * around, ending as before. 8th rnd: SI st in next 3 d c and in next sp, ch 3, 3 d c in same sp, ch 4, 4 d c in next sp, * ch 4, in corner sp make


3 d c, ch 4 and 3 d c, (ch 4, 4 d c in next sp) 5 times. Repeat from * around, ending as before. 9th rnd: Ch 3, d c in next 3 d c, ch 4, s c in next 4 d c, * ch 4, in corner sp make 12 d c, (ch 4, s c in next 4 d c, ch 4, d c in next 4 d c) twice; ch 4, s c in next 4 d c. Repeat from * around, ending as before. 10th and 11th rnds: Ch 3, d c in next 3 d c, ch 4, s c in next 4 s c, * ch 4, (d c in next d c, ch 1) 11 times; d c in next d c, (ch 4, s c in next 4 s c, ch 4, d c in next 4 d c) twice; ch 4, s c in next 4 s c. Repeat from * around, ending as before. 12th rnd: Ch 3, d c in next 3 d c, ch 4, s c in next 4 s c, ** ch 4, * s c in next d c, ch 4, s c in 4th ch from hook (a p made); s c in next sp. Repeat from * 10 more times; s c in next d c, p, s c in same place as last s c, (ch 4, s c in next 4 s c, ch 4, d c in next 4 d c) twice; ch 4, s c in next 4 s c. Repeat from ** around, ending as before. Fasten off.

SECOND BLOCK... Work as for First Block to 11th rnd incl. 12th rnd: Work as for 12th rnd of First Block until 8th p is completed, work s c in next sp, s c in next d c, ch 2, s c in corresponding p of 1st block, ch 2, s c in 2nd ch from joining (thus joining corresponding p's); s c in sp, and continue rnd as for First Block, joining next 3 p's and first 4 p's of next corner to corresponding p's of First Block. Sew corresponding d c-scallops with neat over-and-over stitches, as in illustration.

Make necessary number of blocks, joining adjacent sides as Second Block was joined to First, leaving 4 center p's at each corner free. Block to measurements given.

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BIG BALL BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 20

SINGLE SIZE

44 balls of White or Ecru.

DOUBLE SIZE
58 balls of White or Ecru.

MILWARD'S STEEL CROCHET HOOK No. 8 or 9.

GAUGE:

Each motif measures 4 inches in diameter after blocking. For a single size spread about 68 x 104 inches, make 17 x 26 motifs. For a double size spread about 92 x 104 inches, make 23 x 26 motifs.


MOTIF... Starting at center, ch 8. Join with sl st. 1st rnd: Ch 3 (to count as 1 d c), 19 d c in ring. Join with sl st to top st of ch-3 first made (20 sts). 2nd rnd: Ch 3, d c in same place as sl st, 2 d c in each d c around. Join with sl st (40 sts). 3rd rnd: * Ch 7, skip 3 d c, s c in next d c. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 3, skip 3 d c, tr in same place as sl st (10 loops). 4th rnd: Ch 6, d c in top of tr, * ch 3, in center ch of next ch-7 loop make d c, ch 3 and d c. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 3, sl st in 3rd st of ch-6 first made. 5th rnd: Ch 3, * 4 d c in next ch-3 sp, d c in next d c, ch 3, d c in next d c. Repeat from * around, ending with ch-3, sl st in 3rd st of ch-3 first made. 6th rnd: Ch 3, d c in next 5 d c, * ch 3, s c in next sp, ch 3, d c in next 6 d c. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 3, sl st in 3rd st of ch-3 first made. 7th rnd: * Ch 7, skip 4 d c, s c in next d c, ch 7, d c in next d c. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 3, tr in same place as sl st on previous rnd. 8th rnd: Ch 3, 4 d c in top of tr, * ch 2, 5 d c in center st of next loop. Repeat from * around, ending rnd with half d c in 3rd st of ch-3 first made. 9th rnd: S c in sp, ch 1, d c between ch-3 and following d c of next d c-group, * ch 1, d c between 2nd and 3rd d c of same group, ch 1, d c between 3rd and 4th d c, ch 1, d c between 4th and 5th d c of same group, ch 1, s c in next sp (between groups), ch 1, d c between 1st and 2nd d c of next d c-group. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 1, sl st in s c first made. 10th rnd: S c in same place as sl st, * ch 5, skip 2 d c, in next sp make d c, ch 3 and d c; ch 5, skip 2 d c, s c in next s c. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 5, sl st in s c first made. Fasten off. This completes one motif.

SECOND MOTIF... Work as for First Motif to 9th rnd incl. 10th rnd: S c in same place as sl st, ch 5, skip 2 d c, d c in next sp, ch 1, sl st in a point on First Motif, ch 1, d c back in same sp on Second Motif as last d c was made, ch 5, skip 2 d c, s c in next s c,

ch 5, skip 2 d c, d c in next sp, ch 1, sl st in next point on First Motif, ch 1, d c back in same sp on Second Motif as last d c was made, and continue in this manner until 3 points are joined. Complete rnd as for First Motif. Fasten off.


Make necessary number of motifs, joining as Second Motif was joined to First, leaving 2 points free between joinings.

FILL-IN LACE... Starting at center, ch 8. Join with sl st to form ring. Ch 5, 2 d tr in ring, holding back the last loop of each d tr on hook, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (a cluster), sl st in a free point (between joinings of motifs), * ch 6, s c in ring, ch 5, and complete another cluster in ring as before, sl st in next free point. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 6 after last cluster, sl st at base of ch-5 first made. Fasten off. Fill in all spaces in this manner.







67 balls of White or Ecru, or 106 balls of any color.

MILWARD'S STEEL CROCHET HOOK No. 7.

GAUGE:

Each motif measures about 5 inches from one pc st edge to opposite edge, across center before blocking. For a single size spread about 70 x 105 inches, make 292 motifs. For a double size spread about 88 x 105 inches, make 370 motifs.

MOTIF... Starting at center, ch 8. Join with sl st. 1st rnd: 12 s c in ring. Sl st in 1st s c made. 2nd rnd: Ch 6, skip 1 s c, * d c in next s c, ch 3. Repeat from * around. Sl st in 3rd st of ch-6 first made (6 sps). 3rd rnd: In each ch-3 sp around, make s c, half d c, 5 d c, half d c and s c (6 petals). 4th rnd: * Ch 5, s c in next d c between petals (working from behind petals). Repeat from * around, ending with ch 5, sl st in 3rd st of ch-6 on 2nd rnd. 5th rnd: In each ch-5 loop around, make s c, half d c, d c, 5 tr, d c, half d c and s c (6 large petals). 6th rnd: Sl st to center st of next petal, ch 6, d c in same place as last sl st, * ch 5, d c between petals, ch 5, in center st of next petal, make d c, ch 3 and d c. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 5, sl st to 3rd st of ch-6 first made. 7th rnd: * In next ch-3 sp make s c, half d c, 5 d c, half d c and s c (petal made); ch 5, pc st in next d c-to make a pc st ch 1, 5 d c in same place, drop loop from book, insert hook in ch preceding 5 d c and draw dropped loop through; ch 5. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 5, sl st in 1st s c made. 8th rnd: Sl st to center st of next petal, ch 6, d c in same place as last sl st, * ch 5, pc st in next sp, ch 1, pc st in next sp, ch 5, in center st of next petal make d c, ch 3 and d c. Repeat from * around, ending rnd with ch 5, sl st in 3rd st of ch-6 first made.

9th rnd: * In next ch-3 sp make a petal as before, ch 5, pc st in next sp, ch 1, pc st in sp between pc sts, ch 1, pc st in next sp, ch 5. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 5, sl st in 1st s c made. 10th rnd: Sl st to center st of petal, ch 6, d c in same place as last sl st, * ch 5, pc st in next sp, (ch 1, pc st in next sp) 3 times; ch 5, in center st of next petal make d c, ch 3 and d c. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 5, sl st in 3rd st of ch-6 first made. 11th rnd: * In next ch-3 sp make a petal, ch 5, pc st in next sp, (ch 1, pc st in next sp) 4 times; ch 5. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 5, sl st in 1st s c made. 12th rnd: S c in same

place as sl st, * (ch 4, skip 1 st, s c in next st) 4 times; ch 4, pc st in next sp, (ch 1, pc st in next sp) 5 times; ch 4, s c in next s c. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 4, sl st in 1st s c made.

Make necessary number of motifs, sewing adjacent pc st edges as in illustration with neat overand-over stitches.





DIAGRAM FOR MOTIF JOINS

14 balls of White or Ecru.



MILWARD'S STEEL CROCHET HOOK No. 7.

GAUGE:

Each block measures about 7 inches square. For a single size spread about 72 x 106 inches, make 10 x 15 blocks. For a double size spread about 90 x 106 inches, make 13×15 blocks.

FIRST BLOCK ... Starting at center, ch 10. Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: Ch 3, 23 d c in ring. Join with sl st to top of ch-3. 2nd rnd: Ch 3, then holding back on hook the last loop of each d c, make 3 d c in same place as sl st, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (a d c-cluster made); * ch 5, then holding back on hook the last loop of each tr, make 4 tr in next st, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (a tr-cluster made), ch 5, then holding back on hook the last loop of each d c, make 4 d c in next st and complete cluster as before; ch 5, skip 3 d c, a 4-d c cluster in next d c. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 2, d c in tip of 1st cluster made. 3rd rnd: Ch 5, d c in same place as last d c, * ch 2, d c in next sp, ch 2, in tip of next cluster make d c, ch 3 and d c, (ch 2, d c in next sp, ch 2, d c in tip of next cluster) twice. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 2, sl st



in 3rd st of ch 5. 4th rnd: Ch 5, d c in next d c, (ch 2, d c in next d c) twice; ch 2, in next (corner) sp make d c, ch 3 and d c; ch 2, d c in next d c, and continue to make ch-2 sps around, working remaining corners as 1st corner was worked, and ending rnd as before. 5th and 6th rnds: Ch 5 and make ch-2 sps around, working corners and joining rnds as before. 7th rnd: Ch 3, * 2 d c in next sp, d c in d c, d c in next sp, d c in d c. Repeat from * around, making 5 d c in each corner sp. Join to top of ch-3.

8th rnd: Ch 8 (to count as tr and ch-4), skip 2 d c, s c in next d c, (ch 4, skip 2 d c, tr in next d c, ch 4, skip 2 d c, s c in next d c) twice; * ch 3, skip 1 d c, make a d c-cluster in next d c, ch 3, in next d c make a tr-cluster, ch 3 and a tr-cluster; ch 3, d c-cluster in next d c, ch 3, skip 1 d c, s c in next d c, (ch 4, skip 2 d c, tr in next d c, ch 4, skip 2 d c, s c in next d c) 5 times. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 4, sl st in 4th st of ch-8. 9th rnd: Ch 8 (to count as d c and ch-5), (d c in next tr, ch 5) twice; * make a d c-cluster in sp between next 2 clusters, ch 3, in next sp make a tr-cluster, ch 5 and a tr-cluster; ch 3, make a d c-cluster in next sp, (ch 5, d c in next tr) 5 times; ch 5. Repeat from * around. Join to 3rd st of ch-8. 10th rnd: Ch 8, s c in next sp, (ch 4, tr in next d c, ch 4, s c in next sp) twice; * ch 3, d c-cluster in next sp (between 2 clusters), ch 5, in next sp make a tr-cluster, ch 5 and a tr-cluster; ch 5, d c-cluster in next sp, ch 3, s c in next sp, (ch 4, tr in next d c, ch 4, s c in next sp) 5 times. Repeat from * around. Join to 4th st of ch-8. 11th rnd: Ch 8, d c in next tr, ch 5, d c in next tr, * ch 6, make a d c-cluster in sp between next 2 clusters, clf 5, in next sp make a tr-cluster, ch 7 and a tr-cluster; ch 5, make a d c-cluster in next sp, ch 6, d c in next tr, (ch 5, d c in next tr) 4 times. Repeat from * around. Join to 3rd st of ch-8. 12th rnd: Ch 3, (5 d c in next sp, d c in next st) 4 times; * in corner sp make 6 d c, ch 3 and 6 d c; d c in next st, (5 d c in next sp, d c in next st) 8 times. Repeat from * around. Join and fasten off.

Make necessary number of blocks and sew together on wrong side with neat over-and-over stitches.



Each block measures $5\frac{1}{2}$ inches square after blocking. For a single size spread 71 x 104 inches, including edging, make 12 x 18 blocks. For a double size spread 87 x 107 inches, including edging, make 15 x 19 blocks.


BLOCK... Starting at the center, cast on 8 sts on one needle. Divide sts evenly on 4 needles; join, being careful not to twist sts, and knit 2 rnds. Insert a marker on needle to indicate the beginning of the rnd, and work as follows: 3rd rnd: * K 1, O. Repeat from * around (4 sts on each needle). Always slip marker from one needle to another at beginning of each rnd. 4th, 5th and 6th rnds: Knit around. 7th rnd: Repeat 3rd rnd (8 sts on each needle). 8th rnd: Knit around. 9th rnd: Repeat 3rd rnd (16 sts on each needle). 10th, 11th and 12th rnds: Purl around. 13th rnd: * Skip the 1st st, knit through the front of the 2nd st, slipping it over the 1st st and off the needle; then knit the slipped st (cross st made). Repeat from * around. 14th and all even rnds: Knit around. 15th rnd: Knit through the back of the 1st st (twist made). * Make 3 cross sts; then twist next 2 sts. Repeat from * around, ending with 1 twist st. 17th rnd: Make cross sts around. 19th rnd: * Twist 1 st, make 3 cross sts, twist 1 st, O. Repeat from * around (18 sts on each needle).



21st rnd: * Make 4 cross sts, O, k 1, O. Repeat from * around (22 sts). 23rd rnd: * Twist 1 st, make 3 cross sts, twist 1 st, O, k 3, O. Repeat from * around (26 sts). **25th rnd:** * Slip 1, k 1, p.s.s.o., make 2 cross sts, k 2 tog., O, k 5, O. Repeat from * around. 27th rnd: * Slip 1, k 1, p.s.s.o., make a cross st, k 2 tog., O, k 7, O. Repeat from * around. 29th rnd: * Slip 1, k 1, p.s.s.o., k 2 tog., O, k 1, O, k 2, slip 1, k 2 tog., pass the slipped st over the k 2 tog., k 2, O, k 1, O. Repeat from * around. 31st rnd: * K 2 tog., O, k 3, O, k 1, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., k 1, O, k 3, O. Repeat from * around (28 sts). 33rd rnd: * Twist 1 st, O, k 2 tog., O, k 1, O, slip 1, k 1, p.s.s.o., O, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., O, k 2 tog., O, k 1, O, slip 1, k 1, p.s.s.o., O. Repeat from * around (32 sts). 35th rnd: * Make 5 sts in next st —to make 5 sts in 1 st, knit and purl alternately in same st until there are 5 sts on right-hand needle; O, k 2 tog., O, k 3, O, slip 1, k 1, p.s.s.o., O, twist 1 st, O, k 2 tog., O, k 3, O, slip 1, k 1, p.s.s.o., O. Repeat from * around (48 sts).

NOTE: At the end of the 36th rnd, remove marker, and knit first 2 sts of 1st needle onto the end of the 4th needle. Slip 2 sts from the beginning of each of the 2nd, 3rd and 4th needles onto the end of the previous needle. 37th rnd: * K 3, k 2 tog., O, k 4, O, slip 1, k 1, p.s.s.o., slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., k 2 tog., O, k 4, O, slip 1, k 1, p.s.s.o., k 26. Repeat from * around (46 sts). 38th rnd: * P 2, k 19, p 2, k 23. Repeat from * around. 39th rnd: * K 1, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., O, k 6, O, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., O, k 6, O, k 3 tog., k 24. Repeat from * around (44 sts). 40th rnd: * P 2, k 17, p 2, k 23. Repeat from * around. 41st rnd: K 1, slip 1, k 1, p.s.s.o., O, k 2, k 2 tog., k 2, O, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., O, k 2, k 2 tog., k 2, O, k 2 tog., k 1. Turn, and work over these last 19 sts only in rows as follows: 42nd row: K 2, p 15, k 2. 43rd row: K 1, slip 1, k 1, p.s.s.o., O, k 1, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., k 1, O, k 3, O, k 1, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., k 1, O, k 2 tog., k 1 (17 sts). 44th row: K 2, p 13, k 2. 45th row: K 1, slip 1, k 1, p.s.s.o., O, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., O, k 5, O, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., O, k 2 tog., k 1 (15 sts). 46th row: K 2, p 11, k 2. 47th row: K 1, slip 1, k 1, p.s.s.o., k 1, O, k 2, slip 1, k 2 tog., p.s.s.o., k 2, O, k 1, k 2 tog., k 1

Join. 3rd rnd: Ch 7, * skip 3 tr, tr in next 5 tr, in corner sp make 4 tr, ch 7 and 4 tr; make tr in next 5 tr, ch 3. Repeat from * around. Join to 4th ch of ch-7. 4th rnd: Ch 7, * tr in next 9 tr, in corner sp make 4 tr, ch 7 and 4 tr; make tr in next 9 tr, ch 3. Repeat from * around. Join. 5th rnd: Ch 7, tr in next tr, * ch 3, skip 3 tr, tr in next 9 tr, in corner sp make 4 tr, ch 7 and 4 tr; tr in next 9 tr, ch 3, skip 3 tr, tr in next tr (sp made over bl), ch 3, tr in next tr. Repeat from * around. Join. Beginning with 6th rnd, follow chart until 13 rnds in all are completed. The first sp of 6th rnd is indicated by "X." 14th rnd: Ch 4, 3 tr in sp, tr in next tr (bl made over sp), ch 3, and continue to follow chart to complete rnd. Starting with 15th rnd, follow chart to complete block. Make necessary number of blocks and sew together on wrong side with neat over-andover stitches.

EDGING . . . Attach thread, ch 4, and work 3 rnds of





Repeat from * across, until row measures 67 inches for single size (83 inches for double size, or 42 inches for crib size), ending with 3 d c (1 pc-st row made). Cut off remaining chain. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: S c in 1st 3 sts, * insert hook in back of pc st and in center tr of same pc st, draw loop through and finish as for an s c. Make s c in next 7 d c. Repeat from * across, ending with s c in top st of turning ch. Ch 3, turn. 3rd row: D c in next (2nd) s c and the following 3 s c, pc st in next s c, * d c in next 7 s c, pc st in next s c. Repeat from * across, ending with d c in last 9 s c. Ch 1, turn. 4th row: S c in each st across, working over pc sts as before, ending with s c in top of turning ch. Ch 3, turn. 5th row: D c in next (2nd) s c and in following 5 s c, * pc st in next s c, d c in next 7 s c. Repeat from across, ending with d c in last 7 s c. Ch 1, turn. 6th row: Same as 4th row. 7th row: D c in next (2nd) s c and the following 7 s c, * pc st in next s c, d c in next 7 s c. Repeat from * across, ending with d c in last 5 s c. Ch 1, turn. 8th row: Same as 4th row. 9th row: D c in next (2nd) s c and in following s c, * pc st in next s c, d c in next 7 s c. Repeat from * across, ending

with d c in last 3 s c. Ch 1, turn. The 2nd to 9th rows incl. constitute the pattern. Work in pattern until piece measures 104 inches for single or double size spreads (or 58 inches for crib size), ending with the 2nd row of pattern. Fasten off. Block to measurements given.



Join. 6th rnd: Ch 3, d c in next 7 d c, * ch 1, a ch-4 p, ch 2, d c in next 8 d c. Repeat from * around. Join. 7th rnd: Ch 3, d c in next 7 d c, * ch 8, d c in next 8 d c. Repeat from * around. Join. 8th rnd: Ch 3, d c in next 7 d c, * 12 d c in sp, d c in next 8 d c. Repeat from * around. Join and fasten off.

Make necessary number of motifs and sew one group of 8 d c of adjacent motifs with neat over-and-over stitches, picking up only the back loop of each st. There will be one group of 8 d c free on each motif between joinings.



FILL-IN MOTIF... Repeat first 3 rnds of large motif. Fasten off. Sew group of 8 d c between joinings on each large motif to 8 d c of fill-in motif. Fill all spaces between joinings in same way.





Continue as for 13th rnd of First Motif, joining the next point as previous point was joined and complete rnd. Fasten off.

Make necessary number of motifs, joining to adjacent motifs as Second was joined to First.

FILL-IN LACE... Starting at center, ch 6. Join. 1st rnd: 16 s c in ring. Join. 2nd rnd: S c in same place as sl st, (ch 7, skip 1 s c, s c in next s c) 7 times; ch 7, sl st in 1st s c (8 loops). 3rd rnd: Sl st to center of 1st ch-7 loop, s c in same loop, * ch 8, sl st in joining between motifs, ch 8, s c back in same ch-7 loop, ch 4, s c in next ch-7 loop, ch 4, sl st in center of s c-group on motif, ch 4, s c back in same loop of Fill-In Motif, ch 4, s c in next ch-7 loop. Repeat from * around. Join. Fasten off.

Fill in all spaces between joinings in same way. Block to measurements given.

Join. 6th rnd: Sl st in next ch-2 sp, ch 4, 2-tr cluster in same place as sl st, ch 2, 3-tr cluster in same place, * ch 2, in next ch-2 sp make 3-tr cluster, ch 5 and 3-tr cluster; ch 2, in next ch-2 sp make two 3-tr clusters with ch-2 between, ch 5, skip 1 tr, tr in next 5 tr holding the last loop of each tr on hook, finish as for a cluster; ch 8, skip 1 tr, and ch 3, s c in next tr, ch 8, skip ch-3 and 1 tr, 5-tr cluster over next 5 tr, ch 5, in next ch-2 sp make two 3-tr clusters with ch-2 between. Repeat from * around. Join. Fasten off.

SECOND MOTIF... Work first 5 rnds as for First Motif. 6th rnd: Sl st in next ch-2 sp, ch 4, 2-tr cluster

in same place as sl st, ch 2, 3-tr cluster in same place, ch 2, 3-tr cluster in next sp, ch 2, sl st in corresponding sp of First Motif, ch 2, 3-tr cluster back in same place as last cluster on Second Motif, ch 2, in next ch-2 sp make two 3-tr clusters with ch-2 between, ch 5, skip 1 tr, 5-tr cluster over next 5 tr, ch 4, sl st in corresponding sp on First Motif, ch 4, skip next tr and ch 4, s c back in next tr on Second Motif. Join the next loop in the same way. Continue as for 6th rnd of First Motif, joining next corner to First Motif as previous corner was joined. Complete rnd as for First Motif. Make necessary number of motifs, joining adjacent sides as Second Motif was joined to First (whenever 4 corners meet, join 3rd and 4th corners to joining of other corners).

EDGING ... 1st rnd: Attach thread to tip of 1st cluster on corner motif following a joining, ch 8, tr in tip of next cluster, (ch 4, tr in tip of next cluster) twice, (ch 4, tr in next sp) twice, (ch 4, tr in tip of next cluster) 4 times; ch 4, in center st of corner sp make tr, ch 5 and tr; * (ch 4, tr in tip of next cluster) 4 times, (ch 4, tr in next sp) twice, (ch 4, tr in next cluster) 4 times; ch 4, tr in joining. Repeat from * around, turning corners as 1st corner was turned and joining last ch-4 to 4th st of ch-8 first made. 2nd and 3rd rnds: Ch 8, * tr in next tr, ch 4. Repeat from * around, making tr, ch-5 and tr in center st of each corner sp. Join as before. 4th rnd: Ch 4, a 3-tr cluster in same place as sl st, * ch 4, a 4 tr-cluster in next tr. Repeat from * around, making an extra ch-4 and cluster in center st of each corner sp. Join to tip of 1st cluster made. 5th rnd: Ch 4, 4 tr in same place as sl*st, * ch 4, s c in tip of next cluster, ch 4, 5 tr in tip of next cluster. Repeat from * to corner cluster, ch 4, s c in next sp, ch 4, 5 tr in tip of corner cluster, ch 4, s c in next sp, ch 4, 5 tr in tip of next cluster, ch 4, s c in tip of next cluster and continue thus around. Join to 4th st of ch-4 first made. 6th rnd: Ch 4, a 2 tr-cluster in same place as sl st, * ch 5, skip 1 tr, make a 3-tr cluster in next tr, ch 5, make a 3-tr cluster in each of next 2 tr. Repeat from * around. Join and fasten off. Block to measurements given.



MILWARD'S STEEL CROCHET HOOK No. 7.

GAUGE:

Each motif measures about 7 inches from side to side; 8 inches from point to point diagonally. For a single size spread about 90 x 108 inches (including fringe), make 148 motifs. For a double size spread about 75 x 108 inches (including fringe), make 175 motifs.




MOTIF... Starting at center, ch 8. Join with sl st to form a ring. 1st rnd: Ch 3, 17 d c in ring. Sl st in top of ch-3. 2nd rnd: Ch 3, 4 d c in same place as sl st, drop loop from hook, insert hook in top of ch-3 and draw dropped loop through (a starting pc st made), * ch 4, skip 2 d c, pc st in next d c—to make a pc st, ch 1, make 5 d c in same place, drop loop from book, insert hook in ch preceding the 5 d c and draw dropped loop through. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 4, sl st in tip of first pc st made. 3rd rnd: Ch 3 and complete a starting pc st in same place as sl st, * ch 3, d c in next sp, ch 3, pc st in tip of next pc st. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 3, sl st in tip of 1st pc st. 4th rnd: Ch 3 and complete a starting pc st in same place as sl st, * (ch 2, d c in next sp) twice; ch 2, pc st in tip of next pc st. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 2, sl st in tip of 1st pc st. 5th rnd: Ch 3, 7 d c in same place as sl st (this is base of pineapple), * (ch 2, d c in next d c) twice; ch 2, 8 d c in tip of next pc st. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 2, sl st in top of ch-3. 6th rnd: Ch 4, (d c in next d c, ch 1) 6 times; d c in next 2 d c, * ch 2, d c in next 2 d c, (ch 1, d c in next d c) 7 times; d c in next d c. Repeat from * around, ending with sl st in 3rd st of ch-4.

7th rnd: SI st in sp, ch 3 and complete a starting pc st in same place, (ch 1, pc st in next sp) 6 times; ch 2, skip next d c, d c in next d c, ch 2, d c in next d c, ch 2, skip next d c, (pc st in next sp, ch 1) 6 times; pc st in next sp. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 2, sl st in tip of 1st pc st made. 8th rnd: Sl st in sp, ch 3 and complete a starting pc st, * (ch 2, pc st in next sp) 5 times (6 pc sts in pineapple). * (Ch 2, d c in next sp) 3 times, (ch 2, pc st in next sp) 6 times. Repeat from * around (4 ch-2 sps between pineapples), ending with ch 2, sl st in tip of first pc st. 9th rnd: Work as for 8th rnd, having 5 pc sts in each pineapple, and 5 ch-2 sps between pineapples. 10th rnd: * Make 4 pc sts, (ch 2, d c in next sp) 3 times; ch 2, d c in same sp (increase sp made), ch 2, d c in next sp twice, ch 2. Repeat from * around. Join. 11th

to 13th rnds: Work as for 10th rnd, making 1 pc st less on each pineapple on each rnd, and working d c, ch 2 and d c in each increase sp. Join. 14th rnd: Sl st in next ch, s c in sp, ch 5, * d c in next sp, ch 2. Repeat from * to the increase sp, in increase sp make 3 d c, ch 2 and 3 d c; ch 2, d c in next sp. Continue in this manner around. Join with sl st to 3rd st of ch-5. Fasten off. Make necessary number of motifs and sew together on wrong side with neat over-and-over stitches (see diagram).

FRINGE... Make fringe in each sp around as follows: Cut 8 strands, each 12 inches long. Double these strands, forming a loop. Pull loop through sp and draw loose ends through loop. Pull tight. When fringe has been worked around all edges, trim evenly.

For Double Size Bed Only

MATERIALS:

J. & P. COATS BEDSPREAD COTTON

24 balls of White or Ecru

MILWARD'S STEEL CROCHET HOOK No. 7 or 8.

GAUGE:

4 sps or bls make 1 inch; 4 rows make 1 inch. Finished bedspread measures about 90 x 108 inches after blocking.

Starting at bottom of Chart One, make a chain (12 ch sts to 1 inch) about 3 yards long. 1st row: D c in 8th ch from hook, * ch 2, skip 2 ch, d c in next ch. Repeat from * until there are 359 sps made. Cut off remaining chain (mark the 180th sp with a colored thread—this is center). Ch 5, turn. 2nd row: (This is right side) D c in next d c (sp over sp), 11 more sps, * make a pc st in next sp—to make a pc st, ch 1, 5 d c in sp, drop loop from book, insert book in ch-1, and draw dropped loop through; d c in next d c. Repeat from * 8 more times; 11 sps, (5 pc sts, 7 sps) 11 times; (5 pc sts, 8 sps)

twice, (5 pc sts, 7 sps) 11 times; 5 pc sts, 11 sps, 9 pc sts, 12 sps. Ch 5, turn. 3rd row: Make 10 sps, (make a reverse pc st in next sp—to make a reverse pc st, work as for pc st, only inserting hook in ch-1 from back of work, thus raising pc st to right side; d c in next d c) twice; 9 sps, 3 reverse pc sts, 7 sps, (1 reverse pc st, 5 sps) 24 times; 2 reverse pc sts, 5 sps, 2 reverse pc sts, (5 sps, 1 reverse pc st) 24 times; 7 sps, 3 reverse pc sts, 9 sps, 2 reverse pc sts, 10 sps. Ch 5, turn.

Now follow chart, starting at 4th row, always working to center of row as on chart (chart shows only the first half of each row); then omitting the center sp or pc st-bl, as the case may be, follow chart back to the beginning of row. When 24th row has been completed, work as follows: Ch 5, turn. 25th row: 2 sps, 1 pc st, 2 sps, 5 pc sts, 9 sps, 1 pc st, 28 sps, make a bl over next sp—to make a bl, make 2 d c in sp, d c in next d c; 11 sps, 1 bl, 25 sps, 1 bl, 16 sps, 3 bls, 21 sps, 1 bl, 20 sps, 1 bl, 19 sps, 6 bls, 11 sps, 6 bls, 19 sps, 1 bl, 20 sps, 1 bl, 21 sps, 3 bls, 16 sps, 1 bl, 25 sps, 1 bl, 11 sps, 1 bl, 28 sps, 1 pc st, 9 sps, 5 pc sts, 2 sps, 1 pc st, 2 sps. Ch 5, turn.

Starting with 26th row, follow chart to top. Reverse chart and omitting last row, work back to "A" (this last row completes center design). Floral Borders are now worked from "B" toward top of chart; at the same time, keep continuity of popcorn all-over pattern and popcorn scallop design along edges until the 324th row is complete. Next row: Mark off the center 119 sps. Continue bedspread as before, following Chart Two when working across the center 119 sps. Continue thus, until top of Chart Two is reached. Work scallop design, floral borders and all-over pattern as before, until 408 rows are complete. Do not fasten off but work s c all around, keeping work flat. Fasten off. Block to measure 90 x 108 inches.

TO LAUNDER COTTON ARTICLES
... Before laundering, record all important measurements. Launder article in warm water, using a good neutral soap or soap flakes. Allow to dry thoroughly on a flat surface. Then block article, following Blocking Directions.

Simple Crochet Stitches

1... Chain (ch): Make a loop on hook, thread over and draw main length of thread through. Continue to draw thread through each new loop for length desired.

2...Single Crochet (s c): Insert hook under 2 loops of st, draw thread through (2 loops on hook), thread over, draw through both loops on hook.
3...Double Crochet (d c): Thread

over, insert hook in st and draw thread through (3 loops on hook); thread over, draw through 2 loops, thread over, draw through 2 remaining loops. Work Half Double Crochet (half

d c) like d c, but draw thread through all 3 loops at once.

4... Treble (tr): Thread over twice, insert hook in st and draw thread through (4 loops on hook); thread over and work off 2 loops at a time as for a d c. For a Double Treble (d tr), thread over 3 times; and for a Triple Treble (tr tr), thread over 4 times, working off 2 loops at a time as in the tr

5... Slip Stitch (sl st): Insert hook in st, catch thread and, with one motion, draw thread through both the st and the 1 loop on hook.

GENERAL INFORMATION

IMPORTANT... Be sure to buy at one time sufficient material of the same dye lot to complete the article you wish to make, as it is impossible to avoid slight variations in color in different dye lots.

GAUGE... Before starting your arti-

cle, make a small sample of the stitch or motif. If your working tension is too tight or too loose, use a finer or coarser needle, to obtain the correct gauge.

BLOCKING DIRECTIONS . . . Following measurements given, with rust-proof pins pin article right side down on a well padded flat surface. If article is too large for pressing table, block in sections of convenient size. Be sure to pin out all picots, loops, scallops, etc., along outside edges. Press through a damp cloth with a moderately hot iron (do not rest iron on decorative raised stitches). When thoroughly dry, remove pins.
