

CROCHETED SOAKERS No. 4303

Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" INFANT'S WOOL, Article W 5.

3-1 oz. Balls White.

Bone Crochet Hook No. 2.

Gauge: 3 patterns = 1 inch 6 rows = 1 inch.

WAIST BAND: Ch 11 and work 10 s c on ch, ch 1, turn. 2nd Row. Working in back loop of st only, 1 s c in each of the next 4 sts, ch 2, skip 2 sts (eyelet), 1 s c in each remaining st, ch 1, turn.

Next Row. Work 1 s c in each s c, working 1 s c in each ch of eyelet, ch 1, turn.

Next 2 Rows. Work even.

Repeat from 2nd row until waistband measures about 21 inches. Break yarn. Sew waistband together. Attach yarn at seam and work * 1 s c, 1 d c into waistband, repeat from * all around having 134 sts in row, ch 1, turn.

2nd Row. 1 s c in each d c and 1 d c in each s c, (pattern) ch1, turn.

3rd Row. Skip 1st 2 sts, (1 pattern decreased) and work 1 s c in each d c and 1 d c in each s c omitting the last pattern, ch 1, turn.

Next 2 Rows. Work even in pattern across each row.

Repeat last 3 rows until 2 sts remain, break yarn.

Turn point up and sew edges together for 5½ inches.

CORD: Crochet a ch about 20 inches long, s c in 2nd st from hook, * ch 1, skip 1 st, s c in next st, repeat from * across ch, break yarn. Lace cord through eyelets and finish with pompons.

KNITTED SOAKERS No. 4304

Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" KNITTING WORSTED, Article W 11.

 $3-1\frac{1}{4}$ oz. Skeins White.

1 pr. Bone Knitting Needles No. 6.

Gauge: 5 sts = 1 inch 8 rows = 1 inch.

Cast on 60 sts and work 4 rows of ribbing (K 2, P2).

HOUSE COAT No. 4306

1 to 11/2 Years

Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" INFANT'S WOOL, Article W 5.

8-1 oz. Balls, White, Baby Pink or Baby Blue.
1 Pr. each Bone Knitting Needles No. 1, No. 2 and No. 4.
Bone Crochet Hook No. 2.
1½ yds. Narrow Ribbon.
7 Pearl Buttons.

Gauge: 9 sts = 1 inch.

SLEEVES AND YOKE: On No. 1 needles, cast on 60 sts and work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 1½ inches. Purl 1 row increasing 10 sts spacing increases evenly. Change to No. 2 needles and work in following pattern.

1st Row. K across row.

2nd Row. Purl across row.

Repeat 1st and 2nd rows.

5th Row. * K 4, P 2, repeat from * across row ending with K 4.

6th Row. * P 4, K 2, repeat from * across row ending with P 4.

Repeat these 6 rows for pattern.

Work until sleeve measures about 10 inches or length desired from the beginning ending with the 6th row of pattern.

Next 2 rows. Cast on 6 sts at the beginning of each row and continue in pattern for about $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches working an added pattern on the 6 cast on sts and ending with the 6th row of pattern.

Next Row. Work across 1st 39 sts and place remaining 43 sts on a st holder. Continue work on front of yoke for about $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches binding off on the 3rd row of pattern.

Pick up sts from st holder, attach yarn, bind off 4 sts for neck and work back in pattern, for 5 inches ending with 6th row of pattern at neck edge, break yarn leaving sts on needle. On the free needle, cast on 39 sts and beginning with the 4th row of pattern work same as other front for $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches ending at lower edge of yoke with the 6th row of pattern.

Next Row. K across row, cast on 4 sts for neck and K across sts on other needle. Continue pattern across all sts for about $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches ending with the 2nd row of pattern.

Next 2 Rows. Bind off 6 sts at the beginning of each row and continue in pattern until sleeve measures same as 1st sleeve to ribbing ending with the 3rd row of pattern.

Next Row. Change to No. 1 needles and P across row decreasing 10 sts spacing decreases evenly, then finish sleeve with ribbing of K 2. P 2 for 1½ inches.

SKIRT: With right side of work toward you, with No. 4 needles pick up 32 sts across one front, 66 sts across back, 32 sts across other front. K 1 row.

Next Row. K 1, * Y O, K 2 together, repeat from * across row ending row with Y O, K 1.

Next Row. K 3, P to within the last 3 sts, K 3.

Next Row. K across row increasing in every other st. Repeat the last 2 rows, then work in stockinette st (K 1 row, P 1 row) until skirt measures 16 inches. Always K the first and last 3 sts at the beginning and end of each row for border.

Next 6 Rows. Work in garter st, (K each row) bind off.

With right side of work toward you, attach yarn at lower left corner of skirt, crochet a row of s c to neck, ch 1, turn and work 1 s c in each s c, ch 3, turn, * skip 2 s c, 1 s c in each of the next 4 s c, ch 3, (buttonhole) repeat from * 5 times, s c in next s c, then work a row of s c around neck drawing it in to measure about 11 inches, then continue a row of s c down right side of yoke and skirt, break yarn.

NECK EDGE: With right side of work toward you, attach yarn in left corner of neck edge, * skip 1 s c, 4 d c with ch 1 between each d c in next s c, skip 1 s c, s c in next s c, repeat from * around neck edge, break yarn. Finish with buttons. Lace ribbon through beading.

CROCHETED BABY SET No. 4307

Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" INFANT'S WOOL, Article W 5.

White or Baby Colors. Entire Set—5—1 oz. Balls. Jacket—3 Balls.

Bonnet—1 Ball.

Booties and Mittens-1 Ball.

Any of the following American Thread Company Products may be used for trim.

1-100 yd. Ball-"STAR" Rayon Crochet, Article 700.

1-250 yd. Ball-"SILLATEEN SANSIL", Article 101.

2- 60 yd. Balls-"SILLATEEN SANSIL", Article 102.

2- 60 yd. Balls-"STAR" Pearl Cotton, Article 90, Size 5.

Bone Crochet Hook No. 2 or No. 3.

Steel Crochet Hook No. 4 or No. 5.

JACKET No. 4307

BACK: With Bone hook ch 53, (about 10 inches) work 52 s c on ch, ch 1 to turn each row.

2nd Row. Insert needle in first s c, pull loop through, insert needle in next s c, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all 3 loops on needle, ch 1, * insert needle in next s c, pull loop through, insert needle in next s c, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all 3 loops on needle, ch 1, repeat from * 24 times.

3rd Row. Start pattern, insert needle in first st, pull loop through, insert needle under the ch 1, pull loop through having one thread between the last 2 loops, yarn over and pull through all loops on needle, ch 1, continue in same manner across row (26 patterns).

Repeat the 3rd row 28 times, do not break yarn. Attach yarn at opposite side, ch 30, break yarn.

Pick up the unbroken yarn and ch 31, turn.

32nd Row. Work 15 patterns on ch for sleeve, work in pattern across back and 15 patterns on the ch 30 for other sleeve. Work 16 more rows of pattern across sleeves and back, break yarn.

FRONT: Ch 27 and work 26 s c on ch, work 30 rows of pattern, then ch 31, turn.

32nd Row. Work 15 patterns on ch for sleeve, 1 pattern in each pattern across front.

Work 6 more rows of pattern even.

39th Row. Start shaping neck, skip the first pattern, 1 pattern in each remaining pattern.

40th Row. Work in pattern omitting the last pattern at neck edge. Repeat 39th and 40th rows twice, then work 4 rows even, break yarn.

Work other front in same manner.

Place the fronts in position and sew seams, being careful to match rows. With right side of work toward you, attach yarn at neck of left front, work 1 row of s c down front, working 1 s c in each row, ch 1, turn, work 2 more rows of s c even, break yarn.

Attach yarn at lower edge of right front, work 1 s c in each row to neck, ch 1, turn, 1 s c in first s c, * ch 2, (for buttonhole) skip 2 s c, 1 s c in each of the next 4 s c, repeat from * 5 times, then work 1 s c in each remaining s c of front, ch 1, turn, 1 s c in each s c with 2 s c over each ch 2. Without breaking yarn, work 17 s c up neck to shoulder, 14 s c across back of neck and 17 s c down left side of neck, ch 1, turn and work 2 more rows of s c around neck, break yarn.

Attach yarn at center of lower edge at back of jacket, work 1 s c in each st all around jacket working 2 s c in each corner at lower edge, join, break yarn.

Attach yarn at lower edge of sleeve and work 26 s c around edge for cuff. Work 2 more rows of s c even, break yarn and finish other sleeve in same manner.

EDGE: With steel hook, attach trim thread at back of jacket and work 1 s c in same space with joining, * 2 d c in next s c, 1 s c in next s c, repeat from * all around jacket, join, break thread.

Work around cuffs in same manner. Sew buttons in position.

BONNET No. 4307

Ch 2, 5 s c in first st of ch, (do not join s c rounds).

2nd and 3rd Rounds. 2 s c in each s c.

4th Round. * 1 s c in next s c, insert needle in same space with last st, pull loop through, insert needle in next st, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all loops on needle, ch 1, (this is an increase) repeat from * all around.

5th Round. 1 s c in each st and under the ch 1 of each pattern (30 s c).

6th Round. * 1 s c in each of the next 2 s c, work 1 pattern increasing the same as 4th round, repeat from * all around.

7th Round. 1 s c in each st and under each ch 1 of pattern. Work 4 more rounds following the 6th and 7th rounds, having 1 more s c between patterns, in each increasing round.

12th Round. Work in the back loop of st only, 1 s c in each st.





SURPLICE SWEATER No. 4308 6 Months

Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" WORSTED FLOSS, Article W 16.

3—1 oz. Balls Blue or any Color desired and "STAR" Six Strand Mercerized Embroidery Cotton. Article 50. 2 yds. each of Pink, Green and Yellow.

1 pr. Bone Knitting Needles No. 3.

2 Buttons, 2 Snap Fasteners.

BACK: Cast on 68 sts and work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 2 inches.

Change to stockinette st (K 1 row, P 1 row) and work even until work measures 6 inches from beginning.

Next 8 Rows. Cast on 7 sts at the beginning of each row for sleeves, then work even for 3 inches ending with the P row.

Next Row. K 51 sts and place on a stitch holder, bind off next 22 sts for back of neck, K remaining 51 sts.

Next Row. * P to within the last 4 sts. K the last 4 sts, turn.

Next Row. K 4, increase in next st, K to end of row. Repeat from * until sleeve measures 6 inches at wrist edge thus making a border of 4 sts and increasing in 5th st of each K row at neck edge.

Bind off 7 sts at sleeve edge every other row 4 times and continue increasing in every K row at front edge.

Work even at underarm and continue increasing at front

edge until front measures same as back to the ribbing, ending at front edge and having an even number of sts on needle.

Cast on 4 sts at front edge (band for fastener) and work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 2 inches, bind off.

Pick up sts from st holder and beginning at neck edge K 4, P across remainder of row.

Next Row. K to within the last 6 sts at neck edge, increase in next st, K 5.

Next Row. K 4, P across remainder of row. Repeat the last 2 rows until sleeve measures 6 inches at wrist edge. Bind off sleeve same as other sleeve and work remainder of front to correspond with opposite front always increasing in the 6th st from front edge in each K row, bind off.

CUFFS: Pick up 40 sts at lower edge of sleeve and work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 1½ inches, bind off.

Press work under a damp cloth.

Sew underarm and sleeve seams.

Crochet a row of s c around back of neck.

Fold right side over left side and crochet 2 loops on right side at waist line for buttonholes. Sew Buttons in position. Finish left side at waist line with snap fasteners. Embroider flowers in Pink using a lazy daisy stitch and having a Yellow French knot in center of each flower. Arrange as desired. The leaves are embroidered in Green using a lazy daisy stitch. Stems are embroidered in outline st.



SMOCKED SWEATER No. 4309

1½ years

Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" WORSTED FLOSS, Article W 16.

4-1 oz. Balls Pink.

10 yds. Contrasting Color for Smocking.

4 Pearl Buttons.

1 pr. each of No. 1 and No. 3 Bone Knitting Needles.

4 double pointed Knitting Needles No. 3.

Bone Crochet Hook No. 2.

Gauge: 7 sts = 1 inch 10 rows = 1 inch.

BACK: On No. 1 needles, cast on 76 sts, work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 1 inch. Change to No. 3 needles and work in stockinette st (K 1 row, P 1 row) until work measures 7 inches from beginning. Bind off 2 sts at the beginning of the next 2 rows. Decrease 1 st at the beginning of each row until there are 58 sts left on needle ending work with K row. Slip these sts on stitch holder. Work front same as back.

SLEEVES: On No. 1 needles, cast on 60 sts, work same as back until work measures 7 inches from beginning. Bind off 3 sts at the beginning of next 2 rows. Decrease 1 st at the beginning of each row until there are 34 sts left on needle ending work with K row. Slip these sts on a stitch holder.

Slip sts off stitch holders on three needles as follows: On first needle slip last 34 sts of back and 1 sleeve, on second needle slip the front sts, on third needle slip the remaining sleeve and remaining sts of back. Purl across 3 needles, increasing 1 st in row (185 sts), turn.

YOKE: * K 1, P 3, repeat from * across row ending with K 1, turn.

Next Row. * P 1, K 3, repeat from * across row ending with P 1, turn. Repeat the last 2 rows twice.

Next Row, * K 1, P 2 together, P 1, repeat from * across row ending with K 1.

Next Row. * P 1, K 2, repeat from * across row ending with P 1.

Next Row. * K 1, P 2, repeat from * across row ending with K 1. Repeat the last 2 rows twice.

Next Row. * P 1, K 2, repeat from * across row ending with P 1.

Next Row. * K 1, P 2 tog, repeat from * across row ending with K 1.

Next Row. * P 1, K 1, repeat from * across row ending with P 1.

Next Row. * K 1, P 1, repeat from * across row ending with K 1. Repeat last 2 rows twice, bind off.

Press each section. Sew side and sleeeve seams and underarm seams. Attach yarn at right top at back of neck opening and work a row of s c around opening, turn.

2nd Row. * Ch 3, skip 2 s c, s c in each of the next 2 s c (buttonhole), repeat from * 3 times, break yarn.

SMOCKING: Use a contrasting Color and start at lower edge of neck opening. Bring needle to left of 1st K rib of 1st row, insert needle to right of 2nd K rib of 1st row (passing needle over P sts) draw these 2 sts together tightly and work over them a second time bringing needle up to left of 2nd K rib of 5th row. Insert needle to right of 3rd K rib of 5th row and draw these 2 sts together in same manner bringing yarn down to left of 3rd K rib of 1st row. Insert needle to right of 4th K rib and draw sts together in same manner bringing yarn up to left of 4th K rib of 5th row. Insert needle to right of 5th K rib of 5th row. Insert needle to right of 5th K rib of 5th row. Continue in same manner across row.

Work 2 more rows of smocking in same manner about ½ inch apart. Work 1 row of smocking at top edge. Sew buttons in position.

Ready for the cold rush

KNITTED SET No. 4310

Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" INFANT'S WOOL, Article W 5.

14-1 oz. Balls are sufficient for entire set.

Each article if made separately requires:

Carriage Cover 8—1 oz. Balls
Sacque 4—1 oz. Balls
Cap 2—1 oz. Balls
Booties 1—1 oz. Ball
Mittens 1—1 oz. Ball

Any of the following American Thread Company Product may be used for trim.

4— 60 yd. Balls "SILLATEEN SANSIL", Article 102.
1—250 yd. Ball "SILLATEEN SANSIL", Article 101.
4— 60 yd. Balls "STAR" Pearl Cotton, Article 90, Size 5.
3—100 yd. Balls "STAR" Rayon Crochet, Article 700.
Steel Crochet Hook No. 9 for trim thread.

KNITTED CARRIAGE COVER No. 4310

1 Pr. Steel Knitting Needles No. 3.

Cast on 205 sts and work in garter st (K each row) until section measures 3 inches, then start pattern.

1st Row. K 25, * Y O, sl 1, K 1, P S S O, K 1, K 2 tog, Y O, K 1, repeat from * across row ending with K 24.

2nd Row. K 23, P across row to within last 23 sts. K 23.

3rd Row. K 26, * Y O, sl 1, K 2 tog, P S S O, Y O, K3, repeat from * across row ending with K 23.

4th Row. Repeat 2nd row.

Repeat from 1st row of pattern until work measures 29 inches, then work 3 inches in garter st, bind off.

Block and press.

With trim thread, work a row of shells all around cover having 105 shells down each side and 102 shells across top and lower edge. (Shell: ch 3, 2 d c in same space, skip 1 st, s c in next st). Embroider in French knots and lazy daisy flowers as illustrated.

KNITTED SACQUE No. 4310

1 Pr. Bone Knitting Needles No. 3.

Cast on 171 sts and work 6 rows in garter st, then start pattern.

1st Row. K 8, * Y O, sl 1, K 1, P S S O, K 1, K 2 tog, Y O, K 1, repeat from * across row ending with K 7.

2nd Row. K 6, P across row to within last 6 sts, K 6.

3rd Row. K 9, * Y O, sl 1, K 2 tog, P S S O, Y O, K 3, repeat from * across row ending with K 6.

4th Row. Repeat 2nd row.

Repeat from 1st row of pattern until work measures 6½ inches ending with last row of pattern, then divide sts for yoke. K across 56 sts, (right front) place remaining sts on a st holder, K 5 rows on the 56 sts.

Next Row. K across row to within last 6 sts, bind off 3 sts for buttonhole, K remaining sts.

In the following row, cast on 3 sts over the bound off sts and K across row. * K 10 rows, work a buttonhole in next row. Cast on 3 sts over the bound off sts in next row and repeat from *.

K 1 row, bind off 28 sts for neck, then K 4 more rows for

shoulder, bind off. Pick up 84 sts for back and K 33 rows, then K across 28 sts for shoulder, bind off next 28 sts for neck, then K 4 more rows for shoulder, bind off. Attach yarn and complete other shoulder. Pick up remaining sts and work left front same as right front to neck, (omitting buttonholes) bind off 3 sts for neck and complete shoulder. SLEEVES: Cast on 52 sts and K 6 rows, then work in

1st Row. K 2, * Y O, sl 1, K 1, P S S O, K 1, K 2 tog, Y O, K 1, repeat from * across row ending with K 2.

2nd Row. P across row.

pattern.

3rd Row. K 3, * Y O, sl 1, K 2 tog, P S S O, Y O, K 3, repeat from * across row ending with K1.

4th Row. Repeat 2nd row.

Repeat from 1st row of pattern until sleeve measures 7 inches, bind off.

Sew shoulder seams. Sew sleeve seams, sew sleeves in position and attach buttons.

COLLAR: With wrong side of work toward you, pick up 70 sts around neck. K 1 row increasing in every 5th st, then K 3 rows even. Increase in every 6th st in next row, then K 9 rows even, bind off. With trim thread, work a row of shells around collar. Embroider yoke as illustrated.

KNITTED CAP No. 4310

1 Pr. Bone Knitting Needles No. 3 and No. 1.

On No. 3 needles, cast on 100 sts and K 6 rows, then work in pattern same as sleeve of sacque for 6 inches ending with last row of pattern, bind off. Press, fold in half and sew seam.

On No. 1 needles, pick up 64 sts around lower edge and work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for ½ inch, bind off.

POMPON: Wind 75 times over 4 fingers, tie in center, trim into shape. Attach to top of cap.

CORDS: Cut 8 $1\frac{1}{2}$ yd. lengths of yarn, twist both ends, fold in half, hold ends and let twist itself. Attach to cap and finish ends with pompons.

(Wind yarn about 50 times over fingers.)

(If desired ribbon ties may be used and only 1-1 oz. Ball of yarn will be required for cap.)

Embroider front of cap as illustrated with trim thread.

LEGGING SUIT, CAP AND MITTENS No. 4311

6 Months to 1 Year

Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" KNITTING WORSTED, Article W 11

11-11/4 oz. Skeins Blue or any Color desired.

1 Pair each Bone Knitting Needles No. 3 and No. 4 and 4 double pointed Bone Knitting Needles No. 3 for Mittens. 9 Small Buttons.

Pattern requires a multiple of 6 sts plus 2.

1st Row. K 3, P 2, * K 4, P 2, repeat from * across row ending row with K 3.

2nd*Row. Purl across row.

3rd Row. P 2, * K 4, P 2, repeat from * across row.

4th Row. Purl across row.

Repeat these 4 rows for pattern.

LEGGINGS No. 4311

LEFT SECTION: Starting at waist, on No. 3 Needles, cast on 68 sts and work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 1 inch.

Next Row. * K 1, yarn over, K 2 tog, repeat from * across

row ending row with K 2, (beading) then work 1 more inch of ribbing.

Next Row. Start shaping back, K 2, P 2, K 2, turn, P 2, K 2, P 2, turn.

2nd Row. Work across 12 sts in same manner, turn and work back in ribbing to end of row.

3rd Row. Work across 18 sts in same manner, turn and work back in ribbing to end of row.

4th Row. Work across 24 sts in same manner, turn and work back in ribbing to end of row.

5th Row. Work across all sts in ribbing. Change to No. 4 needles.

Next Row. Start pattern and work $6\frac{1}{2}$ inches even in pattern.

Next Row. Decrease 1 st each side keeping pattern straight, then decrease 1 st each side every 3rd row 12 more times keeping pattern straight. Work 8 rows even. Work 3 inches even in ribbing of K 2, P 2.

Next Row. K across 27 sts, turn, K 14 sts, turn and K 14 rows on the 14 sts for instep.

Pick up and K 10 sts on side of instep just made and 13 sts on needle, turn, K 37 sts, pick up and K 10 sts on other side of instep and 13 sts left on needle, then K 8 rows even, bind off.

CHILD'S SWEATER No. 4312

2 Years

Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" INFANT'S WOOL, Article W 5.

5—1 oz. Balls Pink or any Color desired. 6 Buttons.

Bone Crochet Hook No. 2 or No. 3.

WAIST BAND: Ch 13, work 12 s c on ch, (ch 1 to turn each row throughout sweater).

2nd Row. Working in the back loop of st only, 1 s c in each s c. Repeat the 2nd row 116 times, (about 18 inches) do not break yarn, turn and work a row of s c over the long side of band, working 1 s c in each row increasing 6 times spacing increases evenly. (124 s c.)

2nd Row. 1 s c in first s c, 1 d c in next s c, * 1 s c in next s c, 1 d c in next s c, repeat from * to end of row. 3rd Row. Start pattern, 1 s c in 1st d c, 1 d c in next s c, * 1 s c in next d c, 1 d c in next s c, repeat from * to end of row. (62 patterns: 1 s c and 1 d c form a pattern). Start each row with an s c and end each row with a d c. Continue working the same as 3rd row until work measures 7½ inches from lower edge of band.

START RIGHT FRONT: Work over the first 15 patterns, ch 1, turn and work 9 more rows over the 15 patterns.

Next Row. Start decreasing for neck. Skip the first pattern at neck edge and work over the next 14 patterns.

Next Row. Work over 13 patterns omitting the last pattern at neck edge. Repeat the last 2 rows twice.

Next Row. Work back over the next 5 patterns, then 2 s c over each of the last 4 patterns, break yarn.

LEFT FRONT: Join yarn in 15th pattern from opposite side and work over the 15 patterns. Work 9 more rows over the 15 patterns.

Next 6 Rows. Decrease 1 pattern at neck edge each row.

Next Row. Work 2 s.c. over each of the next 4 patterns.


then work in pattern over the last 5 patterns, break yarn. **BACK:** Join yarn in 3rd pattern from right front and work in pattern leaving 2 patterns free between right and left front for underarm. (28 patterns.) Work 14 more rows over the 28 patterns.


Next Row. Work over 9 patterns for shoulder, ch 1, turn. Next Row. Work over the first 5 patterns, then 2 s c in each of the last 4 patterns, break yarn.

Next Row. Start decreasing, decrease 1 pattern at the beginning and end of row, then decrease 1 pattern at the beginning of each row until 4 patterns remain, break yarn. Work other sleeve in same manner,

JACKET No. 4313

Starting at neck, ch 61 and work 60 s c on ch, ch 1 to turn all s c rows.

2nd Row. 1 s c in each of the first 11 s c, (front) ch 1, puff st in next st (puff st: yarn over, insert needle in st, pull loop through, yarn over, insert needle in same st, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all loops but one on needle, yarn over and pull through remaining loops) ch 1, 1 s c in each of the next 6 s c, (shoulder) ch 1, puff st in next s c, ch 1, 1 s c in each of the next 22 s c, (back), ch 1, puff st in next s c, ch 1, 1 s c in each of the next 6 s c, (shoulder) ch 1, puff st in next s c, ch 1, 1 s c in each of the next 6 s c, (shoulder) ch 1, puff st in next s c, ch 1, 1 s c in each of the last 11 s c (front), turn.

3rd Row. 1 s c in each s c of front, 1 s c over the ch 1 of previous row, ch 1, puff st in puff st, ch 1, 1 s c over the ch 1, 1 s c in each s c of shoulder, 1 s c over the ch 1, ch 1, puff st in puff st, ch 1, 1 s c over the ch 1, 1 s c in each s c of back, 1 s c over the ch 1, ch 1, puff st in puff st, ch 1, 1 s c over the ch 1, 1 s c in each s c of shoulder, 1 s c over the ch 1, ch 1, puff st in puff st. ch 1, 1 s c over the ch 1, 1 s c in each s c of front. Work 14 more rows same as 3rd row.

18th Row. Start pattern, 1 s c in first s c, * puff st in next s c, 1 s c in next s c, repeat from * across front, then work 1 s c over the ch 1, 1 puff st, 1 s c, 1 puff st in next puff st, ch 1, skip the 36 s c of shoulder, 1 puff st, ch 1, 1 puff st in next puff st, 1 s c over the ch 1. * 1 puff st in next s c, 1 s c in next s c, repeat from * across back, then work 1 s c over the ch 1, 1 puff st, 1 s c, 1 puff st in puff st, ch 1, skip the 36 s c of shoulder, 1 puff st, 1 s c, 1 puff st in next puff st, 1 s c over the ch 1, continue in pattern across front (ch 1 to turn all rows starting with a puff st).

19th Row. Work in pattern, working a puff st in each s c and an s c in each puff st and a puff st over the ch 1 at underarm.

Work 19 more rows of pattern, then work 1 row of s c across lower edge, working 1 s c in each s c and each puff st. Work 2 more rows of s c even, break yarn.

SLEEVE: Attach yarn at underarm, 1 s c over the side of puff st, 1 s c over the ch 1, 1 s c in each of the 36 s c of shoulder, 1 s c over the ch 1, 1 s c over the side of puff st, join to the first s c with a slip st, ch 1, turn (40 s c). Work 29 more rows of s c over the 40 s c, joining each

row and turning each row. Finish sleeve with 1 row of pattern. Work other sleeve in the same manner.

NECK BAND: Attach yarn in front of neck edge, 1 s c in each of the first 11 sts, * skip the next st of shoulder, 1 s c in next st, repeat from * 3 times, work in s c across back decreasing 3 times (about every 6th st) decrease 4 times over shoulder, then work 1 s c in each s c of front, ch 1, turn. Work 2 more rows of s c even, then work 1 row of s c down front, working 1 s c in each row, ch 1, turn, 1 s c in each s c. On right front work 2 buttonholes at lower edge of yoke, (buttonhole: ch 2, skip 1 s c, 1 s c in each of the next 3 s c, ch 2, skip 1 s c) s c in each s c to neck edge, break yarn.

Work 2 rows of s c on left front in same manner omitting the buttonholes, break yarn. With right side of work toward you, attach yarn in center of back and work 1 row of s c all around the jacket, working 1 s c in each s c with 2 s c in each corner and 1 s c over the ch 2 of buttonholes, join, break yarn. Sew buttons in position, turn front back to form lapels and embroider as illustrated.

BONNET No. 4313

Starting at turnback, ch 61 (about 11½ inches) work 60 s c on ch, ch 1 to turn each row. Work 5 more rows of s c even.

7th Row. 1 s c in each of the first 4 s c, insert needle in next s c, pull loop through, insert needle in next s c, pull loop through and pull through both loops on needle, (thus decreasing 1 s c) * 1 s c in each of the next 8 s c, decrease 1 st, repeat from * 4 times, then work 1 s c in each of the last 4 s c, work 3 more rows of s c even.

11th Row. Work in puff st pattern same as jacket. Work 15 more rows of pattern even, break yarn.

Attach yarn in 10th pattern from side and work in pattern over the 9 center patterns. Work 12 more rows over the 9 patterns for back of bonnet, break yarn. Sew side seams. Attach yarn in first puff st row and work 27 s c across back of bonnet, work 9 s c in each side section and 9 s c in back section, ch 1, turn, work 1 s c in each of the 27 s c, work 2 more rows of s c decreasing 1 s c at the beginning of each row.

Finish by working I row of s c all around front of bonnet, working I s c in each row, I s c in each st and 2 s c in each corner of turnback, join, break yarn. Turn front back and embroider as illustrated. Attach ribbon for ties.

INFANT'S SHOULDERETTE No. 4315

Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" INFANT'S WOOL, Article W 5

2-1 oz. Balls.

"STAR" SIX STRAND MERCERIZED EMBROIDERY COTTON, Article 50

1 Skein each of Pink, Blue, Yellow, and Green. 1/2 Yd. Narrow Ribbon.

Bone Crochet Hook No. 2.

1 Pr. each of Bone Knitting Needles No. 1 and No. 3.

On No. 1 needles, cast on 44 sts and work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 1½ inches. Change to No. 3 needles and K 1 row increasing 1 st in each of the 1st 2 sts, then increasing 1 st in every other st (67 sts). Next row starts pattern.

1st Row. * K 1, P 1, repeat from * across row ending with K 1.

2nd Row. * P 1, K 1, repeat from * across row ending with P 1.

3rd Row. Same as 2nd row.

4th Row. Same as 1st row.

Repeat these 4 rows for 18 inches ending with 1st row of pattern.

Next Row. K across row decreasing 2 sts at the beginning of row, then decrease every other st across remainder of row (44 sts).

Change to No. 1 needles and work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 1½ inches, break yarn.

Sew ribbing together.

With wrong side of work toward you, attach yarn about 3 inches from ribbing and work a row of shells to within 3 inches of opposite cuff for collar, (shells: * ch 3, 2 d c in same st, skip 3 rows, s c in next row, repeat from * across row), break yarn. With right side of work toward you, attach yarn in the same space with 1st shell and work a row of shells around remainder of shoulderette. Fold collar back about 1 inch and with "Star" Six Strand Mercerized Embroidery Cotton, embroider sprays as illustrated. With Pink, work a rambler rose, start with a cross stitch for center and work about 3 rows of outline st around cross stitch. With Blue, embroider 1 flower of 5 French Knots with a Yellow French Knot center. With Green, embroider stems in outline stitch and leaves in lazy daisy stitch having leaves about 3% in. long.

Attach ribbon at each end of collar.



PUFF STITCH BUNTING No. 4316

Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" WORSTED FLOSS, Article W 16.

17-1 oz. Balls White or any Color desired.
1-1 oz. Ball Contrasting Color for Trim.
3 Yds. ½ inch Ribbon.
2½ Yds. 1 inch Ribbon.
2 or 3 Small Buttons.
Bone Crochet Hook No. 4.

With main Color, ch 186 (rather loosely), insert needle in 4th st from hook, pull loop up the length of a d c, yarn over, insert needle in same st, pull loop up the same length, yarn over, insert needle in same st, pull loop up the same length, yarn over and pull through all loops on needle, ch 1, skip 1 st of ch, s c in next st, * puff st in next st, (puff st: insert needle in st, pull loop up the length of a d c, yarn over, insert needle in same st, pull loop up the same length, yarn over needle in same st, pull loop up the same length, yarn over and pull through all loops on needle, ch 1), skip 1 st of ch, 1 s c in next st, repeat from * to end of ch, (61 puff sts) ch 2, turn.

2nd Row. Puff st in first s c, 1 s c over the 2 top loops

of puff st, * puff st in next s c, s c over the 2 top loops of next puff st, repeat from * 59 times, ch 2, turn. Repeat 2nd row until work is square.

Work 2 s c in first s c, 1 s c over puff st, * 1 s c in next s c, 1 s c over next puff st, repeat from * 59 times, then work 2 s c in same space with last s c, continue working down side in s c having the same number of sts at side as across top, 3 s c in corner st, work lower edge and opposite in the same manner, join.

BORDER: 1 puff st, 1 s c in same st with joining, 1 puff st, 1 s c in next s c, 1 puff st, 1 s c in next s c, continue even in puff st pattern all around increasing 3 times over the 3 corner sts, join, ch 2, turn.

2nd Round. Work in puff st pattern increasing twice over each corner. Work 4 more rounds of puff st pattern, increasing a sufficient number of times at corners to keep border flat, break yarn. Attach trim Color in s c, * ch 3, 2 d c in same st with ch 3, skip the puff st, s c in next s c, repeat from * all around, join, break yarn.

TRIANGLE FOR HOOD: Ch 67, (rather loosely) work a puff st in 4th st from hook, skip 1 st of ch, 1 s c in next st, * puff st in next st, skip 1 st of ch, 1 s c in next st, repeat from * 20 times, ch 2, turn.

Ch 15, 3 s c in 2nd st from hook, 1 s c in each of the next 12 sts, 3 s c in next st, working on opposite side of ch, 1 s c in each of the 12 sts, (do not join rounds).

2nd Round. 2 s c in each of the next 3 s c, 1 s c in each of the next 12 s c, 2 s c in each of the next 3 s c, 1 s c in each of the next 12 sc.

3rd Round. 2 s c in each of the next 6 s c, (toe) 1 s c in each of the next 12 s c, 2 s c in each of the next 6 s c, (heel) 1 s c in each of the next 14 s c.

4th Round. 2 s c in each of the next 9 s c, 1 s c in each remaining s c.

5th Round. 1 s c in each s c, join.

6th Round. Working in back loop of st only, 1 s c in each s c.

7th Round. Work in both loops of st. Count off the 18 toe sts, start decreasing, yarn over needle, insert in first of the 18 toe sts, pull loop through, insert needle in next st, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all loops but one on needle, yarn over and pull through remaining loops on needle, (puff st) 1 s c in each of the 14 toe sts, decrease with a puff st in the next 2 toe sts, 1 s c in each remaining s c all around.

8th Round. Yarn over, insert needle in puff st, pull loop through, insert needle in next s c, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all loops but one on needle, yarn over and pull through remaining loops, 1 s c in each of the next 12 toe sts, decrease with a puff st in the next s c and puff st, 1 s c in each remaining s c.

9th to 14th Rounds. Continue work decreasing at the toe in same manner having 2 less s c between decreases in each round.

15th Round. Work 1 puff st over the 2 puff sts, then continue in s c all around.

16th, 17th & 18th Rounds. Work even, working a puff st over puff st in each round, join the last round.

BEADING: Ch 3, skip 1 st, s c in next st, * ch 2, skip st, s c in next st, repeat from * all around, join.

19th Round. Work 2 s c over each ch 2, finish bootie with 3 rows of pattern same as jacket. Make another bootie in same manner. Draw ribbon through beading and embroider toe as illustrated.

MITTENS: Ch 30, join being careful not to twist ch. 1st Round. Ch 1, 1 s c in each st of ch, (30 s c) do not join rounds.

Work 5 more rounds of s c even.

7th Round. * 1 s c in each of the next 13 s c, insert needle in next s c, pull loop through, insert needle in next s c, pull loop through and pull through both loops on needle (thus decreasing 1 s c). Repeat from * once, then work 1 round even.

9th Round. * 1 s c in each of the next 12 s c, decrease 1 st, repeat from * once, work 1 round even.

11th Round. * 1 s c in each of the next 11 s c, decrease 1 st, repeat from * once, work 1 round even.

13th Round. * 1 s c in each of the next 10 s c, decrease 1 st, repeat from * once, work 1 round even.

15th Round. * 1 s c in each of the next 9 s c, decrease 1 st, repeat from * once, work 1 round even, (20 s c).

17th & 18th Rounds. Decrease 4 times in each round, break yarn, leaving an end long enough to draw together, thread a needle and sew on wrong side.

BEADING: Work same as on booties, then work 4 rounds of puff st, break yarn and work another mitten in same manner.

Draw ribbon through beading and embroider as illustrated.

20th Round. Start decreasing, work * 1 s c in each of the next 6 sts, insert needle in next st, pull loop through, insert needle in next st, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through the 2 loops on needle, repeat from * 7 times (8 decreases).

21st Round. Work in pattern even.

22nd Round. Decrease in every 6th and 7th st, then work 1 round of pattern even.

24th Round. Decrease in every 5th and 6th st, then work I round of pattern even.

26th Round. Decrease in every 4th and 5th st, then work 1 round of pattern even.

28th Round. Decrease in every 3rd and 4th st, then work 1 round of pattern even.

30th Round. Decrease in every 2nd and 3rd st, then work I round of pattern even, break yarn leaving a length about 12 inches for sewing.

HEAD: With White, work the first 9 rounds the same as body.

10th Round. 1 s c in each st, then work 1 round of pattern even. Repeat the last 2 rounds once.

14th Round. Start decreasing following the 24th to 31st rounds of body, break yarn leaving a 12 inch length for sewing.

LEGS: With Yellow, ch 2, work 8 s c in first st of ch, (foot).

2nd Round. 2 s c in each s c, then work 1 round of pattern even.

17th Row. Work in pattern even omitting the 10 neck patterns.

18th Row. Ch 1, turn, work in pattern omitting the 10 neck patterns.

34th Round. Work a row of s c all around working 1 s c in each s c and 2 s c in each pattern at neck.

35th Round. 1 s c in each s c.

36th Round. Work in pattern all around, break yarn.

RUFFLE: With right side of work toward you, attach yarn in the first free loop of the 29th row. Work in pattern increasing in each st, ch 1, turn.

37th Row. Work in pattern even, break yarn.

With steel hook, attach trim thread and work edge across ruffle following edge of jacket, break thread.

Attach trim thread in free loop of 11th round at back of bonnet, work in s c increasing 1 s c in every other st. Work 1 more round of s c even, break thread.

CORD FOR TIES: With 1 strand of yarn and 1 strand of thread, ch 65, break yarn.

POMPONS: Over a 1½ inch cardboard, wind wool and thread 40 times, slip from cardboard and tie around center, tie to one end of cord, trim to shape pompon. Form a circle at free end of cord about ¾ inch in diameter, tack in position and sew to bonnet.

Make tie for opposite side of bonnet in same manner.

BOOTIES No. 4307

Ch 15, 3 s c in 2nd st from hook, 1 s c in each of the next 12 sts, 3 s c in next st, working on the opposite side of ch, 1 s c in each of the next 12 sts, (join each round and ch 1 to start each round).

2nd Round. 1 s c in same space with joining, 2 s c in each of the next 2 s c, 1 s c in each of the next 12 s c, 2 s c in each of the next 3 s c, 1 s c in each of the next 12 s c.

3rd Round. 1 s c in same space with joining, 2 s c in each of the next 5 s c, (toe) 1 s c in each of the next 12 s c, 2 s c in each of the next 6 s c, (heel) 1 s c in each of the next 12 s c.

4th Round. 2 s c in next st from joining, 2 s c in each of the next 9 s c, 1 s c in each of the next 15 s c, * 2 s c in next s c, 1 s c in next s c, repeat from * 4 times, 1 s c in each of the last 13 s c, work 1 round even.

6th Round. Working in the back loop of st only, 1 s c in each s c.

7th, 8th and 9th Rounds. Work even in pattern same as jacket.

10th Round. Start decreasing by working 1 pattern over each of the 10 toe patterns omitting the ch 1, after each

pattern, continue in pattern around remainder of bootie working the ch l after each pattern.

11th Round. Work 5 patterns over the 10 toe patterns omitting the ch 1 after the first 4 patterns, continue working in pattern with the ch 1 after each pattern.

12th Round. Work 2 patterns over the first 4 toe patterns omitting the ch 1, continue in pattern with the ch 1 after each pattern.

13th, 14th, 15th & 16th Rounds. Work in pattern even.

17th Round. Work 2 s c in each pattern.

18th Round. (Beading): Ch 3, skip 1 s c, s c in next s c, * ch 2, skip 1 s c, s c in next s c, repeat from * all around, join in first st of ch 3.

19th Round. 2 s c over each ch 2, 1 s c in each s c.

20th & 21st Rounds. Work in pattern even, break yarn. Attach trim thread and work edge the same as jacket.

CORD FOR TIES: With 1 strand of yarn and 1 strand of thread, ch 35, break and draw ties through beading.

Pompons are made in the same manner as pompons for bonnet, attach to each end of cord.

Work another Bootie in same manner.

MITTENS No. 4307

Ch 30, (about 15 inches), join being careful not to twist ch, ch 1.

1st Round. 1 s c in each st of ch (30 s c).

Next 11 Rounds. Work in pattern (15 patterns in each round).

13th Round. * Insert needle under the next ch 1, pull loop through, insert needle under next ch 1, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all loops on needle, ch 1, repeat from * all around.

Work I more round the same as 13th round, break yarn leaving a length long enough to thread a needle and draw end together.

Attach yarn at top and work 1 s c in each st all around (30 s c).

BEADING, CUFFS, TIES AND POMPONS: Repeat from the 18th round of booties.

Work another mitten in same manner.

With White and bone crochet hook, ch 75, insert needle in 2nd st from hook, pull loop through, insert needle in next st, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all 3 loops on needle, ch 1, * insert needle in next st, pull loop through, insert needle in next st, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all loops on needle, ch 1, repeat from * 35 times (about 17 inches).

2nd Row. Start pattern, insert needle in first st, pull loop through, insert needle under the ch 1, pull loop through

2nd Round. Working in back loop of st only, 1 s c in each s c. (Do not join rounds or turn work.)

3rd Round. Working in both loops of st, 1 s c in each s c with 3 s c in center st of each corner.

4th Round. 1 s c in each s c with 3 s c in center st of each corner.

5th Round. 1 s c in each s c with 3 s c in center st of each corner.

Repeat the last 4 rounds 4 times, then repeat 2nd, 3rd and 4th rounds once, then work 1 row of pattern all around, break yarn.

EDGE: Attach trim thread in free loop of first round of s c, 1 s c in same space with joining, * 4 d c in next free loop, 1 s c in next free loop, repeat from * all around working 4 d c and 1 s c in each corner loop, join, break thread.

Repeat edge in the next 3 free loop rounds. In the last free loop round, work a ruffle as follows: Join yarn in loop and work 1 pattern, * insert needle in same space with last st, draw loop through, insert needle in next st, draw loop through, yarn over and pull through the 3 loops on needle, ch 1, repeat from * all around, ch 1, turn and work 1 more row of pattern even, break yarn. Attach trim thread and work edge all around.

Sew shoulder seams of sweater. Sew sleeve seam and sew sleeves in position. Attach yarn at right side at lower edge of waistband and work 1 s c in each of the 12 sts of waistband, then continue up front to neck working 1 s c in each row of pattern. (48 s c) ch 1, turn.

2nd Row. Work 1 s c in each of the 48 s c.

3rd Row. 1 s c in each of the first 4 s c, * ch 3, skip 3 s c, (buttonhole) 1 s c in each of the next 5 s c, repeat from * 4 times, then ch 3, skip 3 s c, 1 s c in remaining s c, ch 1, turn.

Next Row. Work 1 s c in each s c and 3 s c over each ch 3 of buttonhole, ch 1, turn, then work 1 more row of s c even, break yarn.

Attach yarn at opposite side and work 5 rows of s c in same manner omitting buttonholes, break yarn.

COLLAR: Starting at the right front, work 1 s c in each of the 5 rows of s c band, then work 13 s c to shoulder, work 2 s c over each pattern at back of neck, work 13 s c across left side and 5 s c over band, break yarn.

Attach yarn in 3rd s c of right side over buttonhole, work around neck working 1 s c in each s c omitting the last 2 s c, turn, work 1 more row of s c even.

Next Row. Work 1 s c in each of the first 2 s c, 2 s c in next s c, * 1 s c in each of the next 8 s c, 2 s c in next s c, repeat from * 5 times, 1 s c in each remaining s c having an even number of s c.

Work 1 more row of s c even. Finish collar with 5 rows of pattern, break yarn. Sew buttons in position.

KNITTED BOOTIES No. 4310

1 Pr. Knitting Needles No. 3.

Bone Crochet Hook No. 2.

Cast on 40 sts, K 6 rows and work in pattern same as sleeve of sacque until bootie measures 3 inches. K across 14 sts, place these sts on a st holder, K across next 12 sts, place remaining sts on a st holder.

Work back and forth on the 12 instep sts until instep measures 2 inches. Pick up 8 sts on side of instep, place the 14 sts from st holder on free needle and K across the 14 sts, then K across 34 sts, pick up 8 sts on other side of instep. Place remaining 14 sts from st holder on free needle and K across the 14 sts. K 16 rows, bind off. Sew sole and back seam. Crochet 2 chs about 15 inches long. Lace through top of bootie. With trim thread, embroider instep of each bootie as illustrated.

KNITTED MITTENS No. 4310

1 Pr. Bone Knitting Needles No. 3.

Work same as bootie until mitten measures 4 inches, then K 2 tog across row, bind off leaving an end, thread into needle and draw sts together. Sew side of mitten. Crochet 2 chs about 12 inches long and lace through top of mitten. With trim thread embroider cuff of each mitten as illustrated.

KNITTED SOAKERS No. 4304

Continued from Page 3

5th Row. * K 1, yarn over, K 2 tog, repeat from * across row.

Next Row. * K 2, P 2, repeat from * across row, then work 3 more rows of ribbing.

PATTERN: * K 1, P 1, repeat from * across row.

2nd Row. * P 1, K 1, repeat from * across row.

Repeat these two rows for pattern. Continue in pattern until work measures $6\frac{1}{2}$ inches from beginning, then work in ribbing for 5 inches.

Work in pattern for 5¼ inches, then work 4 rows in ribbing.

Next Row. Same as 5th row, then work 4 more rows in ribbing, bind off.

Press under a damp cloth. Fold in half and sew side seams together for about $6\frac{1}{2}$ inches.

CORD: Take 2 3½ yd. lengths of yarn, twist both ends, fold in half, hold both ends and let twist itself. Knot one end for a 1 inch tassel, lace through beading, then knot other end.

KNITTED SOAKERS No. 4305

Illustrated on Page 3

Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" KNITTING WORSTED, Article W 11.

2-11/4 oz. Skeins White.

1 pr. Bone Knitting Needles No. 7.

Gauge: 4 sts = 1 inch 7 rows = 1 inch.

Cast on 110 sts and work 3 rows of ribbing, (K 2, P2).

Next Row. * K 1, K 2 tog, yarn over, repeat from * across row ending row with K 2.

Next Row. * K 2, P 2, repeat from * across row, then work 2 more rows of ribbing.

Next Row. K across row decreasing 1 st at end of row.

The remainder of soaker is made in seed st of * K 1,

P 1, repeat from * to end of row decreasing 1 st at end of row.

Next Row. P 1, K 1 across row decreasing 1 st at end of row.

Continue in same manner decreasing 1 st at end of each row, keeping pattern straight until 1 st remains, break yarn. Press under a damp cloth. Sew waistband seam, then sew each side for about 5 inches.

CORD: Take 2 3½ yard lengths of yarn, twist both ends, fold in half, hold both ends letting it twist itself. Knot one end for a 1 inch tassel, lace through beading, then knot other end.

LEGGINGS No. 4311

RIGHT SECTION: Work ribbing and beading same as left section, then work the 5 rows of shaping for back same as left section.

6th Row. Work even in ribbing, ending on the right side.

Next Row. Start pattern and work same as left section, break yarn.

Sew front and back seams, then sew leg seams. Sew elastic for underfoot.

Crochet a ch about 1 yd. long. Lace through beading and finish with tassels.

SWEATER No. 4311

On No. 3 needles, cast on 50 sts and work in ribbing for 3 inches. Change to No. 4 needles and work in pattern same as leggings until work measures 9 inches from beginning, then increase 1 st each side every other row 4 times keeping pattern straight.

Next 2 Rows. Cast on 26 sts at beginning of each row for sleeves and work even in pattern for $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches.

Next Row. Work 48 sts, place these on a stitch holder, bind off next 14 sts for back of neck and work on remaining 48 sts for left front.

Next 3 Rows. Decrease 1 st at neck edge each row, then work 8 rows even.

Next 3 Rows. Increase 1 st at neck edge each row. Cast on 7 sts for front of neck and work even in pattern until sleeve measures $6\frac{1}{2}$ inches at wrist edge.

Bind off 26 sleeve sts and decrease 1 st every other row at underarm 4 times. Work even in pattern until front measures same as back to ribbing increasing 1 st in last row. Work ribbing same as back, bind off. Work other shoulder and front to correspond.

CUFFS: With No. 3 needles, pick up 30 sts at wrist edge and work in ribbing for 3 inches, bind off.

COLLAR: With No. 3 needles, pick up 72 sts around neck and work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for about 3 inches, bind off.

Sew sleeve and side seams.

With wrong side of work toward you, crochet 60 s c up left front of sweater, turn and work 1 s c in each s c, ch 1, turn.

Next Row. 1 s c in next s c, * ch 2 for buttonhole, skip 2 s c, 1 s c in each of the next 6 s c, repeat from * up front ending with 1 s c in last s c, ch 1, turn.

Next Row. 1 s c in each s c and 1 s c in each st of ch, break yarn.

Work 4 rows of s c on right front in same manner omitting the buttonholes. Sew buttons in position.

CAP No. 4311

On No. 4 needles, cast on 4 sts and work in ribbing of K 1, P 1.

2nd Row. Increase 1 st at beginning and end of row, then increase 1 st each end every 6th row until there are 14 sts on needle. Work 6 rows even, break yarn leaving work on needle. Cast on 4 sts on same needle and work a 2nd tab to correspond (both tabs on one needle in last row) do not break yarn, cast on 11 sts and work in ribbing across cast on sts and one tab, cast on 22 sts and work across 2nd tab, cast on 11 sts and work in ribbing across all sts until front measures 1½ inches.

Next Row. * K 4, P 2, repeat from * across row.

Next Row. P across row.

Next Row. K 1, * P 2, K 4, repeat from * across row ending row with K 3.

Next Row. P across row. Repeat the last 4 rows until pattern section measures 3 inches ending with the P row and decreasing 1 st in last row. The remainder of cap is worked in stockinette st (K 1 row, P 1 row).

Start shaping cap. 1st row. * K 5, K 2 together, repeat from * across row ending with K 1.

Next and every alternate row. P across row.

3rd Row. * K 4, K 2 together, repeat from * across row ending with K 1.

5th Row. * K 3, K 2 together, repeat from * across row ending with K 1.

7th Row. * K 2, K 2 together, repeat from * across row ending with K 1.

9th Row. * K 1, K 2 together, repeat from * across row ending with K 1.

11th Row. K 2 together across row, then P 1 row, break yarn leaving an end for sewing.

Thread into needle, slip remaining sts on yarn, draw together and fasten firmly. Press under a damp cloth. Sew back seam. Crochet a row of s c all around working a 4 ch loop at end of one tab for buttonhole. Sew button in position.

MITTENS No. 4311

On 3 needles, cast on 36 sts, (12-12-12) work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 1½ inches. K 4 rounds even.

Next Round. K 3, increase in next st, K 1, increase in next st, K remainder of round, then K 1 round even.

Next Round. K 3, increase in next st, K 3, increase in next st, K remainder of round, then K 1 round even.

Next Round. K 3, increase in next st, K 5, increase in next st, K remainder of round, then K 1 round even.

Next Round. K 3, place next 8 sts on a safety pin or thread for thumb, cast on 2 sts over thumb, K 7 sts, complete round, then K even until mitten measures 3\(^3/_4\) inches from beginning.

Next Round. * K 4, K 2 tog, repeat from * all around. K 1 round even.

Next Round. * K 3, K 2 tog, repeat from * all around and K 1 round even.

Next Round. * K 2, K 2 tog, repeat from * all around and K 1 round even.

Next Round. K 2 tog all around and K 1 round even, break yarn leaving an end. Thread yarn into a needle and draw the 9 sts together, fasten firmly on wrong side.

THUMB: Pick up and K the 8 thumb sts, 1 st on each side of cast on sts and 2 cast on sts, (12 sts in all) arrange on 3 needles and K even for 1½ inches.

Next Round. K 2 tog all around, K 1 round even, break yarn leaving an end and finish same as top of mitten. Work other mitten in same manner.

2-PIECE SUIT No. 4301

1 to 1½ Years

Illustrated on Cover

Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" WORSTED FLOSS, Article W 16.

6-1 oz. Balls Blue.

1 pr. each of Bone Knitting Needles No. 1 and No. 3. Bone Crochet Hook No. 2.

½ yd. Elastic.

Gauge: 7 sts = 1 inch 10 rows = 1 inch.

PANTS No. 4301

On No. 1 needles cast on 76 sts and work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 1 inch. Change to No. 3 needles and continue in stockinette st (K 1 row, P 1 row).

Work next 2 rows even.

Next 9 Rows. Increase 1 st at the beginning and end of each row, then work even until work measures 3 inches from beginning.

Next Row. Decrease 1 st at each side. Decrease 1 st each side every ½ inch 6 times, then decrease 1 st each side every inch twice. When work measures 8½ inches from the beginning, ending with P row, K 38, turn, P back, K 28, turn, P back, K 18, turn, P back, K 8, turn, P back, (back of pants), then work across all sts in ribbing for 1½ inches, bind off.

Work other leg to correspond reversing the shaping as follows: P 38, K back, P 28, K back, P 18, K back, P 8, K back, finish same as other leg.

Press each section. Sew front and back seams to crotch. Sew leg seams together.

CASING FOR ELASTIC: Attach yarn at inside of waistband, * ch 5, sl st in next rib ½ inch below, ch 5, sl st in next rib ½ inch above, repeat from * all around, break yarn.

SWEATER No. 4301

BACK: On No. 1 needles, cast on 76 sts and work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 1½ inches. Change to No. 3 needles and work in pattern as follows:

1st Row. * K 1, P 1 repeat from * across row.

2nd Row. K across row.

Repeat these 2 rows until work measures $7\frac{1}{2}$ inches from beginning.

Next 2 Rows. Bind off 4 sts at the beginning of each row, then decrease 1 st each side of every other row 3 times being careful to keep pattern straight. Continue to work even in pattern for $3\frac{3}{4}$ inches from first decreasing point ending on right side of work.

Next Row. Bind off the 1st 18 sts, work the next 26 sts and slip on a stitch holder, bind off the remaining 18 sts, break yarn.

FRONT: Work same as back to armhole, shape armhole same as back until work measures 3 inches from 1st decreasing point ending on wrong side of work.

Next Row. K the 1st 18 sts, turn. Work even in pattern on these 18 sts for 7 rows, bind off, break yarn. Slip the next 26 sts on stitch holder for neck.

Work remaining 18 sts in same manner as other side.

SLEEVES: On No. 1 needles cast on 48 sts and work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 1½ inches. Change to No. 3 needles and work 2 rows in pattern.

Next 2 Rows. Increase 1 st each side of each row, then increase 1 st each side every 12th row 4 times. Work even in pattern until work measures 7½ inches from beginning.

Next 2 Rows. Bind off 4 sts at the beginning of each row.

Next Row. Decrease 1 st each side, then decrease 1 st each side every 3rd row 8 times.

Next 2 Rows. Bind off 8 sts at the beginning of each row, then work even for $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches on the 16 sts ending on wrong side of work.

Slip sts on stitch holder.

Press each section. Sew front and back together. Sew sleeve seams.

NECK BAND: On No. 1 needles, sl 26 sts from back, 16 sleeve sts, pick up 7 sts along side of neck front, the 26 center front sts, pick up 7 sts along other side of neck front and the 16 sleeve sts.

Next Row. K across row, then work in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 6 rows, bind off loosely and seam. Sew shoulder section of sleeve to the 18 bound off sts of shoulder of front and back, sew remainder of sleeve to armhole.

CARDIGAN No. 4302

 $1\frac{1}{2}$ -2 years

Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "DAWN" WORSTED FLOSS, Article W 16.

4-1 oz. Balls Blue or any Color desired.

1 pair Bone Knitting Needles No. 3.

6 Buttons.

Gauge: 7 sts = 1 inch 10 rows = 1 inch.

BACK: Cast on 72 sts and K 10 rows.

Next Row. P across row, then work in stockinette st of K 1 row, P 1 row until back measures 8 inches from beginning.

Next 2 Rows. Bind off 2 sts at beginning of each row.

Next 2 Rows. Bind off 1 st at beginning of each row, then work even until armhole measures 3 inches from 1st decreasing point ending on the right side. K 7 rows even, bind off.

RIGHT FRONT: Cast on 40 sts and K 4 rows.

Next Row. K 2, bind off next 2 sts for buttonhole, K across remainder of row.

Next Row. K across row casting on 2 sts over the 2 bound off sts. K 5 rows even.

Next Row. P 35, K 5. Always keep the 5 sts at front edge K sts for border.

Next Row. K across row. Repeat the last 2 rows twice.

Next Row. P 7, K 22, P 6, K 5.

Next Row. K across row.

Next Row. ** P 7, * K 2, P 2, repeat from * 4 times, K 2, P 6, K 5.

Next Row. K across row. Repeat from ** 7 times but working a buttonhole at front edge every 15% inches.

Next Row. * P 7, K 2, P 2, K 2, P 10, K 2, P 2, K 2, P 6, K 5.

Next Row. K across row. Repeat from * once.

Next Row. * P 7, K 2, P 18, K 2, P 6, K 5.

Next Row. K across row. Repeat from * once.

Work even in stockinette st always knitting the 5 sts at front edge for border and working a buttonhole every 15/8 inches until work measures 8 inches from beginning.

Next Row. Bind off 2 sts at armhole edge and work 1 row even.

Next Row. Bind off 1 st at armhole edge and work even until armhole measures 23/4 inches from 1st decreasing point ending on the wrong side.

Next Row. Bind off 12 sts loosely for front of neck, and work 1 row even.

Next Row. * Decrease 1 st at neck edge, and work 1 row even. Repeat from * once.

Next Row. Decrease 1 st at neck edge, then K 7 rows even, bind off.

LEFT FRONT: Cast on 40 sts and K 10 rows.

Next Row. K 5, P across remainder of row. Work to correspond with right front omitting the buttonholes at front edge.

Press under a damp cloth.

Sew shoulder seams leaving 22 sts free at back of neck.

SLEEVES: With right side of work toward you, pick up 56 sts around armhole and work even in stockinette st for 2 inches.

Next Row. Decrease 1 st each side, then decrease 1 st each side every inch 5 more times (44 sts left). Work even until sleeve measures 8 inches, then work in ribbing of K2, P 2 for $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Work other sleeve to correspond.

COLLAR: With wrong side of work toward you and leaving the front border free, pick up 67 sts around neck.

Next Row. K 3, * P 5, K 2, repeat from * 7 times, P 5, K 3.

Next Row. K across row. Repeat the last 2 rows 8 times, then K 3 rows even, bind off. Sew sleeve and side seams. Sew buttons in position.

PUFF STITCH BUNTING No. 4316

Continued from Page 17

2nd Row. Skip the first s c, 1 s c over the puff st, thus decreasing 1 puff st, * 1 puff st in next s c, 1 s c in next puff st, repeat from * across row. (21 puff st patterns) ch 2, turn. Continue working the same as 2nd row, having 1 less puff st in each row until 1 puff st remains, break yarn.

BORDER: Attach yarn at lower corner and work 24 s c up one side of triangle, 3 s c over the last puff st made, 24 s c down opposite side of triangle, ch 2, turn.

2nd Row. Puff st in first s c, s c in next s c, * puff st in next s c, s c in next s c, repeat from * 10 times, * puff st in next s c, s c in same st, repeat from * twice, then work 12 puff st patterns down opposite side, ch 2, turn.

3rd Row. Puff st in first s c, s c in next puff st, * puff st in next s c, s c in next puff st, repeat from * 11 times, 1 puff st, 1 s c in next s c, puff st in next puff st, 1 s c, 1 puff st in next s c, continue even down opposite side.

Work 2 more rows of puff st pattern even, do not break yarn. Working across front of triangle for turn back, work a row of puff st patterns, ch 2, turn. Work 3 more rows of pattern even, break yarn.

Attach trim Color at end of turn back, ch 3, 2 s d c in same space with ch 3, (s d c: yarn over, insert needle in st, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all three loops on needle), skip the puff st, s c in next s c,

* ch 2, 2 s d c in same space with ch 2, skip the puff st, s c in next s c, repeat from * across front, break yarn.

To make Bunting: Sew the 2 sides of triangle to one corner of bunting at last row of puff st border, leaving the front edge of hood free, turn this edge back at border.

At lower edge of bunting, measure 24 inches on each side from corner and place markers, fold bunting so corner meets markers and lace with ½ inch ribbon through both sections at each side directly under the scallop. Measure about 12 inches from lower edge of hood for shoulder edge. Fold bunting at this point and lace the 2 sections together with ½ inch ribbon, fold opposite shoulder side in same manner.

At top of bunting in back, measure about $6\frac{1}{2}$ inches from each side of point on inside of border, place markers and lace $\frac{1}{2}$ inch ribbon from 1 marker to the other, tie in back to shape hood.

Sew 2 or 3 small buttons in front, sew 1 inch ribbon to bonnet for ties and trim with bows as illustrated.

4th Round. * 1 s c in next st, 2 s c in next st, repeat from * all around.

5th Round. Work in pattern even.

6th Round. 1 s c in each st, then work 1 round of pattern even.

8th Round. Work in s c, decreasing in every 2nd and 3rd st, then work 1 round of pattern even.

10th Round. Work the same as 8th round.

11th to 19th Rounds. Work in s c, working in the back loop of st only, break yarn. Work another leg in the same manner.

WINGS: With Yellow, ch 17, work 16 s c on ch, ch 1, turn. Working the remainder in back loop of st only, 1 s c in each of the next 15 sts, ch 3, turn, 1 s c in first st of ch 3, 1 s c in each of the next 5 s c, * ch 1, turn. 1 s c in each of the next 4 sts, ch 3, turn, 1 s c in the first st of ch 3, 1 s c in each of the next 4 s c, 1 s c in each of the next 2 s c on base, repeat from * 4 times, break yarn. Work 3 more wing sections in same manner.

BILL: With Yellow, ch 7, work 6 s c on ch, ch 1 to turn each row. Work 3 more rows of s c even, then decrease 1 st at the beginning of each row until 2 sts remain. Work 1 row of s c all around, break yarn. Work 1 more section in same manner.

HAT: With Yellow, work same as first 7 rounds of leg, then work 1 round of s c even, join, ch 1, turn.

9th Round. * 1 s c in next st, 1 d c in next st, ch 1, repeat from * all around.

10th Round. * 1 s c in next s c, 1 s c in next d c, 1 s c under the ch 1, repeat from * all around, break yarn.

To assemble Duck: Fill body, head and legs with Cotton or Kapok. Thread the 12 inch length of wool of body into needle and draw top together. Thread the 12 inch length of head into needle and draw together, then sew the head to body. Sew the top of legs, place them in position and sew to body as illustrated. Place two sections of wings at each side of body and sew in position. Sew the 2 sections of bill in position. Sew 2 small buttons for eyes. Sew hat in position. With White, ch 50, break yarn and tie around hat.
