General Information

GAUGE... Before starting your article, make a small sample of the stitch or motif. If your working tension is too tight or too loose, use a finer or coarser needle to obtain the correct gauge.

Before laundering, record all important measurements. Launder article in warm water, using a good neutral soap or soap flakes. Do not use bleaching solutions! Allow to dry thoroughly on a flat surface. Then block article, following Blocking Directions.

rust-proof pins, pin individual pieces right-side-down on Turkish towels. Press with a hot iron through a damp cloth. When thoroughly dry, remove pins.

straight pins, a large square of cardboard with a tall heavy glass turned upside down in the center of it. Then, in a pot large enough to hold crocheted pieces, mix ½ cup of water with 1 cup of sugar. Boil for 2 minutes. Put pieces into mixture and boil for 2 more minutes, stir-

ring continually to insure even distribution of syrup through pieces. Remove pieces. Pull basket over glass and pin points to cardboard. Let stand until almost dry but still flexible enough to mold into shape. Shape basket as in illustration or as desired. Allow to dry thoroughly. Handle is stretched flat and dried. If desired, run a wire through handle before sewing to basket. Run ribbon through handle and sew rosette in place.

starching . . . Starch the article, pin out on a padded surface following original measurements and outline. Press through a dry cloth and remove pins when article is dry. The stiffness of the starched article is governed by individual taste. Following directions on packaged starch and experimenting will bring desired results.

IMPORTANT... Be sure to buy at one time sufficient material of the **same dye lot** to complete the article you wish to make, as it is impossible to avoid slight variations in color in different dye lots.

Repeat instructions in parentheses as many times as specified. For example: "(K 1, O, p 3) 4 times" means to make whatever is in parentheses 4 times in all. Also "(Ch 5, sc in next sc) 5 times" means to make all that is in parentheses 5 times in all.

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Sachets

No. 4008 A-B

Leaf Sachet A

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. "BRILLIANT," 1 ball for each sachet.

Steel crochet hook No. 10. 1/4 yard ribbon, 3/8 inch wide. A piece of satin 3 x 6 inches

LEAF (Make 2) . . . Starting at center, ch 35. 1st row: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, ch 3, sc in same place as last sc; now working along opposite side of foundation ch, make sc in each ch across to last 4 sc, do not work in last 4 sts (this end is tip of leaf). Ch 5, turn. Hereafter work only in the back loop of each sc. 2nd row: Sc in each sc across to the ch-3, in ch-3 loop make sc, ch 3 and sc (this end is base of leaf); sc in each sc across to last 4 sc. Ch 5, turn. Repeat the 2nd row 8 more times. Now work sc in each sc across to ch-3 loop at base of leaf, sl st in loop. Fasten off. Make another piece same as this. Place leaves together matching corresponding parts and sew along edges, leaving ch-5 loops free and stuffing with cotton and sachet before opening becomes too small. Now work over corresponding loops of both leaves as follows: Attach thread to 1st 2 loops (one of each leaf), thus joining loops together, ch 3, dc in same place, ch 5, holding back on hook the last loop of each dc, make 2 dc in same place, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster made), and continue making cluster, ch 5 and cluster in each set of corresponding loops along edge at tip of leaf. Fasten off. Cut ribbon in half and run one piece through cluster edging at tip and tack ends to back. If desired ribbon rosebuds may be added. Form a loop with remainder of ribbon and fasten to base of leaf.

Square Sachet B

TOP... Starting at center, ch 6. Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: Ch 5, (dc in ring, ch 2) 7 times. Sl st in 3rd st of ch-5 (8 sps). 2nd rnd: Ch 1, sc in same place as sl st, * ch 4, sc in 3rd ch from hook (a ch-3 p made), ch 2, ch-3 p, ch 1, sc in next dc. Repeat from * around, ending with sl st in 1st sc made. 3rd rnd: Sl st in next 2 sts, sl st in loop (between p's), ch 3, in same loop make 2 dc, ch 5 and 3 dc; * ch 3, sc in next loop, ch 3, in next loop make 3 dc, ch 5 and 3 dc. Repeat from * around. Join last ch-3 to 3rd st of 1st ch-3. 4th rnd: Sl st in next 2 dc and in ch-5 loop, ch 3, in same loop make 2 dc, ch 5 and 3 dc; * ch 2, p, ch 2, sc in next sp, the following sc and in the next sp; ch 2, p, ch 2, in next ch-5 loop make 3 dc, ch 5 and 3 dc. Repeat from * around. Join. 5th rnd: Sl st in next 2 dc and in loop, ch 3, in same loop make 2 dc, ch 5 and 3 dc; * ch 2, p, ch 2, sc in next sp (preceding the p), ch 1, p, ch 2, p, ch 1, sc in next sp (following the p), ch 2, p, ch 2, in next loop make 3 dc, ch 5 and 3 dc. Repeat from * around. Join and fasten off. Now work petals to form rosette as follows: 1st rnd: Attach thread to any ch-2 sp of 1st rnd of Top, * ch 5, sc in next sp. Repeat from * around (8 loops). 2nd rnd: In each loop make sc, h dc, 5 dc, h dc and sc. Sl st in 1st sc. Fasten off.

Work under side of sachet cover same as top, omitting rosette at center. With satin make and stuff a sachet about 21/4 inches square. Place pieces with wrong sides together and join them by working over corresponding parts of both pieces as follows: Attach thread to corner loop (2 loops together), ch 7, sc in 3rd ch from hook, in same loop make 6 tr with p between, * ch 3, sc in next sp preceding the p's, ch 3, in next loop between p's make 6 tr with p between; ch 3, sc in next sp following the p's, ch 3, in next corner loop make 7 tr with p between. Repeat from * around, inserting sachet before opening becomes too small, complete rnd and fasten off.

Small Pincushion No. 4012

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 30, 1 ball of Self-shading or Variegated color.

Steel crochet hook No. 10. 1/2 yard narrow ribbon.

TOP . . . Starting at center, ch 2. 1st rnd: In 2nd ch from hook make sc, h dc and 15 dc. Do not join rnds. Hereafter work only in the back loop of each st, work dc's around, increasing 12 dc in each rnd—to inc a dc, make 2 dc in 1 st—until there are 77 dc in rnd. Next 2 rnds: Dc in each dc around without increasing, ending with h dc in next st, sc in next st, sl st in next st. Fasten off. Lay this piece aside.

BOTTOM . . . Make another circular piece as before but working in both loops of each st, until there are 77 dc in the rnd, h dc in next st, sc in next st, sl st in next st. Do not fasten off, but work edging as follows: 1st rnd: Ch 5, * dc in next st, ch 7, skip 5 sts, dc in next st, ch 2. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 7, sl st in 3rd st of 1st ch-5. 2nd rnd: SI st in next 2 ch and the following dc, * 9 sc in ch 7 sp, ch 5. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 5, sl st . in 1st sc. 3rd rnd: * Sc in next 7 sc, ch 5, sc in next loop, ch 5, skip 1 sc. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 5, sl st in 1st sc. 4th rnd: * Sc in next



Crochet has the answers

Large Pincushion No. 4018

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 50, 1 ball.

Steel crochet hook No. 11.

A small piece of silk for lining, and cotton batting for stuffing.

Starting at center, ch 9, join with sl st into a ring. 1st rnd: Ch 5, (dc in ring, ch 2) 11 times; join with sl st to 3rd st of ch-5 (12 sps). 2nd rnd: * Ch 10, sc in next dc. Repeat from * around (12 loops). 3rd rnd: In next loop make sc, h dc, dc and 8 tr (this completes half of petal and brings work to center of loop), then ch 5, sc in 5th ch from hook (p made). Make 2 more p's, then ch 13, sc in 5th ch from hook (thus making a small ring), turn. * (Ch 5, sc in ring) 3 times (3 loops made); turn. In each of these 3 loops make sc, h dc, dc, 8 tr, dc, h dc, and sc (leaf made). Ch 18, sc back in 14th ch from hook, then make 25 sc in ring just formed and join with sl st to 1st sc. Ch 4, sc in ch st just above 3rd p made. Make 3 p's as before, sl st in st just below 1st p made. Working in same ch-10 loop as before, complete petal by making 8 tr, dc, h dc and sc. In next loop make sc, h dc, dc and 8 tr; make 3 p's as before, ch 4, join with sl st to center sc of 25-sc ring, ch 9, sc in 5th ch from hook, turn. Repeat from * around, joining last 25-sc loop to center of 1st ch-13. Fasten off.

Compacts No. 4007 A-B

Round Cover A

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. "BRILLIANT," 1 ball for each compact cover.

Steel crochet hook No. 10.

Starting at center, ch 6. Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: Ch 1, 10 sc in ring. Sl st in 1st sc made. 2nd rnd: Ch 4, 4 tr in same place as sl st, drop loop from hook, insert hook in 4th st of ch-4 and draw dropped loop through (pc st made); * ch 5, 5 tr in next sc, drop loop from hook, insert hook in ch preceding 1st tr of 5-tr group, and draw dropped loop through (another pc st made). Repeat from * around, ending with ch 4; sl st in tip of 1st pc st made. 3rd rnd: SI st in next sp, ch 3, 4 dc in same sp; make 5 dc in each remaining sp around. Join with sl st in 3rd st of ch-3. 4th rnd: Picking up only the back loop of each dc, make dc in each st around, increasing as necessary to keep work flat. Join. Repeat 4th rnd until piece measures $\frac{1}{2}$ inch less than surface of compact. Now work a rnd of pc sts as before, skipping 1 dc between pc sts and having ch 3 (instead of ch-5) between. Fasten off. Make another piece same as this. Sew pieces together along outer edges with neat over-and-over sts, leaving an opening large enough for compact.

Square Cover B

Starting at center, ch 6. Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: Ch 1, 12 sc in ring. Sl st in 1st sc made. 2nd rnd: Ch 3, in same place as sl st make dc, ch 2 and 2 dc; * dc in next 2 sc, in next sc make 2 dc, ch 2 and 2 dc. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st in top of 1st ch-3. 3rd rnd: Sl st in next dc, * 3 sc in sp, make an sc behind next dc as follows: Insert hook in sp from back to front of work, pass hook over next dc and insert hook between next 2 dc from front to back of work, thread over and draw loop through, and finish as for an

sc. Make an sc behind each dc across to next sp. Repeat from * around. Sl st in 1st sc made. 4th rnd: Sl st in next sc, ch 3, in same place as last sl st make dc, ch 2 and 2 dc; * dc in each st across to within center sc of 3-sc group; in this sc make 2 dc, ch 2 and 2 dc. Repeat from * around. Join. Repeat the 3rd and 4th rnds alternately until piece measures same as size of compact, ending with the 3rd rnd. Fasten off.

Make another piece same as this. Sew crocheted pieces along edges of 3 sides, leaving the remaining side open.

Sewing Kit No. 4013

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O. N. T. or J. & P. COATS PEARL COTTON, size 5, 1 ball.


Steel crochet hook No. 6. 1/2 yard narrow ribbon.

1st rnd: Starting at center, ch 2, 8 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Sl st in 1st sc made. Ch 1, turn. 2nd rnd: 3 sc in same st where sl st was made, * sc in back loop of next st, 3 sc in next st (working over both loops). Repeat from * around, ending with sl st in back loop of 1st 2 sc. Ch 1, turn. 3rd rnd: Working over both loops, make 3 sc in same st where sl st was made, * sc in back loop of each st to center sc of next 3-sc group, 3 sc in next sc (working over both loops). Repeat from * around, ending rnd as before. Ch 1, turn. Repeat the 3rd rnd until piece measures 5 inches square. Fasten off.

points to the center of piece. Sew adjoining sides together, thus forming a pouch. Sew a 12-inch length of ribbon to point of flap. Sew remaining 6-inch piece of ribbon to bottom of pouch. Stick needles and pins through a piece of felt and put in pouch. Complete contents of pouch with an assortment of thread and a thimble.

Child's Dress Sizes 4-6 MATERIALS: No. 5191 A

J. & P. COATS KNIT-CRO-SHEEN:
Size 4—3 balls of White or Ecru, or
4 balls of color. Size 6—1 ball extra.
Steel crochet hooks No. 7 and No. 2.
1½ yards narrow velvet ribbon.
4 small pearl buttons.

GAUGE: 2 shells make 1½ inches; 4 rnds of shells make 1½ inches.

Sizes 4 and 6

Starting at neck with No. 7 hook, ch 115 to measure 14½ inches. 1st row: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, * ch 3, skip 2 ch, sc in next ch, ch 3, skip 1 ch, sc in next ch. Repeat from * across, ending row with ch 3, skip 2 ch, sc in last ch (45 loops). Turn. 2nd row: Sl st in 1st loop, ch 5, dc in same loop (shell), * ch 1, skip next loop, make 11 d tr in next loop, ch 1, skip 1 loop, in next

loop make dc, ch 2 and dc (shell). Repeat from * across. Turn. 3rd row: Sl st in 1st ch-2 sp, ch 5, dc in same sp (shell over shell), * ch 2, skip 1 d tr, (dc in next d tr, ch 1) 8 times; dc in next d tr, ch 2, in next ch-2 sp (between dc's) make dc, ch 2 and dc (shell over shell). Repeat from * across. Turn. 4th row: Sl st in ch-2 sp, shell over shell, * ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp (between dc's); (ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp) 7 times; ch 3, shell over next shell. Repeat from * across. Turn. 5th row: SI st in sp, shell over shell, * ch 3, skip ch-3 below, sc in next loop, (ch 3, sc in next loop) 6 times; ch 3, shell over next shell. Repeat from * across. Turn. 6th row: Sl st in sp, shell over shell, * ch 3, skip ch-3, sc in next loop, (ch 3, sc in next loop) 5 times; ch 3, in next shell make 3 dc with ch-1 between. Repeat from * across, ending with shell over shell. Turn. 7th row: SI st in sp, shell over shell, * ch 3, skip ch-3, sc in next loop, (ch 3, sc in next loop) 4 times; ch 3, in next ch-1 Continued on page 21

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Hand Crochet makes a Useful Gift!

Here's a dressy, little bib for a new baby . . . or a bean bag for an older child. Both are made of Clark's O.N.T. or J. & P. Coats Pearl Cotton.

Bean Bag No. X-126

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O. N. T. or J. & P. COATS PEARL COTTON, size 5, 1 ball each of light and dark colors.

Steel crochet hook No. 6.

A handful of beans.

This material is sufficient for 2 bean bags.

Starting at center with Dark, ch 2. 1st rnd: In 2nd ch from hook make sc, h dc and 10 dc (12 sts). Do not join rnds. Drop Dark, attach Light in 1st sc. 2nd rnd: 2 sc in same st where thread was attached, 2 h dc in next h dc, 2 dc in each dc (24 sts). Drop Light, pick up Dark. 3rd rnd: * Dc in next st, 2 dc in next st. Repeat from * around (36 sts). Drop Dark, pick up Light. 4th rnd: * Dc in next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st. Repeat from * around (48 sts). Drop Light, pick up Dark. Continue thus increasing as necessary (about 12 sts on each rnd) to keep work flat, until piece measures 4½ inches in diameter. End each color separately by working h dc in Fasten off.

Baby Bib No. 5190

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O. N. T. or J. & P. COATS PEARL COTTON, size 5, 2 balls.

Steel crochet hook No. 6.

A small button.

Starting at neck edge, ch 96 (to measure about 10 inches). 1st row: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next 14 ch. * 3 sc in next ch, sc in next 15 ch. Repeat from * across. Ch 1, turn. Hereafter pick up only back loop of each sc. 2nd row: * Sc in each sc to within center sc of 3-sc group, 3 sc in next sc. Repeat from * across. Ch 1, turn. Repeat the 2nd row until piece measures 3/4 inch. Fasten off. Turn and work across 2 center sections only as follows: 1st row: Attach thread to center sc of 2nd 3-sc group, work sc in each sc to within center sc of next 3-sc group, 3 sc in next sc, sc in each sc across to within 3rd sc of next 3-sc group. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: Sc in each sc to within center sc of 3-sc group, 3 sc in next sc, sc in each remaining sc of previous row. Ch 1, turn. Repeat the 2nd row until center front of Bib measures 4 inches. Fasten off.

Work edging all around as follows: 1st row: Attach thread to 1st sc at center back opening, ch 4, * skip 1 sc, dc in next sc, ch 1. Repeat from * to center sc of 1st 3-sc group, in center sc work dc, ch 3 and dc. Continue making ch-1 sps to within 3 sts of inner corner, then ch 1, thread over twice, skip 1 sc, insert hook in next sc and draw loop through, thread over and draw through 2 loops, thread over, skip 1 row on side edge, insert hook in st at edge of next row and draw loop through, thread over and draw through 2 loops, thread over and draw through remaining 3 loops. Now make dc sps across, working in edge of every other row. Continue in this manner, increasing in next 3 points as before. Ch 6, turn. 2nd row: Ch 5, sc in 3rd ch from hook, dc in sp, * ch 3, sc in 3rd ch from hook (p made), dc in same sp. Repeat from * once more, ** skip 1 sp, sc in next sp, skip 1 sp, in next sp make 4 dc with p's between (shell). Repeat from ** around, making a shell in ch-3 sp at each point, and skipping an additional sp at inner corners. Fasten off. Work sc along two short ends at center back, making a ch-3 buttonloop on one side. Sew on button.



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Junior Foot Cozies No. 5192

MATERIALS:

2 balls of light color and 1 ball of dark color for each size.

CLARK'S O.N.T. RUG and AFGHAN HOOK, size G.

2 ball buttons.

Sizes	6"	7"	8"
(Length of Sole)	-	•	1

BOTTOM SOLE ... With dark color, ch 18 sts 20 sts 22 sts to measure 5" 5½" 6"

1st rnd: 4 sc in 2nd ch from hook (heel), sc in each of next

9 ch 10 ch 11 ch

dc in each of next

6 ch 7 ch 8 ch make 5 dc in last ch (toe). Now working along opposite side of foundation chain, make dc in each of next

6 ch 7 ch 8 ch sc in each of next

9 ch 10 ch 11 ch

2nd, 3rd and 4th rnds: Sc in each st around, increasing 2 sc evenly across heel and 5 sc evenly across toe—to inc, work 2 sc in 1 sc. 5th rnd: Sl st in each st around. Fasten off.

Twin Beanies ... One's a hat, one's a bag! Try making 'em in red-white-and-blue.

MATERIALS for No. 5189

J. & P. COATS CROCHET CORD, 1 ball each of Red, Blue and White.

Steel crochet hook No. 6 or 7.

A 6-inch zipper.

GAUGE: 10 sts make 1 inch; 4 rnds make 1 inch.

Stripe pattern is made by working 2 rnds of Red, 2 rnds of White and 2 rnds of Blue and repeating this sequence of color throughout.

BEANIE... Starting at top with Red, ch 4. 1st rnd: 11 dc in 4th ch from hook (12 dc, counting turning ch as 1 dc). Join with sl st in top st of turning ch. 2nd rnd: Ch 3, dc in same place as sl st, 2 dc in each st around (24 sts). Join with sl st to top st of 1st ch made. Drop Red, attach White. 3rd rnd: Ch 3, * 2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc. Repeat from * around (36 sts). Join. 4th rnd:

Ch 3, * 2 dc in next dc, dc in next 2 dc. Repeat from * around (48 sts). Join. Drop White, attach Blue. 5th rnd: Ch 3, * 2 dc in next dc, dc in next 3 dc. Repeat from * around (60 sts). Join. 6th rnd: Ch 3, * 2 dc in next dc, dc in next 4 dc. Repeat from * around (72 sts). Join. Drop Blue, pick up Red.

Continue thus in stripe pattern, increasing 12 sts on each rnd until piece measures 6½ inches in diameter. Now work straight in stripe pattern until piece measures 5 inches from top. Work 1 rnd of sl st around, being careful to keep correct head size. Fasten off.

BEANIE BAG... Make another piece same as this for bag. Line bag and sew zipper across center 6 inches of opening. WRIST LOOP... With Red, ch 63; sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 2 ch, h dc in next 3 ch, dc in next 50 ch, h dc in next 3 ch, sc in next 3 ch. Fasten off. Sew narrow ends of this piece to zipper pull.

TOP SOLE... With light color work exactly as for Bottom Sole.

UPPER . . . Attach light color to st at center back of top sole. 1st rnd: With wrong side facing, ch 3, then working through both loops of each sl st work dc in each st around. Join with sl st in top of ch-3. 2nd rnd: Ch 3, dc in next

* thread over, (insert hook in back loop only of next st and draw loop through) twice; thread over and draw through 3 loops, thread over and draw through remaining 2 loops (dc dec made). Repeat from * 11 more times; then work dc (through both loops) in each of remaining 18 sts 20 sts 22 sts Join.

3rd rnd: Ch 1, sc in same place as sl st, sc in next

15 sts

17 sts

then working through both loops of each st, work dc decreases as before across next

16 sts (8 decreases), sc in each of remaining


* insert hook through both loops of next tr and through back loop of corresponding st below, yarn over and draw loop through, finish as for sc. Repeat from * around. Join and fasten off.

ANKLE STRAP . . . Ch 35. 1st row: Tr in 5th ch from hook and in each ch across. Fasten off. 2nd row: Attach thread at top of turning ch, insert hook in same place and also at base of same ch, thread over and draw loop through both thicknesses, * insert hook through both loops of next tr and through remaining loop of ch at base of same tr, thread over and draw loop completely through both thicknesses and through loop on hook. Repeat from * across. Fasten off.

shoe with wrong sides of soles facing. Thread large sewing needle with strand of dark color and overcast the two soles together, working through both loops of sc of bottom sole and through 1 loop only of sc of top sole. Rnd of sl st remains free on bottom of dark sole. Sew center 2 inches of ankle strap to back of shoe. Sew on button and use any loop of raised st as buttonloop.

Make other slipper same as this.

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. COTTON RUG YARN, 4 balls of main color for Body (Yellow, Cream or Ecru); 1 ball of Brown for Hair.

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS SIX STRAND EMBROIDERY FLOSS, 1 skein each of Red, Blue and Brown.

CLARK'S O.N.T. Rug and Afghan Hook, size G.

Steel crochet hook No. 7.

1/2 yard printed cotton percale, 36 inches wide.

1 yard narrow ribbon.

Cotton batting.

GAUGE: 3 sts make 1 inch; 3 rnds make 1 inch.

HEAD . . . Starting at top with main color and G hook, ch 22. 1st rnd: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. Then working along opposite side of foundation chain, make sc in each ch across (42 sts around). Do not join rnds but work sc in each st around until piece measures 7 inches. Fasten off.

BODY... Starting at bottom with main color, ch 29. Work as for Head (56 sts around) until piece measures 11 inches. Fasten off.

ARM (Make 2) . . . Starting at top with main color, ch 9 and work as for Head (16 sts around) until piece measures 9 inches. Fasten off.

LEG (Make 2) . . . Work as for Arms for 10 inches. Fasten off. Stuff Head and Body with cotton batting. Run a draw string around opening and draw in slightly for neck. Sew Head to open end of Body, having Body extend beyond Head on both sides for shoulders. Stuff Arms and Legs and sew in place on Body.

EYE (Make 2) . . . With Blue Six Strand and No. 7 hook, ch 2. 1st rnd: 7 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Do not join rnds. 2nd rnd: 2 sc in each sc around (14 sts). 3rd rnd: * Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc. Repeat from * around (21 sts). Fasten off.

LOWER LIP . . . With Red ch 8; sc in 2nd ch from hook, h dc in next, dc in next, tr in next, dc in next, h dc in next, sc in next. Fasten off.

UPPER LIP... Ch 10, sc in 2nd ch from hook, h dc in next, dc in next, (tr in next) twice; dc in next, h dc in next, sc in next. Fasten off.

BANGS... Wind Brown Rug Yarn flatly over width of a piece of paper 1 inch wide and 6 inches long. Machine stitch 2 or 3 times along one edge. Tear out paper. Then cut one thickness of Rug Yarn close to stitching thus making Bangs 2 inches long. Sew in place across top of Head.

HAIR... Cut remainder of Brown Rug Yarn into 1-yard lengths. Lay them side by side to cover a 6 x 36-inch area. Machine stitch them together down middle (stitching should measure 6 inches), having 18-inch strands on each side of stitching. Place Hair on Head, one end of machine stitching in center of Bangs, remainder of stitching down back of Head. Sew securely to Head. Drape Hair over back of Head and across top of Bangs. Fasten strands close to Head at ends of Bangs. Make 2 braids and tie

ends with ribbon. Tack braids in place. Sew Eyes and Mouth in place. Make eyelashes with Brown.

DRESS . . . Fold material in half making a double piece 18 x 18 inches. Make a slit along center 12 inches of fold. Turn under fabric around slit and sew in place, being sure a draw string can be run through (this is neck opening). Measuring 4½ inches down from fold, make a 7-inch slit parallel with fold through both thicknesses. Make a similar slit on other side. Sew top edges of this slit together for 3½ inches (sleeves). Make hem on sleeves wide enough for draw string. Sew side seams of skirt; then shirr upper edge of skirt in to fit body of dress and sew in place. Make a 2-inch hem at bottom of skirt. Use main color Rug Yarn for draw strings at neck and sleeves. Braid remainder of main color Rug Yarn for sash.

Collar No. 2588

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 30:

CLARK'S O.N.T.—3 balls, OR J. & P. COATS —2 balls. Steel crochet hook No. 9.

COLLAR . . . Make a chain 32 inches long. 1st row: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across until row measures 29 inches. Ch 1, turn. Cut off remaining chain. 2nd row: Sc in each st across. Ch 1, turn. Repeat the 2nd row until band measures ½ inch. Fasten off. Measure off 9 inches at both ends of band, and mark each place with a pin. Attach thread at one pin and work frill as follows: 1st row: ** Ch 10, sl st in 6th ch from hook (ring made). Sc in ring, * ch 2, 3 dc in ring, ch 2, sc in ring. Repeat from * 4 more times (5 petals), then sl st in 1st sc made (flower made). Ch 4, skip 3 sts on band, sc in next st. Repeat from ** across to other pin. Fasten off. 2nd row: Attach thread to back of 1st flower made on previous row. * Ch 10, sl st in 6th ch from hook, and complete a flower as before. Ch 4, sc at back of next flower on previous row. Repeat from * across to end of row. Fasten off. Repeat the 2nd row 3 more times (5 rows of flowers in all). Starch lightly and press.

Lapel Flower No. 2634

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 50.

1 ball of White or Ecru will make 2 flowers.

Steel crochet hook No. 12 or 13.

Keep gauge as tight as possible.

PETAL . . . Starting at center, ch 25. 1st row: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, ch 3, sc in same place as last sc; now working along opposite side of foundation ch, make sc in each ch across to last 3 sc, do not work in last 3 sc (this is tip of petal). Ch 5, turn. Hereafter work only in the back loop of each sc. 2nd row: Sc in each sc across to ch-3 loop; in ch-3 loop make sc, ch 3 and sc; sc in each sc across to last 3 sc. Ch 5, turn. Repeat the 2nd row 6 more times. Now work sc in each sc across to ch-3 loop at base of petal. Sl st in loop.

Fasten off. This completes 1 petal. Make 5 more petals same as this. Starting at base, sew adjacent sides of petals to within last 5 sc. This completes one layer of petals. Make another layer same as this.

CENTER . . . Ch 2. 1st rnd: 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Do not join rnds. Work in both loops of each sc. 2nd rnd: 2 sc in each sc (12 sc in rnd). 3rd rnd: * Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc. Repeat from * around. 4th and 5th rnds: Sc in each sc around. 6th rnd: * Sc in next 2 sc, skip 1 sc. Repeat from * around. Repeat this rnd, stuffing with cotton before opening becomes too small. Close opening and fasten off.

stem... Ch 8. 1st row: Sc in 2nd and each following ch across. Ch 1, turn. Work only in the back loop of each sc. 2nd row: Sc in each sc across. Ch 1, turn. Repeat the 2nd row until piece measures 3½ inches. Fasten off.

Measure off 32 strands of same thread, each strand being $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches long. Twist these strands. Fold stem-piece lengthwise over these strands and sew the two long edges together. Place petal layers over each other and sew center in place (see illustration). Sew one end of stem to under part of flower.

Jabot No. 2586

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 50:

CLARK'S O.N.T.—3 balls of White or Ecru, or 4 balls of any color,

J. & P. COATS —2 balls of White or Ecru, or 3 balls of

Steel crochet hook No. 12.

15 small pearl buttons.

center band... Starting at one end, make a chain to measure $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches. 1st row: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across until row measures 1 inch. Ch 1, turn. Cut off remaining ch. 2nd row: Sc in each sc across. Ch 1, turn. Repeat the 2nd row until piece measures $8\frac{3}{4}$ inches.

TOP FRILL... Work along 1 long side of Center Band as follows: 1st row:

* Ch 7, skip 1 row, sc in end of next row. Repeat from * across to end of long side (bottom). Work ch-7 loops in same way in every other st of starting chain across bottom. Work along 2nd long side to correspond, ending with

ch 3, tr in end of last row. Turn. 2nd row: * Ch 8, sc in next loop. Repeat from * across 2 long sides and 1 short side, ending with ch 4, tr in last loop. Turn. 3rd row: * Ch 9, sc in next loop. Repeat from * across, ending with ch 4, d tr in last loop. Turn. 4th row: Ch 4, then holding back the last loop of each tr on hook, make 2 tr in top of d tr, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster made). Ch 11, then holding back the last loop of each tr on hook, make 3 tr in same place, and complete a cluster as before. * In 5th st of next ch-9 make two 3-tr clusters with ch-11 between. Repeat from * across. Turn. 5th row: Sl st to center of next loop, ch 4 and complete a cluster as before at the base of the ch-4. Ch 14, cluster in same place as last cluster. * In 6th st of next ch-11 make two 3-tr clusters with ch-14 between. Repeat from * across. Turn. 6th row: * 4 sc in next loop, ch 3, sc in 3rd ch from hook (picot made); (3 sc in same loop, p) twice; 4 sc in same loop. Repeat from * across. Fasten off.

BOTTOM FRILL... Working in back of Top Frill, attach thread to end of 1st free row (from top) at one long side of Center Band. 1st row: Work same as 1st row of Top Frill, making the sc's in ends of free rows of Center Band. 2nd and 3rd rows: Same as 2nd row of Top Frill. 4th and 5th rows: Same as 3rd row of Top Frill. 6th, 7th and 8th rows: Same as 4th, 5th and 6th rows of Top Frill. Fasten off. Starch lightly and press. Sew on buttons, as in illustration (5 groups of 3).

Butterflies No. 2640

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 30, 1 ball.

Steel crochet hook No. 10 or 11.

This material is sufficient for a set of 3 butterflies, a large butterfly about 4 x 5 inches, a medium butterfly about 3 x 3½ inches and a small butterfly about 2½ x 3 inches.

A-WINGS . . . Starting at center ch 13.

1st row: Dc in 4th ch from hook and in each of next 7 ch, h dc in next ch, in next ch make sc, ch 3 and sc; now working along opposite side of foundation ch, work h dc in next ch, dc in 9 remaining ch across. Ch 3, turn. 2nd row: Dc in each st to ch-3 loop at tip, in loop make 3 dc, ch 3 and 3 dc; dc in each remaining st across and in top st of turning ch. Ch 1, turn. 3rd row: Sc in each st across, making 2 sc, ch 3 and 2 sc in sp at tip. Ch 4, turn. 4th row:

Join. 7th rnd: SI st to next sp, ch 3, in same sp make dc, ch 2 and 2 dc. * Ch 1, skip ch-1 sp, make shell in sp of next shell. Repeat from * around. Join. 8th rnd: Sl st to sp of shell, sc in same sp, * ch 5, sc in next sp. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 2, dc in 1st sc made. 9th to 19th rnds incl: * Ch 5, sc in next loop. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 2, dc in dc (12 rnds of loops). 20th rnd: * Ch 5, sc in next loop. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 5, sl st in dc. 21st rnd: Sl st in next 2 ch, sl st in loop, ch 3, in same loop make dc, ch 2 and 2 dc. * Ch 1, shell in next loop. Repeat from * around. Join (20) shells). 22nd to 30th rnds incl: Same as 7th rnd, thus making shell over shell (10 rnds of shells). 31st to 34th rnds incl: Work shell over shell as before,

having 1 more ch between shells on each rnd (ch 5 on last rnd).

35th rnd: * Shell over shell, ch 4, 12 tr in sp of next shell (base of pineapple), ch 4. Repeat from * around. Join. 36th rnd: * Shell over shell, ch 3, tr in each tr with ch 1 between tr's, ch 3. Repeat from * around. Join. 37th rnd: * Shell over shell, ch 3, skip ch-4 sp, sc in ch-1 sp, (ch 5, sc in next ch-1 sp) 10 times; ch 3. Repeat from * around. Join. 38th rnd: Sl st to next sp, ch 3, in same sp work dc, ch 2, 2 dc, ch 2 and 2 dc; * ch 3, sc in next ch-5 loop, work 9 ch-5 loops, ch 3, in sp of next shell work (2 dc, ch 2) twice, and 2 dc. Repeat from * around. Join. 39th rnd: SI st to next sp, ch 3 and complete a shell in same sp, * ch 2, shell in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-5 loop, work 8 ch-5 loops, ch 3, shell in next ch-2 sp. Repeat from * around. Join. 40th rnd: * Shell over shell, shell in next ch-2 sp, shell over next shell, ch 3, work ch-5 loops across pineapple as before, ch 3. Repeat from * around. Join. 41st rnd: * Shell over shell, (ch 1, shell over next shell) twice; ch 3, work across pineapple, ch 3. Repeat from * around. Join. 42nd rnd: Same as last rnd, working ch 3 between shells instead of ch 1. 43rd rnd: * Shell over shell, ch 4, in sp of next shell work 2 dc, ch 5 and 2 dc; ch 4, shell over shell, ch 3, work across pineapple, ch '3. Repeat from * around. Join. 44th rnd: * Shell over shell, ch 4, work 14 tr in ch-5 sp of next shell, (base of 2nd rnd of pineapples), ch 4. Repeat from * around. Join.

45th rnd: * Shell over shell, ch 3, tr in each tr with ch-1 between tr's, ch 3, shell over shell, ch 3, work across pineapple, ch 3. Repeat from * around. Join. 46th rnd: * Shell over shell, ch 3, sc in ch-1 sp, (ch 5, sc in next ch-1 sp) 12 times; ch 3, shell over shell, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 loop, ch 5. Repeat from * around. Join. 47th rnd: * Shell over shell, ch 3, work ch-5 loops across pineshell, ch 3, work ch-5 loops across pineshell.

apple, ch 3, shell over shell, ch 9. Repeat from * around. Join. 48th rnd: * Shell over shell, ch 3, work across pineapple, ch 3, shell over shell, ch 6, sc in next sp, ch 6. Repeat from * around. Join. 49th rnd: Same as 47th rnd, making ch 11 instead of ch 9. 50th rnd: Same as 48th rnd, making ch 8 instead of ch 6. 51st rnd: Same as 47th rnd, making ch 17 instead of ch 9. 52nd rnd: Same as 48th rnd, making ch 10 instead of ch 6. Make points by working back and forth over each pineapple individually as follows: 1st row: Shell over shell, work across pineapple, shell over shell, ch 5, turn. Repeat this row until only 1 loop remains at top of pineapple. Ch 5, turn. Last row: Shell over shell, ch 4, sc in loop, ch 4, 2 dc in next shell, ch 1, sl st in ch-2 sp of last shell, ch 1, 2 dc where last 2 dc were made. Fasten off. Attach thread to sp of 1st shell of next pineapple and complete point in same manner. Continue thus until all points have been completed.

BASE . . . Attach thread to sp between 2 shells of 7th rnd of basket. 1st rnd: Shell in same sp, * ch 5, sc in sp between next 2 shells, ch 5, shell in sp between next 2 shells. Repeat from * around. Join (10 shells). 2nd rnd: * Shell over shell, ch 5, sc in sp, sc in sc, sc in sp, ch 5. Repeat from * around. Join. 3rd rnd: * Shell over shell, ch 5, sc in sp, sc in 3 sc, sc in sp, ch 5. Repeat from * around. Join. 4th rnd: * Shell over shell, ch 6, sc in sp, sc in 5 sc, sc in sp, ch 6. Repeat from * around. Join. 5th rnd: * Shell over shell, ch 7, sc in sp, sc in 7 sc, sc in sp, ch 7. Repeat from * around. Join and fasten off.

HANDLE . . . Ch 14. 1st row: Shell in 6th ch from hook, ch 5, skip 7 ch, shell in next ch. Ch 5, turn. 2nd row: Shell over shell, ch 5, shell in sp of next shell. Ch 5, turn. 3rd row: Shell over shell, ch 3, sc over the 2 ch's below, ch 3, shell over shell. Ch 5, turn. 4th and 5th rows: Same as 2nd row. Repeat 3rd, 4th and 5th rows for 27 inches. Fasten off.

Loop-Trimmed Scuffs No. 2637

MATERIALS:

PEARL COTTON, size 5, 3 balls of any color.

Steel crochet hook No. 1/0 (zero).

A pair of slipper soles.



GAUGE: 6 sts make 1 inch; 3 sc and 2 h dc rows make 1 inch.

Sizes Small Medium Large

VAMP... Starting at toe with double thread, ch 12. 1st row: H dc in 3rd ch from hook and in each ch across (10 sts). Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: Work in the front loop (not in the top of the h dc) of each st as follows: 2 sc in 1st st, sc in each st across, 2 sc in last st (12 sts). Ch 2, turn. There is a ch ridge on right side. 3rd row: 2 h dc in 1st st, h dc in each st across, 2 h dc in last st (14 sts). Ch 2, turn. Repeat 2nd and 3rd rows alternately until there are on row

26 sts 28 sts 30 sts

Now inc 1 st at both ends of every other row until there are on row

30 sts 34 sts 38 sts

Work straight until there are completed



FRINGE . . . Cut a cardboard 3 inches long and 1 inch wide. Holding last row of Vamp toward you, right side uppermost, attach double thread in end st of last ch ridge. Pass thread over width of cardboard, insert hook in same st where thread was attached, thread over and pull loop through, thread over and draw through 1 loop, thread over and draw through remaining 2 loops (a loop st made). * Pass thread over cardboard, insert hook in next st and complete a loop st; make another loop st in same place, skip 1 st. Repeat from * across top of Vamp. Ch 1, turn. Brush Fringe toward toe. Work last row of Vamp and top of Fringe together with sc. Fasten off.

Pin Vamp in place on sole and sew to the stitching around edge of sole. Make other scuff same as this.

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Carnation No. 4016

MATERIALS:


CLARK'S O.N.T. "BRILLIANT," 3 balls. Steel crochet hook No. 10.

A piece of heavy flower wire, 18 inches

Artificial carnation leaves and calyx. Green rubberized tape.

Starting at base of carnation, ch 5. Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: Ch 3, 13 dc in ring. Join with sl st in top st of ch-3. 2nd and 3rd rnds: Ch 3, dc in each dc around. Join. 4th rnd: Ch 4, * dc in next dc, ch 1. Repeat from * around. Join. 5th to 9th rnds incl: Ch 4, * dc in next sp, ch 1, dc in next dc, ch 1. Repeat from * around. Join. 10th rnd: * Sc in next sp, ch 3, in next sp make 6 tr with p's between to make a p, ch 3, sc in 3rd ch from hook; ch 3. Repeat from * around. Sl st in 1st sc made. Fasten off.

FINISHING . . . Fasten heavy wire securely to base of carnation. Slip calyx onto stem and push up close to petals, having slipped base inside calyx. Wind stem with rubberized tape, inserting leaves at desired intervals.

Be Your Own Betsy Ross!

MATERIALS for No. X-106

J. & P. COATS KNIT-CRO-SHEEN, 2 balls of Blue, 3 balls of Red and 4 balls of White.

Steel crochet hook No. 9.

When blocked, flag measures about 24 x 36 inches.

GAUGE: 9 sts make 1 inch; $3\frac{1}{2}$ rows

Starting at bottom, with Red make a ch 45 inches long (8 ch sts to 1 inch). 1st row: Dc in 4th ch from hook and in each ch until row measures 34 inches. Cut off remaining ch. Ch 3, turn. 2nd row: Dc in each dc. Ch 3, turn. Repeat 2nd row 5 more times, omitting turning ch-3 at end of 7th row. (This completes 1 stripe; stripe must measure 2 inches.) Fasten off. Attach White, ch 3 and work 7 rows. Fasten off. Attach Red and make another stripe. Now make a White stripe, a Red stripe and a White stripe. Fasten

Next row: Attach Red and work across to within 14 inches from end of row,

then thread over, insert hook in next dc and pull loop through; thread over and draw through 2 loops; let Red hang, pull Blue through remaining 2 loops and, with Blue, make dc in each remaining dc across. Ch 3, turn. Work with Blue over Blue sts and Red over Red sts, changing colors as before. Work in this manner, alternating Red and White stripes, until 7 short stripes (4 Red and 3 White) are completed. Then work a row of sl st, using color to correspond with previous row. Fasten off. With Red sl st along opposite long side. Fasten off.

STAR (Make 96) . . . Ch 2, 10 sc in 2nd ch from hook; join. Next rnd: * Ch 4, sc in 2nd ch from hook, h dc in next ch, dc in next ch, skip 1 sc, sl st in next sc (a point). Repeat from * around (5 points). Join and break off. Sew 6 x 8 stars on each side of Blue background (see illustration).

BAND . . . Cut a strip of heavy White material, $2\frac{1}{2}$ x 25 inches. Bind back edge of Flag with this strip. Cut a $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch eyelet, 1 inch from ends of band, and overcast with over-and-over sts. Block Flag to measure 24 x 36 inches.

Knitting Bag No. 497

MATERIALS:

J. & P. COATS KNIT-CRO-SHEEN, 3 balls of a self-shading or variegated color and 3 balls of a solid color.

CLARK'S O.N.T. KNITTING PINS, 1 pair No. 2.

1 pair wooden bag handles.

GAUGE: 9 sts make 1 inch; 8 rows make 1 inch.

Bag is worked with double thread throughout. Starting at top, using 1 strand of shaded and 1 strand of solid together, cast on 140 sts. 1st row: * Skip 1 st, k in the back of next st, then k in the front of the st which was skipped and allow both sts to slip off left-hand needle. Repeat from * across. 2nd row: P 1, * skip 1 st, purl the next st, then purl the st which was skipped, and allow both sts to slip off left-hand needle. Re-peat from * across, ending with p 1. Repeat these 2 rows alternately for pattern, until piece measures 24 inches. Bind off.

FINISHING . . . Fold knitted piece in half, to measure 12 x 15½ inches; seam sides to within 4½ inches from top edges. If desired, line bag with lining material. Draw one top edge through slot in handle, and sew down on wrong side. Finish other side in same way.

Round Shopping Bag No. 4015

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. COTTON RUG YARN, 1 ball each of Red, White and Blue.

Clark's O.N.T. Rug and Afghan Hook, size G.

CORD HANDLE . . . Cut 4 strands of Red each 2 yards long. Twist the strands tightly, then double the twisted strands and give them a second twist in the opposite direction. Make a loose knot at free end of cord to prevent raveling. Make another piece same as this, using White yarn. Undo the loose knots and tie these two ends together in a tight knot, making length half Red and half White.

BAG PIECE... Starting at center with Red, ch 6. Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: (Ch 5, sc in ring) 7 times; ch 3, dc in ring (8 loops). 2nd rnd: * (Ch 5, sc in next loop) twice; ch 5, sc in same loop (corner). Repeat from * 2 more times; (ch 5, sc in next loop) twice; ch 3, dc in same loop (12 loops). 3rd rnd: * (Ch 5, sc in next loop) 3 times; ch 5, sc in same loop (corner). Repeat from * 2 more times, (ch 5, sc in next loop) 3 times; ch 3, dc in same loop (16 loops). Continue thus, increasing 1 loop at each corner on each row until Red yarn is all used up. Attach White and continue around until White is all used up. Attach Blue and continue around until Blue is all used up. Fasten off. Run cord through loops (each corner loop and one loop between each corner). Tie ends in knot and trim knots.

It's in the Bag...

and here are 3 smart utility bags for shopping and knitting. Make them up in gay colors!

Long Shopping Bag No. 4010

MATERIALS:

J. & P. COATS KNIT-CRO-SHEEN, 3 balls of White or Ecru, or 4 balls of any color.

Steel crochet hook No. 3.

Starting at short end, ch 138 (17 sts to 2 inches) to measure 17 inches long. 1st row: Dc in 4th ch from hook and in each ch across until there are 136 dc, counting turning ch as 1 dc. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: Sc in 1st 2 dc, * ch 10, skip 4 dc, sc in next 4 dc. Repeat from * across, ending with ch 10, skip 4 dc, sc in last 2 dc. Ch 1, turn. 3rd row: Sc in 1st 2 sc, * ch 5, 2 sc in next loop, ch 5, skip 1 sc, sc in next 2 sc. Repeat from * across, ending with ch 5, sc in last 2 sc. Ch 3, turn. 4th row: Dc in next sc, ch 5, * sc in next loop, sc in next 2 sc, sc in next loop, ch 10. Repeat from * across, ending with ch 5, dc in last 2 sc. Ch 1, turn. 5th row: Sc in next 2 dc, * ch 5, skip 1 sc, sc in next 2 sc, ch 5, 2 sc in next loop. Repeat from * across, ending with ch 5, sc in last 2 dc. Ch 3, turn. 6th row: Dc in next sc, ch 10, skip next ch 5 and sc group, * sc in next loop, sc in next 2 sc, sc in next loop, ch 10. Repeat from * across, ending with ch 10, dc in last 2 sc. Ch 1,

Repeat 3rd to 6th rows incl for 44 inches, ending with the 5th row of pattern. Ch 1, turn. Next row: Sc in next 2 sc, ch 4, skip ch 5 and 2 sc, * sc in next loop, sc in next 2 sc, sc in next loop, ch 4. Repeat from * across. Ch 3, turn. Following row: Dc in each st across. Fasten off. Fold piece in half and sew up sides.

HANDLES . . . Cut 37 strands each 3 yards long. Twist tightly, then double the twisted strands and give them a 2nd twist in the opposite direction. Knot loose ends. Make another knot 5 inches away from end knot. Make 3rd knot close to 2nd knot. Make 4th knot 5 inches away from 3rd knot. Cut cord between 2nd and 3rd knots. Fasten cut ends on wrong sides of knots and sew handles to top of bag.

Sugar and Cream Pot Holders

No. 9346

MATERIALS:

J. & P. COATS KNIT-CRO-SHEEN, 1 ball of White or Ecru, or 2 balls of any color.

Steel crochet hook No. 6 or 7.

2 bone rings, 1 inch in diameter.

CLARK'S O.N.T. OR J. & P. COATS SIX STRAND EMBROIDERY FLOSS, 2 skeins of a contrasting color.

SUGAR BOWL

FRONT . . . 1st row: Attach thread to bone ring, ch 4, 41 tr in ring, ch 3, turn. 2nd row: Work in back loop only of each st as follows: At base of ch-3 make dc, ch 2 and 2 dc; then ch 1, work tr in each tr across with ch 1 between; ch 1, in top st of turning ch make 2 dc, ch 2 and 2 dc. Ch 5, turn. 3rd row: In ch-2 sp make 2 dc, ch 2 and 2 dc (shell made), ch 4, skip next sp, sc in next sp, (ch 3, sc in next sp) 38 times; ch 4, skip last ch-1 sp, in ch-2 sp make a shell as before. Ch 5, turn. 4th row: Make a shell in sp of shell, ch 4, skip ch-4 sp, * sc in next loop, ch 3. Repeat from * across, ending with ch 4; skip ch-4 sp, shell in sp of shell. Ch 5, turn. Repeat the 4th row until 1 ch-3 loop remains. Ch 5, turn. Last row: Shell in sp of shell, ch 4, skip ch-4 sp, sc in ch-3 loop, ch 4, skip next ch-4 sp, 2 dc in sp of next shell, ch 1, sl st in sp of last shell made, ch 1, 2 dc in same place as last 2 dc were made. Fasten off.

BACK . . . With wrong side of first row facing, attach thread to front loop at top of 1st st, ch 3, at base of ch-3 make dc, ch 2 and 2 dc, then ch 1, work tr in front loop only of each st across with ch-1 between, ending with ch 1, then in top st of turning ch make 2 dc, ch 2 and 2 dc. Ch 5, turn. Next row: Shell in sp of shell, ch 4, skip next sp and tr, (sc in next sp, h dc in next tr) 38 times; sc in next sp, ch 4, shell in sp of shell. Ch 5, turn. Following row: Shell over shell, ch 4, skip 1st sc, * sc in next dc, dc in next sc. Repeat from * across, ending with sc in last dc; ch 4, skip next sc and next sp, shell over shell. Ch 5, turn (1 st decreased at each end of solid section). Repeat this last row 13 more times. Work 13 more rows in pattern (always having de over se and se over dc), but decreasing 1 st at beginning of each row only. Hereafter keeping continuity of pattern, dec 2 sts at each end of each row until only 1 st remains, joining the last 2 shells as on Front. Fasten off. Sew edges of solid section of Back to corresponding edges of center section of Front, leaving the shells free.

HANDLE (Make 2) ... With double strand, ch 5, join. 1st rnd: Sc in each st around. Do not join rnds. 2nd and all following rnds: Sc in each sc around

(inserting hook from inside of circle), until piece measures 5 inches. Fasten off. Sew Handles between pieces as in illustration.

CREAM PITCHER

Work exactly as for Sugar Bowl, omitting left handle.

Strand into 4 even lengths. Twist these strands together tightly. Double the twisted strands and give them a second twist in the opposite direction. Write the word "Sugar" on a piece of paper. Place word diagonally on right side of Sugar Bowl and pin in place. Sew cord over letters. Cut off remaining cord. Remove paper and finish off ends of cord. Using remainder of cord, write the word "Cream" on Cream Pitcher in same way.

Curtain Pulls

No. 4014

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, size 20:

CLARK'S O.N.T.—1 ball will make 7 pulls,

OR

J. & P. COATS —1 ball will make 12 pulls.

Steel crochet hook No. 8 or 9.

Bone rings (one for each pull) 3/4 inch in diameter, measuring from outer circumference.

No. 4014 A

1st rnd: Make 48 sc over bone ring. Join with sl st in 1st sc made. 2nd rnd: Ch 1, sc in each sc around. Join. 3rd rnd: Ch 3, holding back on hook the last loop of each dc make 2 dc in same place as sl st, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster made); * ch 5, skip 2 sc, holding back on hook the last loop of each dc make 3 dc in next sc and complete cluster as before. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 5, sl st in tip of 1st cluster (16 clusters). 4th rnd: Sl st in loop, ch 3, in same loop make 2 dc, ch 5 and 3 dc; * sc in next loop, in next loop make 3 dc, ch 5 and 3 dc. Repeat from * around, ending with sc in last loop, sl st in top st of ch-3. 5th rnd: Sl st in next 2 dc, sc in next loop, * ch 3, sc in 3rd ch from hook (p made); sc in same loop (p, sc in same loop) 3 times; ch 3, sc in next sc, ch 3, sc in next loop. Repeat from * around. Join last ch-3 with sl st to 1st sc made. Fasten off.

CORD... Attach thread between any 2 center p's and make a ch about 15 inches long. Now sl st where thread was attached, thus doubling ch. Fasten off.

No. 4014 B

1st rnd: Make 45 sc over bone ring. Sl st in 1st sc made. 2nd rnd: Ch 1, sc

in each st around. Join. 3rd rnd: Ch 4, holding back on hook the last loop of each tr make 2 tr in same place as sl st, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster made); * skip 4 sc, holding back on hook the last loop of each tr make 3 tr in next sc and complete cluster as before, ch 10, cluster in same place where last cluster was made. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 10, sl st in tip of 1st cluster made. 4th rnd: 15 sc in each loop around. Sl st in 1st sc made. Fasten off. Attach thread to center sc of any scallop and complete cord as for No. 4014 A.

No. 4014 C

Join. 2nd rnd: Ch 1, sc in each st around. Join. 3rd rnd: Ch 1, * sc in next 9 sc, ch 5, skip 1 sc. Repeat from * around. Join last ch-5 to 1st sc made. 4th rnd: Sl st in next 3 sc, * sc in next sc, ch 1, in next ch-5 loop make 10 tr with ch 1 between, ch 1, skip 4 sc. Repeat from * around, ending with ch 1, sl st in 1st sc made. 5th rnd: * Sc in next ch-1 sp, (ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp) 10 times. Repeat from * around. Join and fasten off. Attach thread to center sc of any scallop and complete cord as for No. 4014 A.

Coat Hangers

No. 9371

MATERIALS:

J. & P. COATS CROCHET CORD, 2 balls of White or Ecru and 3 balls of any color.

Steel crochet hook No. 6.

5 HANGERS

No. 9371-A . . . Starting at narrow end with color, ch 17 (to measure 2 inches). 1st row: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: Sc in each sc across. Drop color, attach Ecru, ch 1, turn. 3rd row: Sc in 1st sc, * make a long sc—to make a long sc, insert hook in base of next st 2 rows below and draw loop through to height of row in work and complete as for an sc; skip sc behind long sc, sc in next sc. Repeat from * across. Ch 1, turn. 4th row: Sc in each st across. Drop Ecru, pick up color, ch 1, turn. 5th row: * Long sc over next sc (working in st 2 rows down as before), sc in next sc. Repeat from * across, Ch 1, turn. 6th row: Sc in each st across. Drop color, pick up Ecru. Ch 1, turn. Repeat the 3rd to 6th rows incl until piece measures same as length of hanger. Fasten off. Draw hook of hanger through center of crocheted piece and sew edges together, thus covering hanger.

No. 9371-B... Work as for No. 9371-A until one third of hanger cover is completed. Fasten off Ecru and work the next one third of cover in pattern, using

color only; work remaining one third to correspond with first one third. Finish as before.

No. 9371-C... Work as for No. 9371-B, using Ecru (instead of color) for center section.

No. 9371-D . . . Work in pattern as before, using only color for both end sections and using both Ecru and color for center section.

No. 9371-E... Work as for No. 9371-D, using Ecru (instead of color) for both end sections.

Jiffy Luncheon Set No. 7576

MATERIALS:

J. & P. COATS KNIT-CRO-SHEEN, 4 balls of White or Ecru, or 6 balls of any color.

Steel crochet hook No. 2/0 (double zero).

Material specified is sufficient for 4 place mats each about 12 x 18 inches, and a center mat about 14 x 28 inches.

GAUGE: 1 block measures 1 inch square. Use thread double throughout.

PLACE MAT (Make 4) ... Starting at long end, ch 69. 1st row: D tr in 6th ch from hook and the next 3 ch; * ch 5, skip 2 ch, sc in next ch, ch 5, skip 2 ch, d tr in next 5 ch (block). Repeat from * across (7 blocks and 6 lacets), ch 7, turn. 2nd row: Work sc in each ch-5 across with ch 7 between, ending with ch 7, sc in top st of turning ch. Ch 11, turn. 3rd row: Sc in 1st loop, * ch 5, block in next loop, ch 5, sc in next loop. Repeat from * across, ending with ch 5, d tr at base of ch-7 on previous row. Ch 7, turn. 4th row: Same as 2nd row. Continue thus in established pattern until 7 rows of blocks have been worked.

Next row: * SI st in next 5 d tr of block, sc in sp, ch 5, sc in next sp. Repeat from * across, ending with sl st in last 5 sts. Do not fasten off but work loops around all sides as follows: 1st rnd: With the right side facing, * ch 10, sc in center d tr of block, ch 10, sc in sp. Repeat from * across to next corner, sc in center d tr of block, ch 10, sc in corner st, ch 10, sc in same place (loop increased). Now work loops along short side (in the end d tr of each block and in each sp) to within next corner; inc 1 loop as before and continue thus around, ending with ch 10, sc in corner, ch 5, d tr in same place. 2nd rnd: * Ch 11, sc in next loop. Repeat from * around, increasing 1 loop at each corner and forming the last loop by working ch 5 and 1 d tr. 3rd rnd: * Ch 12, sc in next loop. Repeat from * around. Join and fasten off.

center mat... Starting at short end, ch 59. Work as for Place Mats, having 1 block and 1 lacet less on each row. Work 21 rows of blocks and continue working as for Place Mats. Fasten off. Starch and block to measurements given.

Glass Jackets No. 7596

MATERIALS:

J. & P. COATS CROCHET CORD, 2 balls of White or Ecru, or 3 balls of any color.

Steel crochet hook No. 6.

This amount of material is sufficient to make 6 glass jackets.

Starting at center of base, ch 3. 1st rnd: 9 h dc in 3rd ch from hook. Sl st in top st of starting ch (10 sts, counting turning ch as 1 h dc). Hereafter work only in the back loop of each h dc. 2nd rnd: Ch 2 (to count as h dc), h dc in same place as sl st, 2 h dc in each st around (20 sts). Join with sl st in top st of 1st ch-2. 3rd to 7th rnds incl: Ch 2, h dc in each st around, increasing 10 h dc in each rnd—to inc a h dc, make 2 h dc in 1 st. Join. There should be 70 h dc in 7th rnd, and piece should now measure 23/4 inches in diameter. This completes base of glass jacket. Do not fasten off but work side as follows: 1st to 4th rnds incl: Ch 2, h dc in each st around. Join. 5th rnd: Ch 2, h dc in next 8 sts, * skip 2 sts, 6 tr in next st, skip 2 sts, h dc in next 9 sts. Repeat from * around. Join last tr in top st of 1st ch-2. 6th rnd: Sl st in next st, ch 2, h dc in next 6 sts, * ch 2, sc between 1st 2 tr, (ch 3, sc between next 2 tr) 4 times; ch 2, skip 1 h dc, h dc in next 7 sts. Repeat from * around. Join.

7th rnd: Sl st in next st, ch 2, h dc in next 4 sts, * (ch 3, sc in next ch-3 loop) 4 times; ch 3, skip 1 h dc, h dc in next 5 sts. Repeat from * around. Join. 8th rnd: Sl st in next st, ch 2, h dc in next 2 sts, * ch 3, skip next ch-3, sc in next loop, (ch 3, sc in next loop) twice; ch 3, skip next ch-3 and 1 h dc, h dc in next 3 sts. Repeat from * around. Join. 9th rnd: Sl st in next st, ch 7 (to count as h dc and ch 5), * skip next ch-3, sc in next loop, ch 3, sc in next loop, ch 5, skip next ch-3 and 1 h dc, h dc in next st, ch 5. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st in 2nd st of ch-7. **10th rnd:** Ch 1, sc in sp, * ch 5, sc in ch-3 loop, ch 5, sc in sc last made, (ch 5, sc in same place) twice; ch 5, sc in each of next 2 sps. Repeat from * around. Join and fasten off. This completes 1 glass jacket. Make 5 more same as this.

Hot Plate Mats

No. 9350

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. COTTON RUG YARN, 2 balls.

CLARK'S O.N.T. RUG AND AFGHAN HOOK, size G.

This amount is sufficient for 2 hot plate mats about 6 x 8½ inches.

1st rnd: Starting at center, ch 10 (to measure about 3 inches), 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch across to within last ch, 3 sc in last ch. Now, working along opposite side of foundation ch, make sc in each ch across, ending with sc in same place where 1st 2 sc were made, sl st in front loop of 1st sc made. 2nd rnd: Ch 4, tr in front loop of each

st around. Join with sl st in top st of ch-4. 3rd rnd: Ch 1, insert hook in same place as sl st and in back loop of corresponding st below, yarn over and draw loop through, finish as for an sc - araised st made; make sc in same place, insert hook in back loop of next tr and in back loop of corresponding st below, yarn over and draw loop through, finish as for an sc; make another sc in same place (2 sts increased). Work without increasing to other end of oval. Then inc 3 sts across end, work straight along opposite side, then inc in last st (3 sts increased at each end). Sl st in 1st sc made. 4th rnd: Ch 1, sc in both loops of each st around, increasing as necessary at both ends of oval to keep work flat—to inc an sc make 2 sc in same st. Join. 5th rnd: Same as 2nd rnd. 6th rnd: Work as for 3rd rnd, increasing as necessary to keep work flat. Repeat 4th, 2nd and 6th rnds respectively until piece measures about $6 \times 8\frac{1}{2}$ inches, ending with the 6th rnd. Fasten off.

Make another hot plate mat same as this.

Pot Holder Trio No. 9344

MATERIALS:

J. & P. COATS KNIT-CRO-SHEEN, 1 ball each of a dark color, a light color and White.

Steel crochet hook No. 6 or 7.

3 bone rings.

The above amount of material is sufficient for 3 pot holders.

GAUGE: 10 dc make 1 inch; 4 rows make 1 inch.

TOP . . . With Dark color, ch 67 to measure $6\frac{1}{2}$ inches. 1st row: Dc in 4th ch from hook and in each ch across (65 dc, counting turning ch as 1 dc). Ch 3, turn. 2nd row: Dc in each dc and in top st of turning ch. Ch 3, turn. 3rd row: Dc in 3 dc; dc in next dc leaving the last 2 loops on hook, drop Dark, attach White and draw through 2 loops. * Then, holding Light along top of previous row make dc in next 4 dc (thus concealing Light); dc in next dc leaving last 2 loops on hook, drop White, pick up Light and draw through 2 loops; holding White along top of previous row make dc in next 4 dc (thus concealing White); dc in next dc leaving last 2 loops on hook, drop Light, pick up White and draw through 2 loops. Repeat from * 4 more times. Carrying Light as before, make 4 White dc, dc in next dc leaving last 2 loops on hook, drop White and Light, attach another ball of Dark and draw through 2 loops; with Dark work 5 dc. Ch 3, turn. Hereafter, changing color and concealing unused color as before, work as follows: Work Dark border with balls already attached. 4th row: 4 Dark dc, 5 White dc, * 5 Light dc, 5 White dc. Repeat from * across, ending with 5 Dark dc. Fasten off White. Ch 3, turn. 5th row: 5 Dark dc, 5 Light dc, attaching 3rd ball of Dark in last dc of last group, * 5 Dark dc, 5 Light dc. Repeat from * across, ending with 5 Dark dc Continued on page 20

Pot Holder Trio

worked with border ball. Ch 3, turn. 6th row: 5 Dark dc, 5 Light dc, * 5 Dark dc, 5 Light dc. Repeat from * across, ending with 5 Dark dc worked with border ball. Fasten off 3rd ball of Dark. Ch 3, turn. Repeat the last 4 rows (3rd to 6th rows incl) 4 more times; then the 3rd and 4th rows once more. Fasten off all but 1 Dark ball. Work 2 rows of Dark border. Fasten off.

BOTTOM . . . With White ch 57 to measure $5\frac{1}{2}$ inches. 1st row: Dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in next 3 ch changing to Light in last dc, * 5 Light dc, 5 White dc. Repeat from * 4 more times. With White ch 3, turn. 2nd row: 4 White dc, * 5 Light dc, 5 White dc. Repeat from * across. Fasten off White; with Light ch 3, turn. 3rd row: 4 Light dc changing to Dark in last dc, * 5 Dark dc, 5 Light dc. Repeat from * across. With Light ch 3, turn. 4th row: 4 Light dc, * 5 Dark dc, 5 Light dc. Repeat from * across. Fasten off Dark; with White ch 3, turn. 5th row: 4 White dc, * 5 Light dc, 5 White dc. Repeat from * across. With White ch 3, turn. Repeat 2nd to 5th rows incl 4 more times; then the 2nd row once more. Fasten off.

Place a soft piece of cloth for padding between the 2 crocheted pieces and sew checkered edge of bottom to checkered edge of top. Sew ring to one corner. Make 2 more pot holders same as this.

Flowerettes

No. 2639 Illustrated on page 3

LOWER PETAL (Make 5) ... Starting at center, ch 9. 1st row: Sc in 5th ch from hook (this is tip of petal) and in next 3 ch; in next ch make sc, ch 3 and sc. Now, working along opposite side of foundation ch, make sc in next 3 ch. Ch 4, turn. 2nd row: Sc in each sc to the ch-3, in ch-3 make sc, ch 3 and sc; sc in each sc to last sc. Ch 4, turn. Repeat the 2nd row until there are 3 ch-4 loops on each side of center loop at tip of petal, ending with sl st in ch-3 at base of petal. Fasten petals at base and sew 4 sts of adjacent sides of each petal together. This completes lower layer of petals.

UPPER PETAL (Make 5) ... Work petals as before, until each petal has 2 (instead of 3) ch-4 loops on each side of center loop at tip of petal. Sew petals together at base only (leaving sides free).

CENTER... Ch 2. 1st rnd: 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Do not join rnds. Work in both loops of each sc. 2nd rnd: 2 sc in each sc around. 3rd to 5th rnds: Sc in each sc around. Fasten off, leaving a 10-inch length of thread. Thread a needle with this thread and sew edges together, stuffing center with cotton before closing opening.

BASE... Work 1st 2 rnds as for Center. Now sc in each sc around, increasing as necessary to keep work flat until piece measures same as earring

base. Place upper and lower petals together and sew center in place. Sew this flower to crocheted base and sew crocheted base to earring base at outer edges.

Bells

No. 2644 Illustrated on page 3

BELL... Starting at top, ch 2. 1st rnd: 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Do not join rnds. Hereafter work only in the back loop of each sc. 2nd rnd: 2 sc in each sc around. 3rd and 4th rnds incl: Sc in each sc around. 5th to 12th rnds incl: Sc in each sc around, increasing 3 sc in each rnd—to inc an sc, work 2 sc in same place. After 12th rnd is completed, sl st in next sc. Fasten off.

CLAPPER . . . Starting at center, ch 2 and repeat 1st 3 rnds of bell. Fasten off, leaving a 15-inch length of thread. Thread a needle with this length of thread and sew outer edges together, stuffing piece with cotton before opening is closed. With remaining length of thread, ch 15 and sew top of ch (last ch) to inner side of top of bell.

BASE COVER . . . Starting at center, ch 2. 1st and 2nd rnds: Same as for bell. 3rd rnd: Sc in each sc around, increasing 6 sc in rnd. 4th, 5th and 6th rnds: Sc in each sc around. Fasten off.

Cover metal base with this crocheted piece, sewing edges together on wrong side of base. Tack bell to edge of base, allowing it to hang free.

Buttons

No. 2645 Illustrated on page 3

2 buttons, 3/4 inch in diameter. 1/2 yard round elastic.

EARRINGS . . . Ch 2. 1st rnd: 7 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Do not join rnds. 2nd rnd: 2 sc in each sc around. 3rd rnd: * Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc. Repeat from * around (21 sts). Continue thus, increasing 7 sts evenly on each rnd until surface of 3/4-inch button is covered. Work 2 rnds straight. Slip button inside this piece. Then dec 7 sts evenly on each rnd until opening is closed—to dec, work off 2 sc as 1 sc. Sew onto earring base or cement onto an old earring.

Using full strand of one color of Six Strand, embroider French knot stitches (6 times around needle) closely around center; with remaining color, work lazy-daisy stitches all around French knots.

Join and fasten off.

With wrong side facing, attach thread to bar of center tr of 1st petal of any leaf. Ch 6, * dc in ring of center petal of same leaf, ch 3, dc around bar of center tr of last petal of same leaf, ch 3, dc in 1st sp between petals, (ch 3, dc in next sp) twice; ch 3, dc around bar of center tr of 1st petal of next leaf, ch 3. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st to 3rd st of ch-6. 2nd to 7th rnds incl: Ch 5, then make dc in each sp around with ch 2 between each dc. Join and fasten off after 7th rnd.

CORD... Make a ch to measure about 12 inches. Break off. Run cord in and out of last row of sps. Make a silk cushion about 3\(^3\)/₄ inches in diameter filled with cotton batting, and insert into lace. Pull cord and tie in a bow.

top st of turning ch (65 sts). Ch 3, turn. 4th row: Same as 2nd row. Drop Dark, attach Light, ch 1, turn. 5th row: Same as 3rd row. Fasten off Light. 6th row: Pick up Dark and, working in the same direction as last row, make sc in front loop of each st across (65 sts). Ch 3, turn. Repeat 2nd to 6th rows incl 2 more times; then the 2nd to 5th rows once more. Fasten off both colors. With right side facing, work a row of sc all around edge with Light. Fasten off.

MIDDLE PIECE . . . Work exactly as for Front.

Starting at neck with No. 7 hook, ch 65 to measure 9 inches. 1st row: 5 tr in 7th ch from hook, * skip 2 ch, in next ch make tr, ch 2 and tr, skip 2 ch, 5 tr in next ch. Repeat from * across, ending with skip 2 ch, tr in last ch. Ch 8, turn. 2nd row: * Holding back last loop of each tr on hook make tr in 5 tr, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster), ch 9, sc in next ch-2 sp, ch 8. Repeat from * across, ending with cluster, ch 2, tr in top st of turning ch. Ch 2, turn. 3rd row: 3 h dc in ch-2 sp, make 5 h dc in each loop and 3 h dc in last sp. Change to No. 2 hook, ch 4, turn. 4th row: Work only in the back half of dc's, skip 1st st, (in next st make 3 dc with ch-1 between — shell made-skip 2 sts) 11 times; (shell in next st, skip 1 st) 18 times; (shell in next st, skip 2 sts) 11 times; shell in next st, skip 1 st, dc in next st (41 shells), ch 4, turn. 5th row: Shell in center ch-1 of each shell across. Ch 4, turn. Repeat 5th row until there are 6 rows of shells completed in all. Next row: Work across 7 shells, skip next 7 shells (sleeve), work across next 13 shells, skip next 7 shells (other sleeve), work across remaining 7 shells. Work straight over these 27 shells until piece measures 6 inches from bottom of yoke or length desired. Fasten off.

LEFT SLEEVE . . . Attach thread at left underarm and with No. 2 hook work 2 rows of shells same as skirt. Change to No. 7 hook and work sc around, holding in to fit. Work 2 more rows of sc. Fasten off. Sew sleeve seam.

RIGHT SLEEVE . . . Attach thread and work to correspond with Left Sleeve. Sew back edges of skirt together for 4 inches starting at bottom. Work a row of sc along back opening. Then work beading along opposite side of foundation ch as follows: Ch 2, h dc in next ch, * ch 2, 2 h dc in base of 5-tr group, ch 2, 2 h dc in base of 2-tr group. Repeat from * across. Fasten off. 

Repeat from * 4 more times; 4 shadow sps, (1 bl, 2 shadow sps) 5 times; 2 bls. Ch 4, turn. 3rd row: 1 bl, * 1 shadow sp, (tr in next sp, tr in next tr) 4 times—2 bls over 2 shadow sps. Repeat from * 4 more times; 1 shadow sp, 4 bls, (1 shadow sp, 2 bls) 5 times; 1 shadow sp, 1 bl. Ch 4, turn. 4th row: 1 bl, 1 shadow sp, 2 bls, (ch 1, tr in next tr) twice—shadow sp over shadow sp. Make 29 more shadow sps, 2 bls, 1 shadow sp, 1 bl. Ch 4, turn. 5th row: 2 bls, 2 shadow sps, ch 3, skip 1 tr, tr in next tr—sp over shadow bl. Make 29 more sps, 2 shadow sps, 2 bls. Ch 4, turn. 6th row: (1 bl, 1 shadow sp) twice; ch 3, tr in next tr-sp over sp. Make 29 more sps, 2 shadow sps, 2 bls. Ch 4, turn.

Make 2 more bls, 4 shadow sps, 5 bls, 6 shadow sps, 3 sps, 2 shadow sps, 2 bls. Ch 4, turn. Now follow chart until 46th row is completed. 47th row: 2 bls, 2 shadow sps, 2 sps, 4 shadow sps, 3 bls, ch 3, skip 3 tr, tr in next tr—sp over bl. Make 5 bls, 1 sp, 3 bls, 1 sp, 4 bls, 4 shadow sps, 2 sps, 2 shadow sps, 2 bls. Ch 4, turn. Now follow chart to top. Fasten off. Block piece to measure $8\frac{1}{2}$ x 16 inches.

Cut 2 pieces of quilted satin, each ½ inch larger all around than crocheted piece. Place pieces with right sides facing and machine stitch around about ¼ inch in from edges, leaving a 4-inch opening. Press seams flat, then turn right side out and sew opening together. Press flat. Tack crocheted piece to one side along edges. Fold piece in half.

LARGE BUTTERFLY
Make two A-wings and two B-wings.

BODY . . . Starting at one end, ch 11. 1st row: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next 9 sc. Ch 1, turn. Hereafter pick up back loop only of each sc. 2nd row: 2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 7 sc, work off last 2 sc as 1. Ch 1, turn. 3rd row: Work off 1st 2 sc as 1, sc in next 7 sc, 2 sc in last sc. Ch 1, turn. Repeat the 2nd and 3rd rows alternately until piece measures 3 inches. Fasten off.

ANTENNAE . . . Ch 50, work sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. Fasten off.

FINISHING . . . Shirr the straight ends of wings tightly. Place the shirred end of one larger wing over the shirred end of smaller wing as in illustration and sew in place. Sew two remaining wings together in same way. Sew the shirred edges of the 2 pairs of wings together at center. Sew the two long ends of body together, stuffing with several strands of thread and making sure to keep one end of body pointed. Sew body in place over the joined wings, having the pointed end of body even with bottom edge of smaller wings. Roll and sew the ends of antennae to form small knobs. Double this piece and sew in place under upper part of body.

MEDIUM BUTTERFLY

Make two B-wings and two C-wings.

BODY ... Ch 9 and work as for Body of Large Butterfly until piece measures $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Fasten off.

ANTENNAE . . . Ch 45, work sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. Fasten off. Finish as for Large Butterfly.

SMALL BUTTERFLY

Make two C-wings and two D-wings.

BODY . . . Ch 7 and work as for Body of Large Butterfly until piece measures 2 inches.

ANTENNAE . . . Ch 40, work sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. Fasten off. Finish as for Large Butterfly.

Poppy

No. 4017 Illustrated on page 15

MATERIALS:

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS PEARL COTTON, size 5, 2 balls of Red.

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS SIX STRAND EMBROIDERY FLOSS, 2 skeins of Yellow.

Steel crochet hook No. 6.

2 pieces of heavy flower wire, each 18 inches long.

Tying wire.

Artificial poppy leaves and stamens.

Green rubberized tape.

2 buttons, ¾ inch in diameter.

This amount of material is sufficient for 2 poppies.

PETAL (Make 3) . . . Starting at base, ch 4. 1st row: 12 dc in 4th ch from hook. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: 2 sc in 1st dc, sc in each dc across, 2 sc in top st of turning ch. Ch 3, turn. 3rd row: 2 dc in 1st sc, dc in each sc across, 3 dc in last sc. Ch 1, turn. 4th to 7th rows incl: Repeat the 2nd and 3rd rows alternately 2 more times, increasing 5 dc evenly apart across center of row—to inc, make 2 dc in same place. Ch 1, turn. 8th row: Sc in next 3 sts, h dc in next st, dc in next st, tr in each st across, increasing 5 tr evenly—to inc, make 2 tr in same place—to last 5 sts. Work over last 5 sts to correspond with beginning. Ch 1, turn. 9th row: Work as for previous row, making 5 (instead of 3) sc at both ends of row. Ch 1, turn. 10th row: * 2 sc in next st, ch 4, sc in 4th ch from hook (p made). Repeat from * 9 more times; 2 h dc in next st, p, 2 dc in next st, p, ** 2 tr in next st, p. Repeat from ** across to last 12 sts. Work over these 12 sts to correspond with beginning. Fasten off.

CENTER... With Six Strand, ch 2. 1st rnd: 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Do not join rnds. 2nd rnd: 2 sc in each sc around. Now continue in sc rnds, increasing 6 sc in each rnd until crocheted piece measures same as button—to incan sc make 2 sc in 1 sc. Work 3 more rnds without increasing. Fasten off.

FINISHING . . . Fasten button to end of heavy wire. Push button into crocheted center and sew opening closed. Group stamens around center, fastening them with tying wire. Arrange petals around center and fasten securely by sewing through to the back of center. If desired, an artificial calyx can be slipped onto stem wire and pushed up close to back of petals. Wind stem with rubberized tape, inserting wired ends of leaves at desired intervals.

CLARK'S O.N.T. or J. & P. COATS PEARL COTTON, size 5, 1 ball of White and 1 ball of Yellow.

Steel crochet hook No. 6.

8 pieces of medium weight flower wire, 12 inches long.

Green rubberized tape.

8 buttons, \% inch in diameter.

The above material is sufficient for 8 daisies. For black-eyed Susans substitute Yellow for White and Brown for Yellow.

PETALS . . . Starting at center with White, ch 5. Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: Ch 1, 9 sc in ring. Do not join. 2nd rnd: 2 sc in each sc around. SI st in 1st sc made. Now work petals as follows:

First Petal . . . 1st row: Ch 1, 2 sc in same place as sl st, sc in next st. Ch 1, turn. 2nd to 5th rows incl: Sc in each sc. Ch 1, turn. Ch 3 (instead of 1) at end of 5th row. 6th row: Holding back the last loop of each dc on hook, make dc in next 2 sc, thread over and draw through all loops on hook. Fasten off.

Second Petal . . . Attach thread to same place where last sc of 1st row of

petal was made, 2 sc in same place, sc in next sc. Ch 1, turn and complete petal as before. Make 7 more petals same as this.

CENTER . . . With Yellow, ch 2. 1st rnd: 6 sc in ring. Do not join rnds. 2nd and 3rd rnds: Sc in each sc around, increasing 6 sc in each rnd—to inc an sc, make 2 sc in 1 sc. 4th, 5th and 6th rnds: Sc in each sc around. Fasten off.

FINISHING . . . Fasten button to end of wire. Push button into crocheted center and sew opening closed. Slip petals onto wire and push up close to center. Sew in place. Wind stem with rubberized tape, inserting leaves if desired.
