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CROCHET

THE art of crocheting is not as old as that of lace making. In fact, crocheting is in a way a kind of lace arrived at by a different method but often producing exactly the same stitches as are made by the needle. The term crochet is derived from the French word "croches" or "croc," meaning hook. It is wonderful what can be accomplished with the little hooked instrument.

The golden age of lace was of course the sixteenth century, and crocheting arose in the nunneries during the period that lace making was at its height. It was not very fully developed, however, until much later, when the Irish workers succeeded in copying Italian point in the most beautiful way they have ever been copied. One hesitates to say "imitated," since they reproduced in quite an individual style rather than imitated the needlepoint lace.

The most delightful and popular forms of present day crocheting are introduced on the charming and effective variety of designs presented in this booklet.

PRACTICAL SUGGESTIONS

The basis of crochet is the chain or tambour stitch. The tambour is crocheting into a fabric ground, but the stitch is made exactly the same way, and it may also be produced with the needle.

The principal crochet stitches illustrated and explained on the two following pages comprise all the methods used in crocheting. With these simple little loop stitches an infinite variety of beautiful articles can be made.

In working large pieces that are usually commenced from the center and worked around and around one is likely to lose track of the count of the rows. A nice little point to remember is that one may tie in a colored thread and draw it up through the stitch of each succeeding row so as to show exactly the number of rows which have been accomplished. This also applies to any piece of crochet where the number of rows are likely to confuse and require frequent counting.

CORRECT MATERIALS

As in all hand work only the best material should be used. It is a great waste of time to put hand work on inferior fabrics or threads. The articles illustrated throughout this book have all been worked with Royal Society Crochet Cottons. In the Royal Society line there is a size and special twist for every variety of crocheting or lace making. The smoothness of finish, the round evenness of twist and unusual strength recommend Royal Society Crochet Cottons, which are made from the finest long staple Sea Island cotton. They will not rough or break, as do other cottons made from short staple materials.

It might here be suggested that in working any of the articles illustrated a finer or coarser size thread may be used than the one suggested in the directions. It must be remembered, however, that the selection of the thread influences the size of the finished article. If a very fine number be employed the finer and closer the stitch, and vice versa, the coarser the thread the larger the stitch and consequently the finished design will be larger and heavier.

THE HOOK

The best steel hooks should be used. Those with the flattened disk in center are very pleasant to handle. For fine work, such as Irish crochet, the hook which can be set in a bamboo handle is the best to use. This hook is very fine and at the same time gives a large handle, which saves the fingers from fatigue.

CROCHET STITCHES

CHAIN STITCH

1—Catch thread with needle, forming a loop. Pull the thread with the needle through this loop to form first stitch. Continue chain to any desired length.

SLIP STITCH

2—Make row of chain stitches. Insert needle in last chain and pull thread through. Pull loop thus made through first loop.

SINGLE CROCHET

3—Make row of chain stitches. Insert needle in last chain and pull thread through, thus having two loops on needle. Wind thread once over needle and pull through the two loops.

HALF DOUBLE CROCHET

4—Wind thread once around needle, insert into chain and pull loop through. Wind thread around needle again and pull through three loops at once.

DOUBLE CROCHET

5—Wind thread once around needle. Insert needle into chain and pull thread through; this leaves three loops on needle. Wind thread once around needle and pull through two. Wind thread again over needle and pull through two

TREBLE CROCHET

6—Make same way as Double Crochet, only at first wind thread twice over needle and pull thread through three times—two and two and two.

DOUBLE TREBLE CROCHET

7—Make same way as Double Crochet, only at first wind thread three times over needle and pull thread through four times—two and two and two and two.

DOUBLE TRIPLE TREBLE CROCHET

8—Make same way as Double Crochet, only at first wind thread four times over needle and pull thread through five times—two and two and two and two and two.

PICOT

9—Make a chain. Skip three chains and make a Single Crochet. Chain four, catch back into the first chain. Wind thread once around needle and pull through both loops. Make three or four Single Crochet stitches or enough to make desired distance between picots and repeat.

MESH

10—Used in filet crochet work. double crochet into next stitch. Chain two stitches, skip two stitches, one

SHELL

11-Five double crochet into one stitch form a shell.



BODY.

Ch. 4, sk. 1, 3 s.c., turn, 4 s.c. (2 s.c. into first, 2 s.c. into next 2 sts.), turn, 5 s.c., turn, 6 s.c., turn, 2 more rows of 6 s.c., turn, 1 row of 5 s.c., turn, 4 s.c., turn, 3 s.c., turn, 2 s.c., turn, 3 s.c., turn, 4 s.c., turn, 5 s.c., turn, 6 s.c., turn, 7 s.c., turn, 8 s.c., turn, 9 s.c., turn, 10 s.c., turn, 11 s.c., four more rows of 11 s.c., turn, and decrease one st. in each row until 2 s.c. are left, turn, and increase one st. in each row until 2 s.c., are left, turn, and increase one st. in each row until 2 s.c., are left, turn, and increase one st. in each row until 2 s.c., into each st., ch. 17, sk. 1. *cotton over needle insert into st. and repeat from * three times more then pull through all loops, 25 s.c around ch. 17, this makes.1 feeler, make another one the same way, and 1 s.c. into each st. around other side of body.

Into center hole of ring make a lace stitch with the sewing needle. Start at the wrong side, divide hole in 6 parts, make 1 buttonhole st. into each part, then draw thread again through each loop, pull hole together, finish off.

LADIES' SET FOR DRESSER

The pieces shown in this set are crocheted and mounted over plain glass articles, which can be bought in all five and ten-cent stores. The crochet is so simple, however, that it can be applied to the covering of any similar glass pieces. Suggestions for this are given at the end of each set of instructions.

In the crochet for this set we will use the following abbreviations:

1. for loop, which means ch. 5, 1 s.c.
sh. for shell, which means 1 s.c., into center of loop, 5 d.c. into next s.c., 1 s.c.
into center of next loop.

r.sh. for raised shell, which means 1 s.c., 1 h.d.c. 2 d.c., 1 h.d.c. 1 s.c. all into

r.sh. for raised shell, which means 1 s.c., 1 h.d.c., 3 d.c., 1 h.d.c., 1 s.c. all into 1 s.t., turn, 1 s.c. into the first s.c., turn.

POWDER BOX No. 1052

Use ROYAL SOCIETY Cordichet, size 3, 4 balls. Crochet hook No. 7

The Powder Box shown in cut is a fishbowl 5 inches high with an opening of 4 inches in diameter. For cover use round cardboard 4½ inches in diameter. If the glass is not wanted the crochet part can be lined with silk and be used as a powder puff bag.

At beginning of each row of d.c. chain three.

1st row—ch. 7, join to ring, 16 d.c. into ring; always join with sl.st.
2nd row—2 d.c. into each st.
3rd row—2 d.c. into one, 1 d.c. into next st.
4th row—2 d.c. into one, 2 d.c. into next 2 sts.
5th row—2 d.c. into one, 3 d.c. into next 3 sts.

BODY.

6th row—ch. 5, sk. 2, 1 s.c. Repeat this all around for 27 loops.
7th row—3 sl.sts. until center of next loop, * ch. 5, 1 s.c. into center of next loop,
make 3 more loops, 1 sh., 1 l., 1 sh., 1 l., 1 sh. Repeat twice from (*).

8th row—1 s.c. into center ch., ch. 5, 1 s.c. into center of next 1; continue

with loops all around.

9th row-ch. 5, 3 d.c. into 3 center sts. of next loop, ch. 5, 1 s.c. into following loops: 1 sh., 1 l., 1 sh., 1 l., 1 sh., 1 l., 1 sh., ch. 5, 3 d.c. into center sts. of next l. and repeat around.

10th row—1 s.c. into 1. before 3 d.c., ch. 3, 5 d.c. into 3 d.c. (2 into first, 2 into last), ch. 3, 1 s.c. into next l., 8 l., ch. 3, 5 d.c. Repeat around.

11th row—ch. 5, 7 d.c. (2 into first, 2 into last), ch. 5, 1 s.c. into next l. of ch. 5, 1 l., 1 sh., 1 l., 1 sh., 1 l., 1 sh., 1 l., ch. 5, 7 d.c. and repeat around.

12th row—ch. 3, 9 d.c., ch. 3, 1 s.c. into first l., 8 l., ch. 3, 9 d.c. Continue

around

13th row—ch. 5, 11 d.c., ch. 5, 1 s.c. into first 1. of ch. 5, 4 sh.; always with 1 l. between ch. 5, 11 d.c.
14th row—ch. 3, 13 d.c., ch. 3, 1 s.c. into first 1., 8 l., ch. 3, 13 d.c. Continue

around.

15th row—ch. 5, 15 d.c., ch. 5, 1 s.c. into l. of ch. 5, 1 l., 3 sh., with l. between l., ch. 5, 15 d.c. Continue around.

16th row—ch. 3, 15 d.c., ch. 3, 1 s.c. into first l., 8 l., ch. 3, 15 d.c. Continue

around.

Repeat 15th and 16th rows alternately 3 times.

23rd row—Same as 15th row.

24th row—ch. 5, 15 d.c., ch. 5, sk. 1 l., 1 s.c. into next, 6 more l., ch 5, sk. last l.,

15 d.c. Continue around.

25th row—ch. 5, 15 d.c., ch. 5, sk. 1 l., 1 s.c. into next, 1 l., 1 sh., 1 l., 1 sh., 1 l., ch. 5, sk. 1 l., 15 d.c.; join with sl.st.

26th row—ch. 3, 2 d.c. into next sts., ch. 3, sk. 3, 2 d.c., ch. 3., sk. 3 and continue

around

27th row—1 s.c. into first hole, 3 d.c., ch. 2, 3 d.c. into next hole, 1 s.c. into following hole. Continue around.

28th row—5 d.c. into 1st s.c., 3 s.c. into space of ch. 2, 5 d.c. into next s.c. Continue around.

29th row-5 s.c., 1 p., 5 s.c. all around.

1st row—ch. 7, join to ring, 15 d.c. into ring. 2nd row—2 d.c. into each st.

3rd row-

-2 d.c. into one, 1 d.c. into next. -2 d.c. into one, 2 d.c. into next 2 sts. -2 d.c. into one, 3 d.c. into next 3 sts. 4th row-

5th row-6th row-

-2 d.c. into one, 4 d.c. into next 4 sts. -2 d.c. into one, 5 d.c. into next 5 sts. 7th row-


8th row—5 s.c. into next st., 1 r.sh., 5 s.c., 1 9th row—5 d.c., 2 d.c. in back of r.sh., 5 d.c. 10th row—1 s.c. into each st. Finish off. 1 r.sh. Cont Continue around.

BACK FOR COVER.

8th row-Follow instructions of front of cover for 7 rows and then make 2 d.c. into 1 and 6 d.c. into next 6 sts.

9th row—2 d.c. into 1, 7 d.c. into next 7 sts.









KNOB.

Ch. 5, join to ring, 8 s.c. into ring, 1 row of 2 s.c. into 1, until 16 s.c., 1 row of 2 s.c. into 1, 1 s.c. into next, until 24 s.c., 4 more rows of 24 s.c. Stuff with wadding and decrease by making 1 s.c. sk. 1, 1 s.c. until closed.

Cover knob with 8 spider legs of silk and sew to cover.

Between r.sh. make star of 8 spider legs of blue Celesta with 1 Yellow French knot in center. Then crochet half of front and back together with s.c., insert cardboard and close remaining half. Finish with 4 s.c., 1 p., 4 s.c. all around.

When the body of powder box is finished embroider on each solid point 13 stars, each with 12 spider legs of blue silk with a Yellow French knot center. Make 3 rows of 3 stars, 1 row of 2 stars, 2 rows of 1 star. Each star covers 2 rows of d.c.

2 rows of d.c.

Draw white elastic through last row of holes. Slip bowl inside and elastic will hold it in place. If a smaller bowl is desired follow same instruction, only make one less row at bottom. This decreases the number of stitches around bowl. Make number of rows according to height of bowl.

For embroidery use ROYAL SOCIETY Blue Celesta 1301, 5 skeins; Yellow Celesta 1114, 1 skein

HAIR RECEIVER No. 1054

Use ROYAL SOCIETY White Cordichet, size 3. Crochet hook No. 7.

The Hair Receiver shown in cut is an inner gas globe 4 inches high with an opening 3½ inches in diameter.

For top part use a round cardboard 31/2 inches in diameter with a hole in center 11/2 inches in diameter.

FOR HAIR RECEIVER.

1st row—ch. 7, join to ring. 12 s.c. into ring, join with sl.st.
2nd row—ch. 5, 1 s.c. into next, ch. 5, and repeat for 11 more loops.
3rd row—ch. 3, 1 s.c. into center of next 1., ch. 5, and make 12 l. Finish last 1. into ch. 3.

4th row—1 sh, 1 l., alternately all around. 5th row—12 l.

5th row—12 l.
6th row—1 sh., 1 l., alternately all around.
7th row—ch. 5, 5 d.c. into loop between 2 sh. (*), ch. 5, 1 s.c. into center of next sh., 2 l., ch. 5, 5 d.c. into next l. Repeat from (*) twice.
8th row—ch. 3, 7 d.c. (2 into first, 2 into last), (*), ch. 3, 1 s.c. into center of next l., 1 l., 1 sh., 1 l., ch. 3, 7 d.c., and repeat from (*) twice.
9th row—ch. 5, 11 d.c. (3 into first, 3 into last), (*), ch. 5, 1 s.c. into next l., 2 l., ch. 5, 11 d.c. Repeat from (*).
10th row—ch. 3, 13 d.c., (*) ch. 3, 1 sh., 1 l., 1 sh., ch. 3, 13 d.c. Repeat from (*)

from (*).

11th row—ch. 5, 13 d.c., 4 l., 13 d.c. Repeat 10th and 11th rows 4 times alternately, join with sl.st.

20th row—ch. 3, 2 d.c., ch. 2, sk. 2, 2 d.c. Repeat all around. This row is for

beading. 21st row—1 d.c. into each st. Finish off. Embroider 8 stars each with 12 spider legs, with blue silk and a Yellow French knot center, 3 stars in top row, 2 into next row, and 1 star into 3 following rows. Each star covers 2 rows of d.c.

COVER.

COVER.

1st row—ch. 70, join to ring, ch. 3, 1 d.c. into each st.; join with sl.st.
2nd row—ch. 3, 2 d.c. into 1st, 3 d.c. into next 3 sts.; join.
3rd row—5 s.c., 1 r.sh., 5 s.c., join. Repeat around.
4th row—ch. 3, 5 d.c., 2 d.c. into st. behind r.sh., 5 d.c., and repeat around.
Begin again at foundation ch. for inside cover, 1 d.c. into each; 1 row of 2 d.c.
into one and 3 d.c. into next 3 sts.
1 row of 2 d.c. into one, 5 d.c. into next 5 sts.
Embroider stars of blue silk each of 8 spider legs with a Yellow French knot center between r.sh. over 2 rows of d.c. Slip cardboard in between and fasten, crocheting top and bottom of cover together with 1 s.c. into each.

Then slip glass into holder and crochet the round top and holder together with 4 s.c., 1 p., 4 s.c. all around.

If a standing hair receiver is desired a tumbler could be used instead of the inner glass globe. For tumbler make bottom solid the same as hatpin holder and continue instructions from 5th row of hair receiver.

For embroidery use ROYAL SOCIETY Blue Celesta 1301, 3 skeins; Yellow Celesta 1114, 1 skein

HATPIN HOLDER No. 1055

Use ROYAL SOCIETY Cordichet, size 3, 1 ball. Crochet hook No. 7

The Hatpin Holder as shown in cut is a straight chimney 5 inches high, 1% inches in diameter.

For bottom a round piece of cardboard 1% inches in Ciameter is used.

1st row—ch. 7, join to ring, 15 d.c. into ring.

2nd row—2 d.c. into each.

3rd row—2 d.c. into one, 1 d.c. into next st.

4th row—2 d.c. into one, 2 d.c. into next st.

5th row—1 d.c. into each taking up back with

5th row-1 d.c. into each, taking up back rib.

6th row—ch. 5, sk. 3, 1 s.c., 9 more l., ch. 3, sk. 3, 15 d.c.
7th row—ch. 3, sk. 3, 1 s.c. into 1st l. of ch. 5, 1 l., 1 sh., 1 l., 1 sh., 1 l., 1 sh., 1 l., 1 sh., 1 l., 1 1 sh.,

next sts.

Repeat 7th and 8th rows, alternately, 8 times.

25th row—ch. 3, 1 s.c. into next l. of ch. 5, 1 l. of ch. 3, 1 sh. Repeat around l.c. Finish with sl.st.







26th row—ch. 3, 2 d.c., ch. 2, sk. 2, z d.c. Repeat around.
27th row—3 s.c., 1 p., 3 s.c. Repeat around.
Make 1 row of 1 s.c. into front rib of 5th row to form extension for bottom.
Embroider 7 stars, each with 8 spider legs of blue silk with a Yellow French t center. Each star over 2 rows of d.c. Always count center of each row and recider effort.

COMBINATION PIN CUSHION AND JEWEL CASE No. 1056

Use ROYAL SOCIETY White Cordichet, size 3, 2 balls. Crochet hook No. 7

The Jewel Case shown in cut is a finger bowl $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches high with an opening $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter. If Jewel Case is not wanted the pin cushion can be finished with 3 glass feet. (Use glass push-pins).

For Pin Cushion use cardboard 4% inches in diameter. Pad one side with wadding and cover with silk. For other side of cardboard follow same instructions as for back of cover of powder box and continue making band around top in the following way:

1 row of d.c. (taking up back rib), 1 row of 5 s.c., 1 r.sh., 5 s.c. Continue

around.

1 row of 1 d.c. into each.
1 row of 5 s.c., 1 p., 5 s.c. Finish off.
1 row of 1 s.c. into front rib at beginning of band.
Make a star of 8 spider legs of blue silk with Yellow French knot. Center between r.sh. Pull thread through picot edge, then place covered cardboard inside and pull thread tight.

On each solid point make 6 stars each with 12 spider legs of blue silk with Yellow French knot center, 1 row with 3 stars, 1 row with 2 stars and 1 row with 1 star. Each star covers 2 rows of d.c. When embroidery is completed place glass inside and pull thread tight to hold it in place.

Pin Cushion Top and Jewel Case are joined together with 18 s.c.

If a larger finger bowl is used increase one row at bottom. This increases the number of shells. Cut cardboard for top ¼ of an inch larger than opening

of bowl.

Use ROYAL SOCIETY Cordichet, size 3, 3 Balls. Crochet hook No. 7.

The Pin Tray shown in cut is an oval piece of glass 6x8 inches.

CENTER OF OVAL.

Ch. 23, sk. 3, 19 d.c., 5 d.c. into last ch., 19 d.c. into other side of foundation, ch., 5 d.c. into next st. Join with sl.st. to beginning of row.

2nd row—ch. 3, (*), 19 d.c., 2 d.c. into each of 5 following sts. Repeat from (*). Join with sl.st.

3rd row—(*), 19 d.c., 2 d.c. into one, 1 d.c. into next. Repeat this 4 times alternately. Repeat from (*).

4th row-ch. 5, sk. 2, 1 s.c., 8 more 1. the same way, 4 l. of ch. 5, sk. 1, repeat

5th row—13 sh. and 13 l. alternately all around. 6th row—26 loops. 7th row—Repeat 5th row. 8th row—26 l. of ch. 6.





9th row—13 l. of ch. 7, 13 sh. of 7 d.c. 10th row—26 l. of ch. 7. 11th and 12th rows—Repeat 9th and 10th rows.

11th and 12th rows—Repeat 9th and 10th rows.

13th row—7 d.c. into each l.

14th row—1 d.c. into each st., teking up back rib.

15th row—ch. 5, sk. 3, 1 s.c. Repeat all around.

Fill in the solid center of oval with 13 stars of 8 spider legs with blue silk and a Yellow French knot in center.

Pull a string through the last row of loops of the oval. Place glass over crochet, draw in string and tie tight. This brings last two rows on top of glass. RAISED EDGE.

1st row—ch. 216, join with sl.st., 1 d.c. into each ch. 2nd row—1 d.c. into each.
3rd row—7 s.c., 1 r.sh., 7 s.c. Repeat around.
4th row—1 d.c. into each st.

Embroider stars of 8 spider legs with blue silk and a Yellow French knot center between r.sh. Each star covers 2 rows of d.c. Put a heavy cord inside of crochet and join together with 1 s.c. into each. Join this to oval by sewing into the row of d.c.

For smaller tray take off number of rows to fit size desired. For raised edge make a ch. long enough to reach around edge. For larger tray increase solid center by 1 row. Into this make 2 d.c. into 1, and 1 d.c. into next at ends only. This increases number of shells.

For embroidery use ROYAL SOCIETY Blue Celesta 1301, 3 skeins; Yellow Celesta 1114, 1 skein

CANDLESTICK No. 1057

Use ROYAL SOCIETY White Cordichet, size 3, 2 balls. Crochet hook No. 7

The Candlestick shown in cut is a square, plain glass candlestick 7 inches high. The base is 3½ inches square, the top is 2 inches square. BOTTOM PART.

1st row—ch. 7, join to ring, 12 d.c. into ring, join with sl.st.
2nd row—ch. 3, (*), 2 d.c. into next 2 sts., 5 d.c. into next st. (This forms one
corner.) 2 d.c., 5 d.c. into one. Repeat from (*). Join.
3rd row—ch. 3, 4 d.c., 5 d.c. into corner st., 6 d.c. Continue around. Join
always with sl.st. and ch. 3.

The large basket shown in cut is a glass basket 9 inches high, including the handle and the bottom, 3¼ inches in diameter. The small basket is 5 inches high and the bottom 2 inches in diameter. To cover baskets varying in size from these, make the bottom to fit by adding to or lessening the number of rows of d.c. For medium size baskets shorten each panel and make 6 instead of 8. For larger size make 8 panels, lengthening and widening them as required.

If the glass baskets are not desired the crochet part can be stiffened. (See instructions below.) This basket is worked in 8 panels which are crocheted together.

Ch. 12, sk. 1, 1 s.c., ch. 5, sk. 4, 1 s.c., ch. 5, sk. 4, 1 s.c. Turn, ch. 5, 3 s.c. into 1st 1., ch. 3, 3 s.c. into next 1., ch. 3, 1 tr.c. into last st. Turn, ch. 5, 1 s.c. into center 1., ch. 5, 1 s.c. into last. Turn, and repeat the last 2 rows 8 times. Turn, ch. 3, 1 d.c. into 1st st., 6 d.c. into 1., 1 d.c. into sp., 6 d.c. into next 1., 1 d.c. into last sp. Turn, ch. 3, 4 rows of 15 d.c. Turn, 8 d.c., 3 h.d.c., 4 s.c. Finish off. Make 1 more panel the same way, 2 more by reversing the last row. These 4 panels are to be placed 2 on each side of basket below the handle with the d.c. of last row in center.

Make 4 more panels the same way, all but the last row, which is made with 1 s.c. into each. Join panels together, starting on 1st hole, ch. 2, 1 s.c. into 1st hole of other panel, ch. 2, 1 s.c. into next hole of 1st panel, ch. 2, 1 s.c. into 2nd hole of 2nd panel: continue to top. After all panels are joined together, work 1 row of s.c. all around top, 1 row of d.c., 1 row of 2 s.c., 1 p., 2 s.c., all around.

Around bottom make 5 s.c. into 1s., 4 s.c. into joinings, 1 row of 1 d.c. into each, 1 row of 2 d.c. into 1 and 4 d.c. into next 4 st. Repeat this all around.

For bottom follow directions of big basket, making only 5 rows instead of 7, and join top and bottom in the same way.

Dissolve 2 ozs. of clear white sheet gelatine (which may be obtained at any drug store) in 1 pint of hot water.

Strain the solution through a white cloth before using and keep as hot as

Strain the solution through a white cloth before using and keep as not as possible without boiling.

Immerse basket in hot solution and squeeze out all superfluous moisture with a clean white cloth. Keep cloth in the hand while shaping basket. Have ready some circles of cardboard (1¾ inches for small basket and 3 inches for large basket). Before setting away to dry, place the cardboard in bottom of basket. This helps to shape it. Avoid handling more than is necessary and set away on a clean plate to dry.



When motifs and hands are joined together applique to linen on stamped lines. Cut away the linen from underneath the crochet and at corners of cushion, leaving only 6 squares of linen in the center.

Cover pillow with green silk and place crocheted piece on top.



(*) into triangle 3 s.c., 1 p., 2 s.c. into point, 3 s.c., 2 s.c., 1 p., 2 s.c. into other side of triangle into loop, 3 s.c., 1 p., 7 s.c., 1 p., 3 s.c. Repeat from (*), Join with sl.st. Ch. 10, 1 s.c. into point of triangle, ch. 4, 1 d.trc. bet. triangle and loop, ch. 4, 1 s.c. into center st. of loop, ch. 4, 1 d.trc. bet. loop and triangle, ch. 4 and repeat around. Wind blue cotton 150 times around cardboard 9 inches wide, cut off, tie in tight. Tie around tassel about $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches from top; tie again $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches lower. Draw the tassel together between the spaces tied to form 2 puffs.

TATTING

The name Tatting is derived from tatters suggested by the extreme lightness and openness of the lace made by this method. The French called it "Frivolete," which is suggestive of its airy daintiness. Tatting is a copy of the Ragusa laces. Its foundation is the knot. It is closely related to netting which makes the ground for Filet laces.

It takes a little skill and practice to acquire the knack of making the knot, but once one has learned this, the work is not only very easy but one can do it without thinking or giving it very close attention. In the beginning fatters used one shuttle and formed the knot over the thread with which the work was being done. The little disks were then sewed together. This was difficult and not very satisfactory. Later the use of two shuttles was introduced, the knots being taken over the thread of the second shuttle and a tiny thread left between each group of knots. In this way continuous patterns were made possible.

Tatting has the same advantage which netting and other knotted laces possess, namely that they may be cut anywhere without ripping. The picot or tiny loop on the edge of the motifs adds very much to the delicacy and beauty of the work. These little picots are called purls and are especially dainty on handkerchief borders, lace collar edges, etc.

SELECTION OF CORRECT MATERIALS

Hard twisted, smooth, even cotton is absolutely necessary to produce beautiful results in this work. It is a disadvantage to join the cotton by tying it in knots and unless the cotton is very smooth and strong it will break, since it is necessary to give it quite a jerk in drawing together the knots.

The beautiful Royal Society Cordichet, a six-cord, hard twisted mercerized cotton, made from the fine, strong, long staple Sea Island cotton, offers a perfect material for tatting, and those who love to make this charming lace will find Cordichet a great incentive while progressing with the work in the satisfaction they experience as they see the exquisite results it produces.

The fundamental stitches used in tatting are here illustrated and explained, and the correct position of the hands as shown will, if followed, assist materially in effecting more perfect specimens of this dainty lace.

ABBREVIATIONS USED IN TATTING DIRECTIONS

double stitch, d.s. picot, p. ring, r. chain, ch. long picot, l.p.

To fill shuttle—Tie thread through hole in center of shuttle. Then holding shuttle firmly in the left hand wind thread as on a spool.




Fig. 1. First position of hands.

To begin wind cotton over hand and hold with thumb and first finger. An important thing is to remember that the thread of the left hand is forming the stitches, the shuttle which is in the right hand, must be held out tightly extended until the left hand has drawn up the knot. Follow movement as shown in Fig. 1.




Fig. 2. Second position of hands.

The shuttle must pass between first and third finger, from right to left, following the movement of illustration in Fig. 2.





The cotton over left hand must be loose, while the shuttle in the right hand must be tightly extended, as Fig. 3 shows position of hands. This forms the first part of the double stitch. The loops have to be formed always by the thread of the left hand, and the shuttle thread of the right hand must be free to run through the stitches.



To form the second part of the stitch, To form the second part of the stitch, pass shuttle from left to right, between first and third finger through loop over left hand, as Fig. 4 indicates, extend the shuttle thread, and with left hand thread form a knot as before. This finishes the double stitch. It would be advisable to practice the double stitch until it can be made rapidly.




Fig. 5. Fifth position of hands.

Fig. 5 shows a few finished double stitches




FIG. 6 Fig. 6. Sixth position of hands. to make picot.

The picot in tatting helps to join the different parts of the pattern, and makes the design very attractive. In making the picots care must be taken to have them even. The picots are formed by leaving a loop on the extended thread, and a short length of thread between the stitches after the first half stitch, then making the other half stitch, as shown in cut of Fig. 7. This makes the open picot.



Continue with another double stitch and join it to the preceding stitches as shown in illustration of Fig. 8. This makes the closed picot.



K. st. indicates knot stitch. To make knot stitch draw out the st. on hook to ¼ of an inch, take up thread and draw through this loop, then put the hook under the thread just drawn through. Between it and the loop below, take up the thread, draw through again; this gives 1 s.c. at point of loop.

2nd row—ch. 2, 2 k.sts., (*) 1 s.c. on top of last 2 k.sts. of previous row, 2 k.sts., and repeat from (*) four times, turn.

3rd row—ch. 2, 2 k.sts., (*) 1 s.c. on top of last 2 k.sts. of previous row, 2 k.sts., and repeat from (*) four times, turn.

4th row—2 k.sts., (*) 1 s.c. on top of last 2 k.sts. of previous row, 2 k.sts. Repeat from (*) four times, turn.

5th row—ch. 2, 2 k.sts., (*) 1 s.c. on top of last 2 k.sts. of previous row, 2 k.sts. Repeat from (*) four times.

6th row—ch. 2, 2 k.sts., (*) 1 s.c. on top of last 2 k.sts. of previous row. Repeat 3 times from (*). 20 tr.c. into last hole of previous row, 1 s.c. into 3rd row of beginning, turn.

7th row—ch. 3, 1 tr.c. into 1st tr.c. of previous row, ch. 1, 1 tr.c. into next, and repeat until k.st. is reached and continues across, turn.

8th row—ch. 2, 2 k.sts., (*) 1 s.c. on top of 1st k.st. of previous row. Repeat from (*) twice. Ch. 2, 1 tr.c. into 1st space between tr.c., ch. 2, 1 tr.c. into next and continue across, turn.

9th row—2 k.sts., 1 s.c. into 2nd hole of scallop, 2 k.sts., sk. 1 hole, 1 s.c. into next and continue across, turn.

10th row—ch. 2, 2 k.sts., 1 s.c. into last k.st. of previous row. Continue across and around scallop, turn.

11th row—Same as 10th row and repeat from beginning.







STRING A

Use ROYAL SOCIETY Cordichet, size 5. Crochet hook No. 8

Ch. 2, sk. 1, 1 s.c., turn, ch. 1, 1 s.c. into the 1st single l. at beginning of row, turn, ch. 1 and repeat this for any length required. At ends attach balls.

BALLS.

Ch. 4, join to ring, 8 s.c. into ring, 2 s.c. into 1, 1 s.c. into next until 12 s.c., 4 more rows of 12 s.c. Stuff tight with wadding and diminish, skipping one, 1 s.c. until closed.

STRING B

Use ROYAL SOCIETY Cordichet, size 30. Crochet hook No. 11

Ch. 4, sk. 3, 1 d.c., ch. 2, 2 d.c. into same, turn, (*) ch. 3, 1 d.c. into space of ch. 2, ch. 2, 2 d.c. into same, turn, and repeat from (*) for length required. At each end of string attach a little rose.

ROSE.

Ch. 5, join to ring, into 1st ch., 1 s.c., 1 h.d.c., 3 d.c., 1 h.d.c., 1 s.c. Repeat the same into the next 4 chs. Make 5 ls. of ch. 4 into the back rib of 1st ch. 5, into each l., 1 s.c., 1 h.d.c., 5 d.c., 1 h.d.c., 1 s.c. Make another row of 5 ls., but 7 d.c. instead of 5 d.c. This forms a rose with 3 rows of petals.

STRING C

Use ROYAL SOCIETY Cordichet, size 50. Crochet hook No. 14

Ch. 2, sk. 1, 1 s.c., turn, ch. 1, 1 s.c., turn, ch. 3, 2 d.c., turn, ch. 3, 3 d.c., turn, ch. 3, 4 d.c., turn, ch. 3, 5 d.c., turn, (*), ch. 4, sk. 1, 1 d.c., ch. 1, sk. 1, 1 d.c., turn. Repeat this last row twice, turn, 5 d.c., turn, and repeat from (*) for length required. Finish the other end of string the same as the beginning. At ends attach rings.

RINGS.

Wind cotton 20 times around finger, 50 s.c. into r., join with sl.st., (*), ch. 4, form p., ch. 4, p., ch. 4, p. 1 s.c. into 1st st. of 1st p., 5 s.c., 1 p., 5 s.c. Repeat from (*) around.

CURTAIN BAND No. 1070

Use ROYAL SOCIETY Cordichet, size 3. Crochet hook No. 7


Ch. 6, sk. 5, 2 d.c., ch. 3, 2 d.c. in the first ch., turn, ch. 5, 2 d.c., ch. 3, 2 d.c. into space of ch. 3, turn, ch. 5, and continue until 15 inches long.

(*) Work along side of band. Into first loop of ch. 5, 9 d.c., in next loop of ch. 5, 9 d.c. and continue the length of band. Into last loop, 5 d.c. and 3 s.c. into next stitch, 2 s.c., around next sp. 2 s.c. Repeat from (*) along other side of band.

In the 1st scallop of 9 d.c., 3 s.c., ch. 4, 1 p., 3 s.c., 1 p., 2 s.c., (*) sk. 1 s.c. of this scallop and 1 of the next, 2 s.c., 1 p., 3 s.c., 1 p., 2 s.c. Repeat from (*) across. Into last scallop of 5 d.c., 2 s.c., 1 p., 2 s.c., 1 p., 2 s.c. Take a ring about 1 inch in diameter and without breaking thread, work s.c. around ring very close together, join with sl.st., 1 s.c. into next st. of band, 1 s.c. into ring. Repeat this four times, 1 s.c. into band, 1 p., and finish other side of band the same.


